
Welcome to our Campus!

- Shingle Springs



What is a Charter School?

CMP is an Independent Charter authorized by four local school districts (San Juan, Sacramento City, Elk Grove, and Buckeye Union School District)

- Allows alternate teaching methods. (Montessori Philosophy & Curriculum) while addressing CA State Standards (CCSS)
- Oversight by Governing Board: Comprised of parents, teachers, and community members
- Funded directly by the state through tax dollars
- Is a public school




The Bradshaw Campus (9649 Bradshaw Rd.)

Freedom within limits- movement and learning. The opportunity to dig deeper and explore.


Developing confidence, enthusiastic, and self-directed learners and citizens, who are accountable to themselves and their communities. Developing critical thinking and collaboration skills.



Learning in a Montessori Classroom



- Full complement of Montessori materials







- Makes safe, respectful & responsible choices for themselves
- · Is a critical thinker and life-long learner
- Celebrates diversity
- Is an agent of change with a sense of community and social responsibility

Transitioning to a Montessori Classroom?

- If your child is used to a traditional classroom format, in which all of the students are working on the same activity at the same time as one teacher leads them, please be aware that in a Montessori classroom there is a different format.
- In Montessori classrooms, students' skills are assessed, then they are given lessons and assignments based on their academic needs.
- Most mornings, students will have 2-3 hours to complete their daily assignments. Teachers give lessons on new concepts and they, along with the Teaching Assistant, are there to support students, but students are responsible to be on-task and complete their individual work independently.

- Holds both California and Montessori teaching credentials
- Prepares an inviting, enriched classroom environment
- Promotes and maintains the learning environment
- · Respects each child as an individual
- Communicates openly with parents and partners with families
- · Delivers both small and large group lessons


Positive Discipline

Classroom teachers utilize the methods of "Positive Discipline" to promote respect, responsibility, and good choices among the students.

Positive Discipline emphasizes adults

- pre-communicating expectations and consequences
- being kind but firm in expectations
- following through if consequences must be acted upon.

Students are continually reminded that they are responsible for the choices they make.
Teachers use class meetings to facilitate community discussions and problem-solving.



Ed Code Applies, as it does in traditional public schools.

Lottery and Enrollment Process


California Montessori Project admits new students through a public, random lottery draw. The lottery application process starts with our online SchoolMint platform and can be accessed at:




