We are excited to announce that Harding is a full IB school! Last year our Middle Year's Program (MYP) was authorized by the International Baccalaureate (IB) to become an official IB program. This is a huge accomplishment for our school and a great opportunity for our students! The Middle Years Program at Harding includes all of our 9th and 10th grade students. It provides a framework of learning, which encourages students to become creative, critical and reflective thinkers. We focus heavily on the skills students need to become independent learners and be successful at Harding and beyond. The MYP encourages students to make connections between their studies in traditional subjects and to the real world. The traditional subjects include:

- English/Language and Literature
- Math
- Science
- World Language/Language Acquisition (a language other than the mother tongue)
- Social Studies/Individuals and Societies
- Physical Education/Health
- Tech/Design
- Art

In their 10th grade year, each student completes a personal project. This is a significant piece of work of the student's choice that is the product of the student's own initiative and creativity. It includes a product, journal and a report. Students have been working very hard since October to complete their projects. The due date is March 1 with a showcase being held at Harding March 15.
