


Spectator News of the Past



Professor
Julian C. Bryant

If it wasn't for Professor Julian C. Bryant Humboldt wouldn't be here right now. Mr. Bryant was Humboldt's first principal. In the late 1800's Humboldt had an unexpected disaster, struggling with low, rigid school funds and a poor economy, the school district wanted to close Humboldt. Mr. Bryant lifted Humboldt from it's debt and enlarged the enrollment, which soon made Humboldt equal to all the other St. Paul Public Schools. Mr. Bryant was a graduate of the University of Minnesota. In 1889 he came to Humboldt and was principal until 1898. He played a key role in Humboldt's early history and will never be forgotten.

Alexander von Humboldt

Humboldt was a naturalist and explorer. He was born in Berlin, Germany on September 14, 1769 and died on May 6, 1859. He was known for his explorations of Central and South America. He collected thousands of specimens of rocks and plants. He also studied volcanoes, ocean currents, the earth's magnetism, climate and animal life. Humboldt was a busy man. He also researched in other fields such as mineralogy, astronomy and forestry. He helped lay a foundation for later studies of the structure Matter. He was well known and looked up to. He was a brilliant man and we are honored to have our school named after him.

YESTERDAY

Our Humboldt, The past years.....

A long, long time ago in 1888 the very first school was built on the West Side. The building housed 720 students and cost \$67,230.46. This school was named Humboldt and continued until 1911.

During the first year of 1888, there was 57 students and 2 teachers. After three years the school's funds were short, and the school board wanted to discontinue Humboldt High School. With the strong efforts and goals of Mr. Julian C. Bryant, the first principal the school was reopened in 1892. The school grew and made progress. In 1895 Humboldt High School was equal to Central High School with courses offered to students for four years. Humboldt lost Mr. Bryant, who went to Central in 1898, and then Mr. H. S. Baker became principal. Humboldt's enrollment sky rocketed and the school became cramped and overflowing. Before the new building was built Mr. Baker became ill and Mr. Deitrich Lange became principal. In 1911 the old Humboldt building was renamed Crowley, serving students with special needs, and a new Humboldt High School was built.

The new Humboldt High School and Junior High School shared the same building with additions in 1924 and 1959. In 1976 a new senior high was constructed and connected to the old building which then turned into the Junior High. The total cost was \$1,510,686.60. BIG BUCKS! For our athletes, Mikkelson Field was remodeled in 1992 at a cost of \$516,637.00. Our school's site is 20.91 acres and the school itself is 208,158 square feet. Our enrollment in 1999-2000 is approximately 1,000 students and over 70 faculty. As we approach the new millennium our school still lies between Humboldt, Baker, Elizabeth, Morton, and Livingston streets. We hope it will remain here for many years to come.






REMEMBER is taken from the opening page for the senior section of the 1973 Life yearbook.


Capturing The Moment

Our Humboldt has had many clubs and activities for students to participate in over its long history as a St. Paul Public School. Upon researching the history of clubs in our school, Dan Duncan a yearbook staff member was heard exclaiming, "Humboldt once had a Ski Club with 100 members." The yearbook staff discovered many interesting activities that students participated in such as, the GAA, and the War Council.

One activity that has remained constant throughout Humboldt's history is the documentation of each school year by a staff of students with the direction of an advisor. This has been carried out in different formats beginning with the Humboldt 'Annual.' Our earliest Annual in our school collection dates to 1898. By 1913 the Annual also was called the 'Spectator.'

The Spectator was a magazine for high school students, that was published on the first of each month. By 1915 the first Humboldt 'Life' yearbook was being published. Life was published four times a year. For 25 cents you could get the first 3 books and you paid 50 cents for the final June senior edition. But for \$1.00 paid in advance you could order all four editions. Through the 1920's and 1930's Humboldt's Life continued to be published quarterly. Then in 1940 the first hard bound single edition yearbook was published. This tradition of a single yearbook has continued up to the present day.

Where the future of Humboldt High School, its many diverse students, staff, and 'Life' will take us, we will only know the answer to, as the yearbook staff continue to document; 'Our Humboldt's daily journey into the New Millennium'



Memories

I started teaching at Humboldt in the fall of 1969 after having just graduated from the University of Minnesota with a B. Sc. in French and in History Education. Humboldt Junior and Senior High School were both in the older building that is now home to only the junior high school. Because of a lack of space, there were only two small rooms available for faculty use, so they had been designed as the Men's Faculty and the Women's Faculty rooms. I was one of the teachers without a classroom which meant that every class period I picked up my instructional materials and moved out the door with my students to a new classroom. Many students didn't know I was even a teacher during that time.

There was only one French class and my challenge was to build a French program that students were interested in. To complete my schedule of teaching I then also taught four American History classes. My first day of a teacher's workshop included: a meeting with the other Social Studies Department teachers who were all men. It was announced that from that day on their meetings could no longer be held in the Men's Faculty Room (as there was now a female teacher in the department) and I was then asked to take notes for the meetings... which I did without even questioning.


The school day started at 8:00 and ended at 3:00. Each class was 55 minutes long and students generally only took 5 classes with a study hall. Only the very motivated students took 6 classes. There were 3 lunch periods and the students either brought a bag lunch or bought the daily lunch, there were no options like the salad bar and A La Carte lines. Students at Humboldt came from only the West Side neighborhood since all schools in the city were considered community schools. Students walked to school because they lived in the neighborhood. The few students who did not live on the West Side took the city bus.

There were many clubs and activities after school. Some of the activities I recall were: Y-Teens, FHA, H-Club, Ski Club and Pep Club. Students worked with teachers in activities until 4:00 to 5:00 P.M. nearly everyday. These are just a few of my many memories of my year's at Humboldt.

Little 1920, Mr. Joeseph A Wauchope again in 1928-42, Walter J Rock 1943-45, E. E. Lenander 1946-49, Mr. John Gran 1950-54, Mr. Adolf Ingebreston 1955-67, Arley Ludwig 1968-80, William Sagert 1981-82, Don Sonsalla 1983, John Ettlinger 1984-95, Larry Lucio 1996-97, and Steve Lindberg 1998-present.






Snow Daze Coronation

1978 Personal computers become available to the mass market, thus paving the way for desktop publishing. By 1990, laptop notebook computers allow people to compute from almost anywhere.



1945 Television is invented in 1926, and regular network TV broadcasts begin after World War II. One of TV's most popular shows is CBS's "I Love Lucy," premiering in 1951. Television transforms almost every aspect of life in the twentieth century.



1997 Millions of people worldwide cruise the Information Highway via the Internet, and instantaneous e-mail communication becomes common. As the millennium ends, computer, TV, video and telephone technologies begin to converge.




Junior Class Council Fundraiser




Giving To Help Others



Humboldt Hall of Fame








