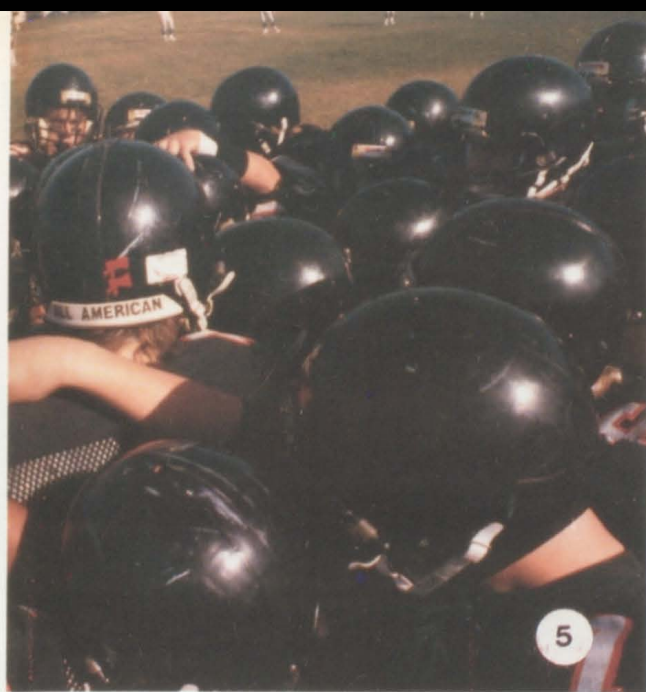

Seniors Add Incentive

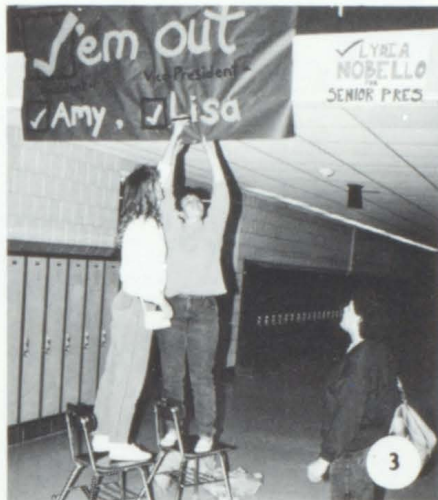

Program Emphasizes World

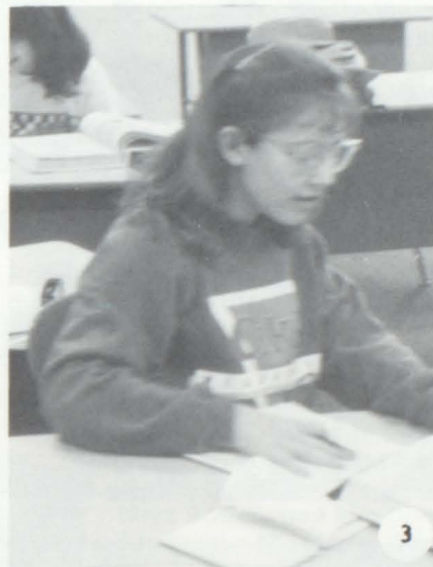
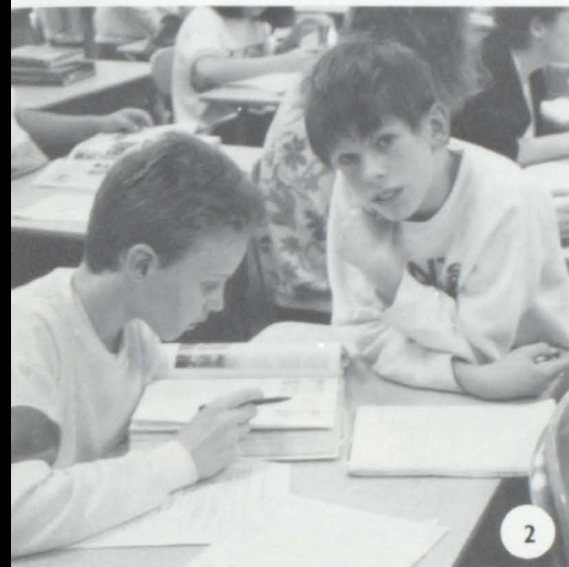

There were several changes in the journalism department this year, as more students elected to join the staff with newspaper advisor, Mr. Robert Klepperich.

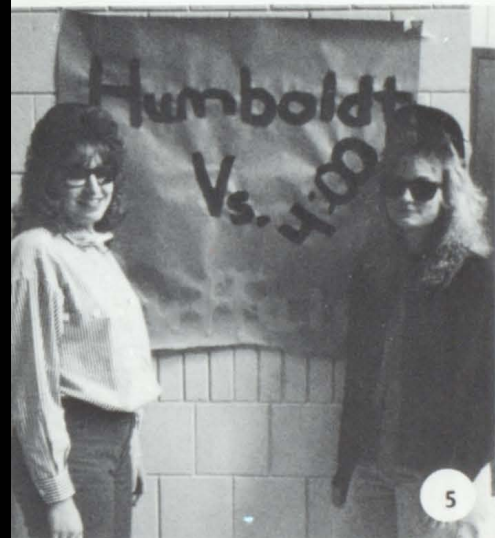
One of the changes was the retirement of Marc Boulos' well-liked sports column, The Athletic Pyramid. This column had been a regular item in the *Arrow* for three years.

Last June, Humboldt and Ecolab were honored with the Keystone Award sponsored by the Greater Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce, the St. Paul Area Chamber of Commerce, and the Minnesota Chamber of Commerce. They were recognized for their response to community needs and concerns.

Ecolab has supplied Humboldt with guest speakers, furniture, computers and other supplies.

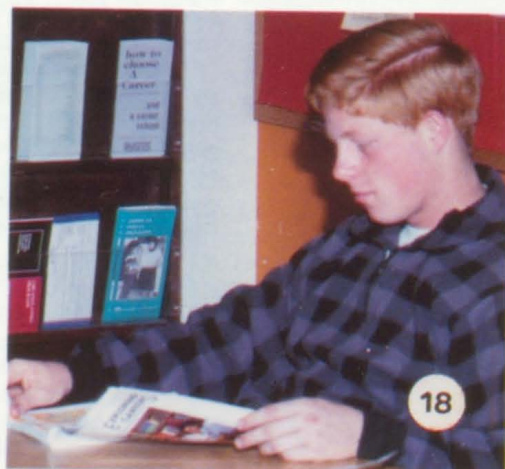
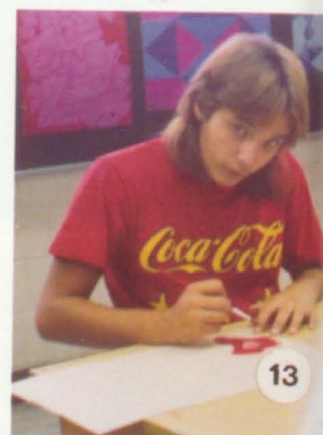

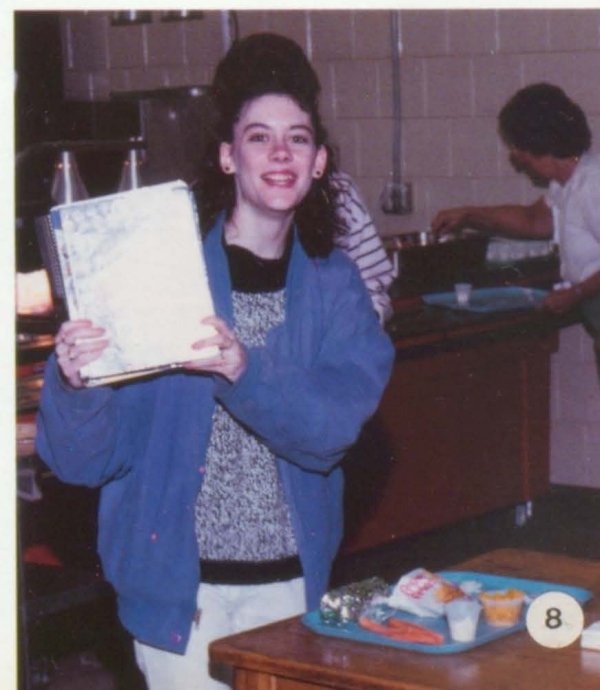

"I was pleased with the attitude of all our players this year," commented Mr. Paul Herzog, head coach of the football team.

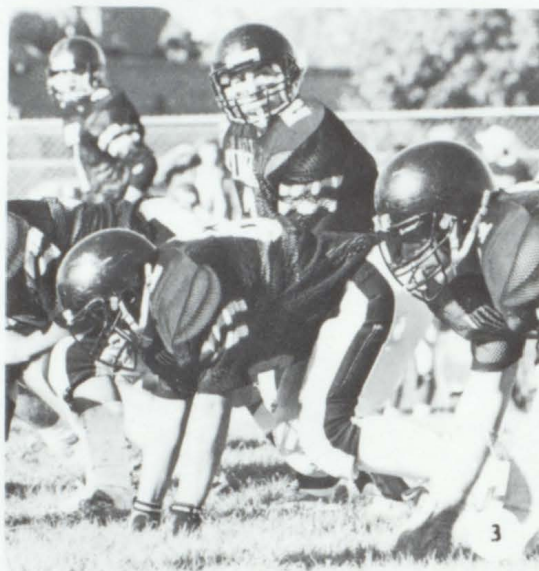
The highlight of the season was Humboldt's 28-22 theft of Highland Park's Homecoming game. The squad rebounded from a fourteen point deficit to win their first game.

Teamwork Leads To

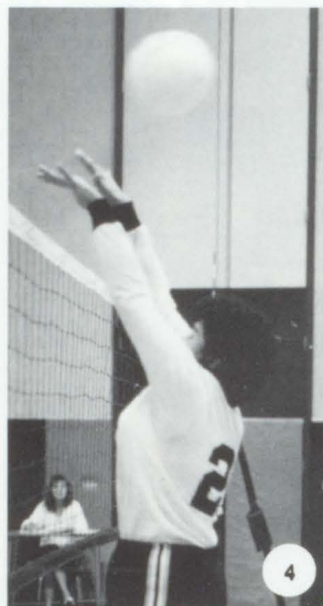

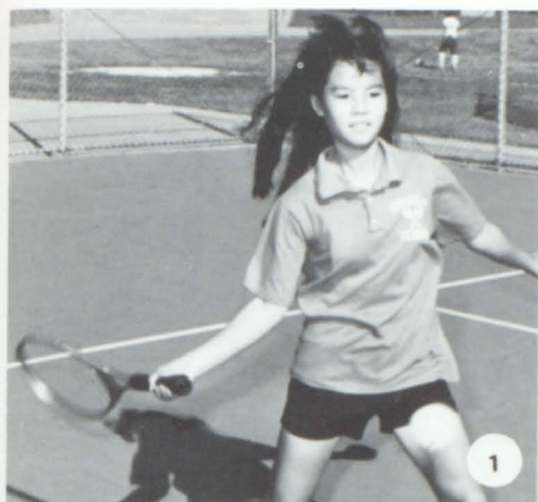

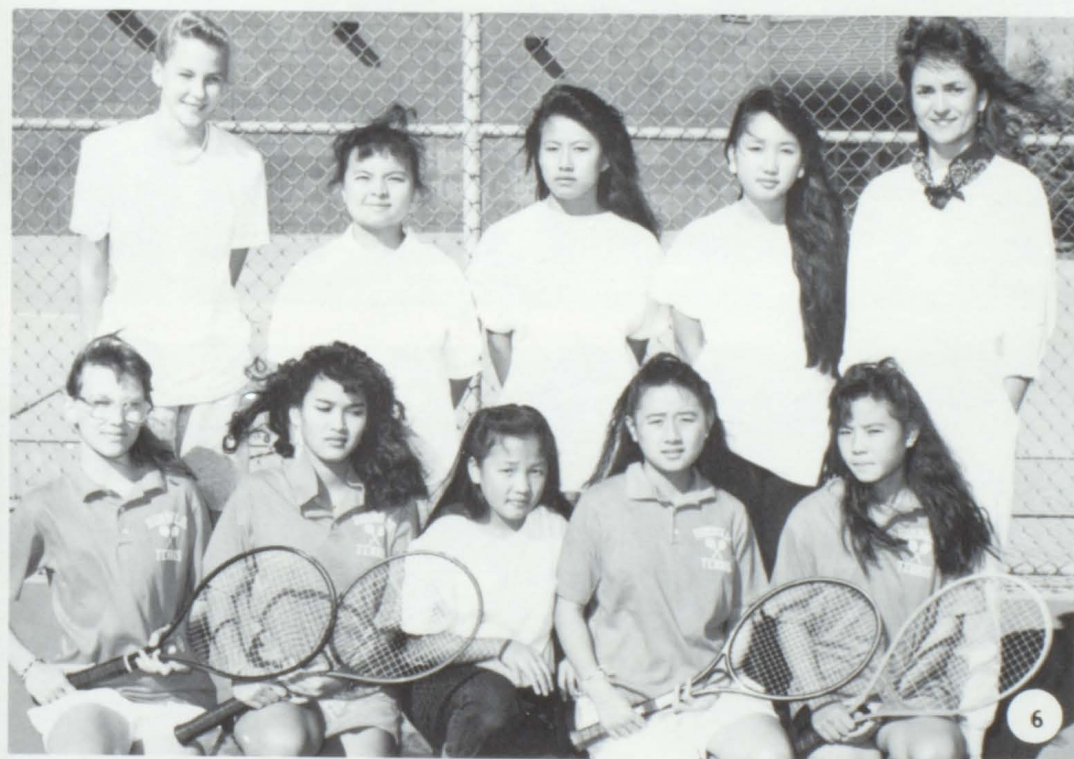
Six Join Three

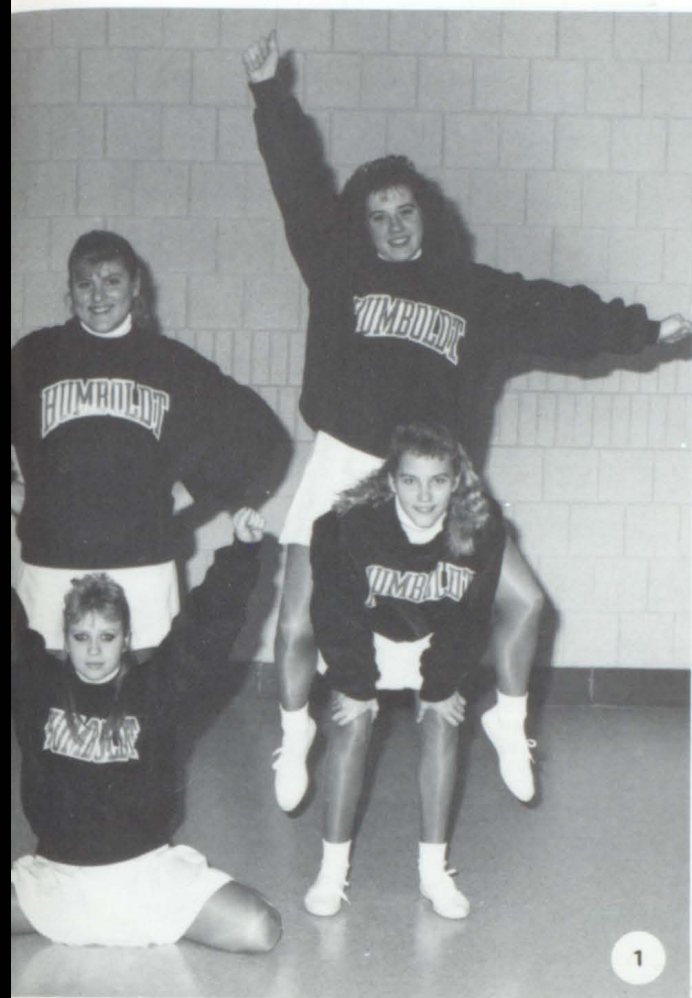

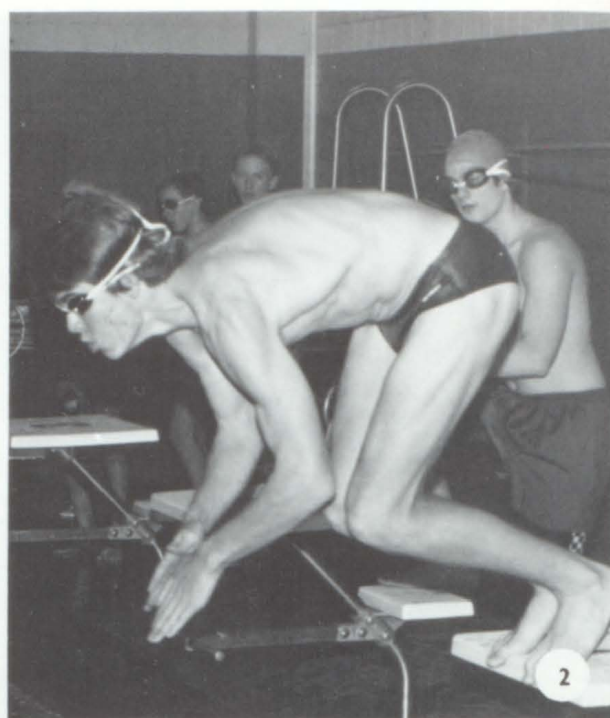
Members Make A Splash!

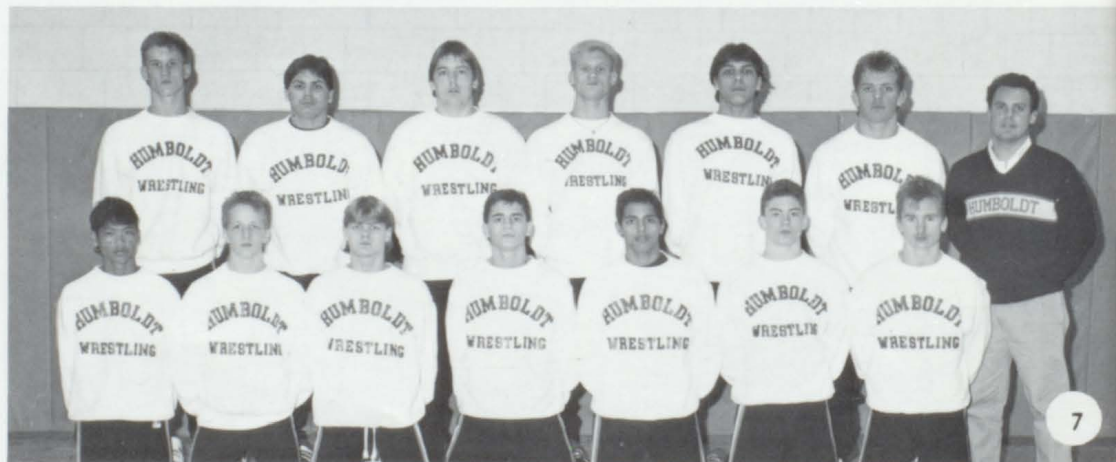

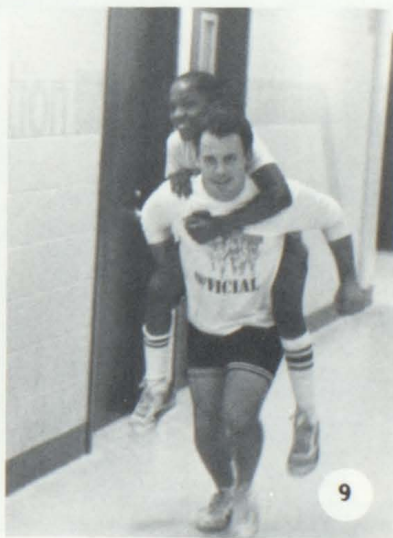

After many close games, the highlight for the boys' basketball team was the 55-50 victory over Como Park.

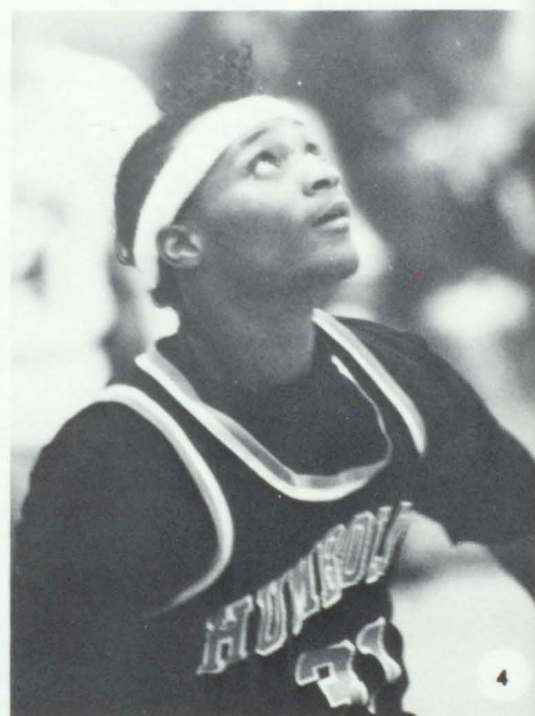
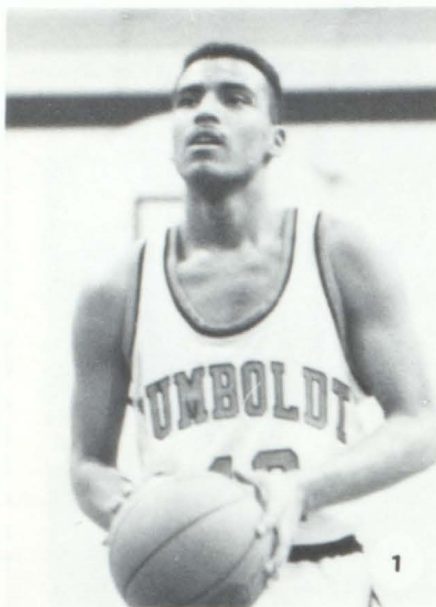

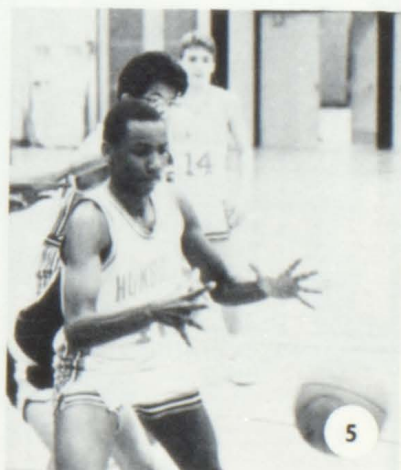
