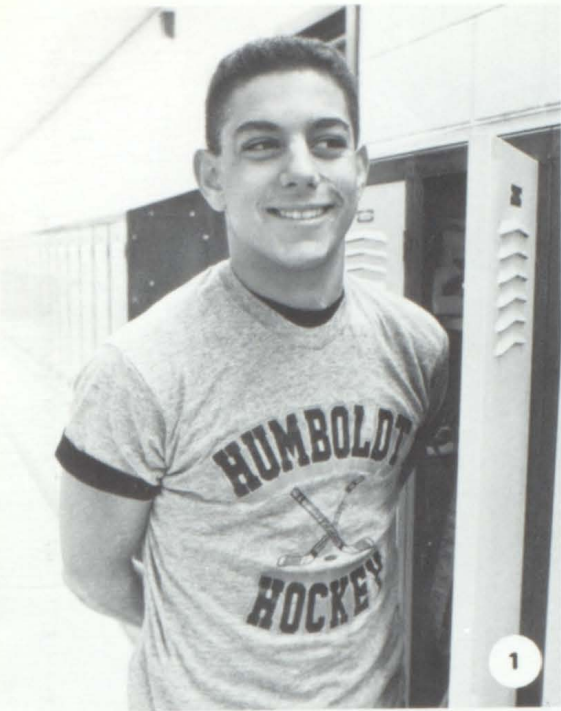
Some people took the first step by becoming involved in continuing programs such as the partnership with Ecolab, and classes for credit with St. Thomas and the University of Minne-

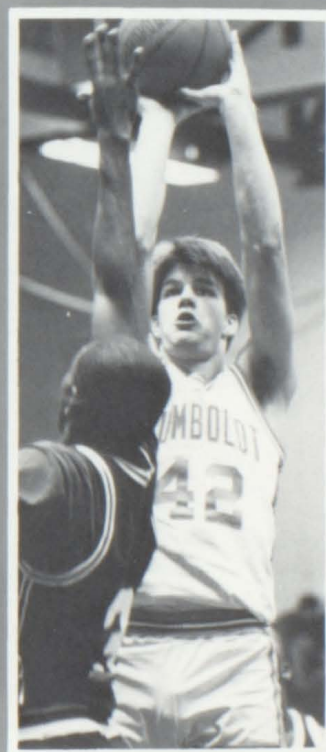
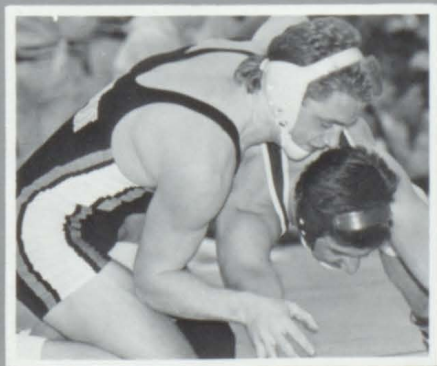

"The team has a good foundation for next year's team," remarked Coach Gary Ales. "Their good attendance and attitude were the key elements to the season."

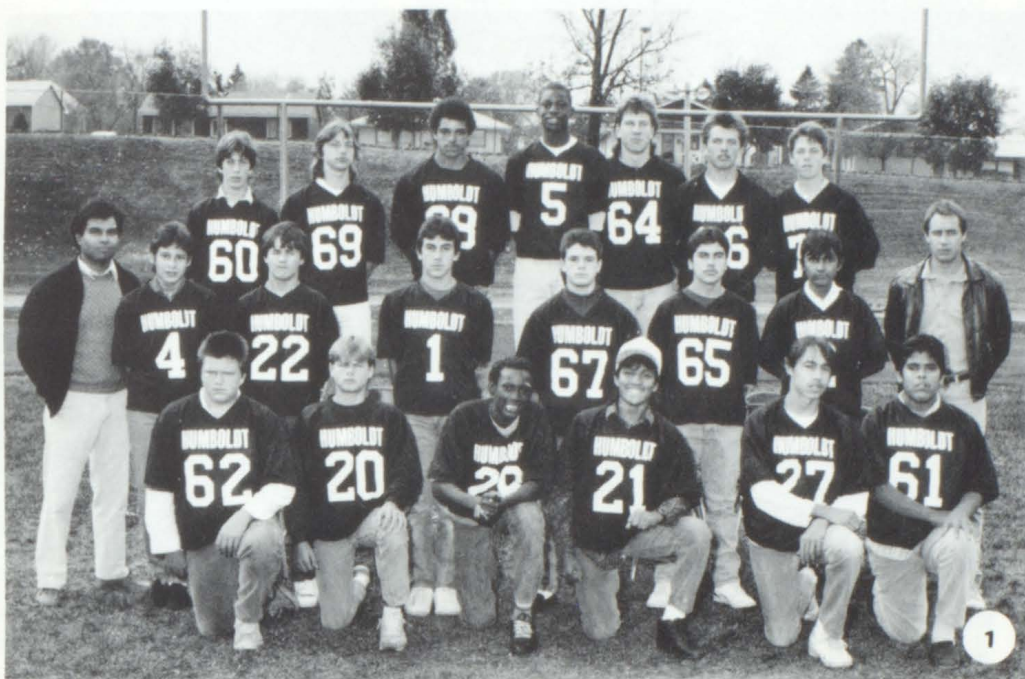
Star performers were Truc Nguyen at goal, with Donna Heinl and Tanya Kulyas at defense.

A near-win over Central was the J.V.'s best performance during the second half of the season. Humboldt was down at halftime, 22-0. In the second half, over 100 yards in passes by Joe Herrera to Brian Anderson and Gordon Thompson, along with several first downs picked up by Frank Dominguez, and Brannon Drees, brought Humboldt to within six points. The final score was 28-22.

"Many players and a great attitude, that is how I would describe our team," stated Matt Smith of the 9th grade team. Defensively the team was led by Santino Franco and Leo Martinez. Franco commented, "Our defense faced a lot of situations where we really needed to bite the bullet and keep hitting. We did."

The team's offensive game was led by Scott Ecker and Smith.





Humboldt Defeats Johnson 20-7



THE Humboldt Varsity Football Team pulled off its only win this year against Johnson, 20-7 as the offense powered into the game with a shocking 11 minute drive which took up most of the first quarter.

Leading Humboldt in scoring that game was Jesse Walker, a new member of the team who transferred to Humboldt this year from Michigan. Walker scored 95 and 36 yard touchdowns. Mario Byer also scored with a one yard quarterback sneak in the first quarter.

Head Coach Paul Herzog commented on their 1-6 season saying, "It was great the way the players kept coming back week after week, even though we were often disappointed on game days."

Humboldt nearly pulled off an upset this year against the undefeated Central Minutemen. The Indians led Central at halftime 7-6. Central, however, came back in the second half, scoring two touchdowns, which left the final score at 19-7.

The Indians hope to improve their performance for next season. Coach Jim Olson stated, "Our outlook for next year depends on what we do in the off season."

Nelson Returns To State

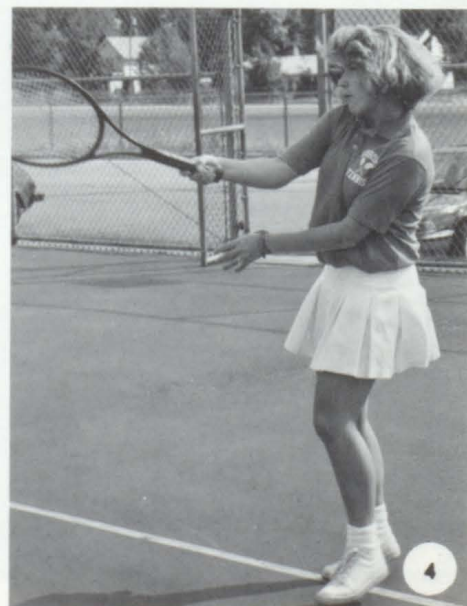
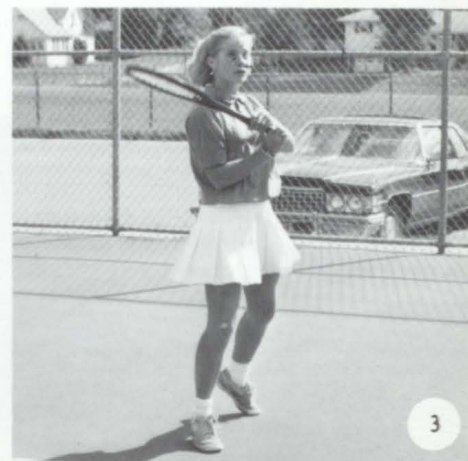


HEATHER Nelson, a senior and the winningest tennis player in the history of Humboldt, made her third appearance in the State Tournament.

Volleyball Squad Brings Home Trophy



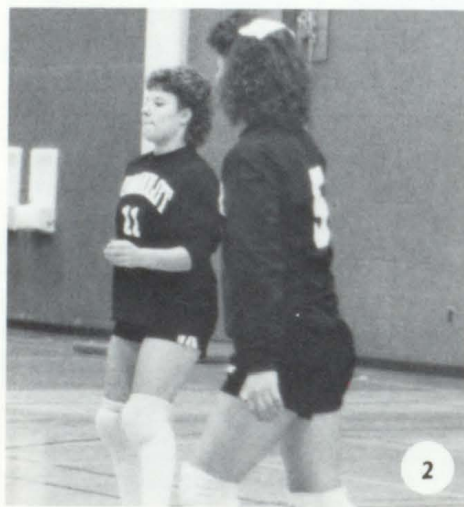
A PIECE of Humboldt history was made this year as the volleyball team advanced to the championship game of the Sibley Invitational Tournament.

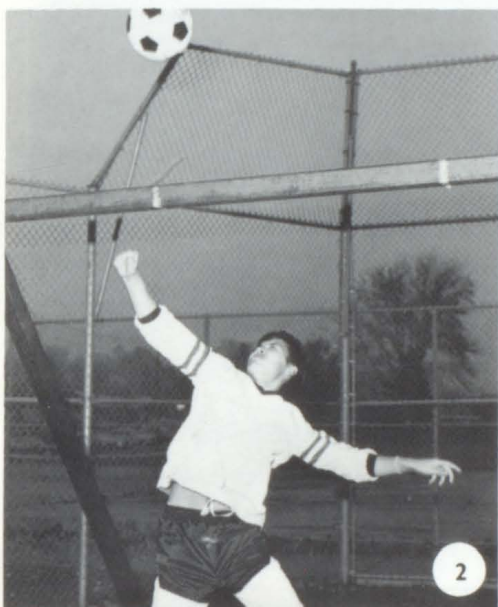




City Championship For Boys' Soccer

The team was coached by Jay Wescott who has 12 years of coaching at Humboldt behind him.

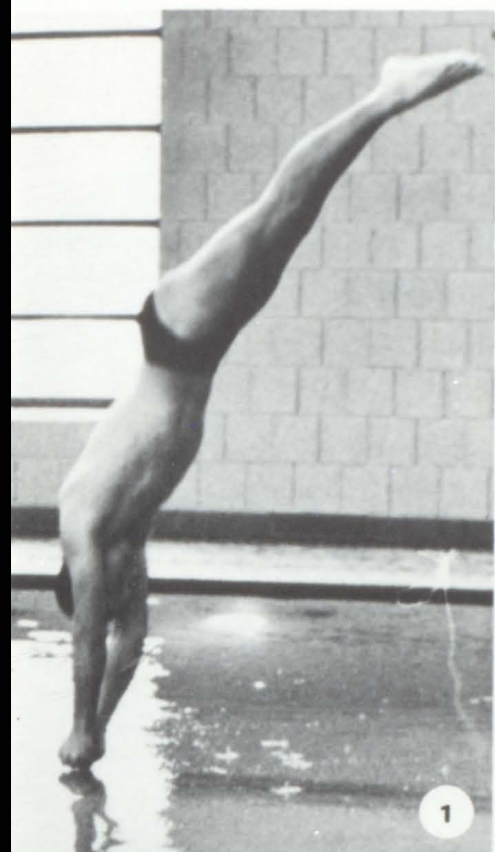

ALTHOUGH a short-handed team, which lost two key players early in the season due to injuries, the varsity hockey squad played courageously throughout the season.

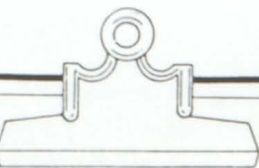

The squad won the consolation trophy at the South St. Paul Tournament over Winter Break.

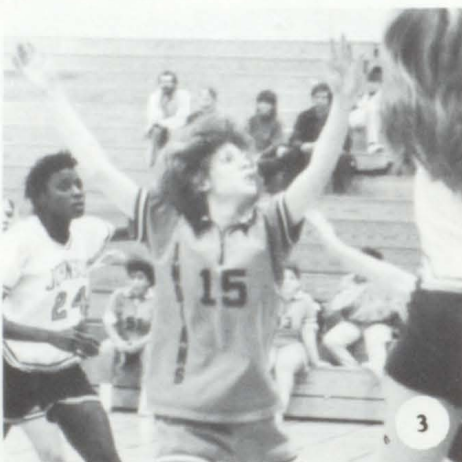

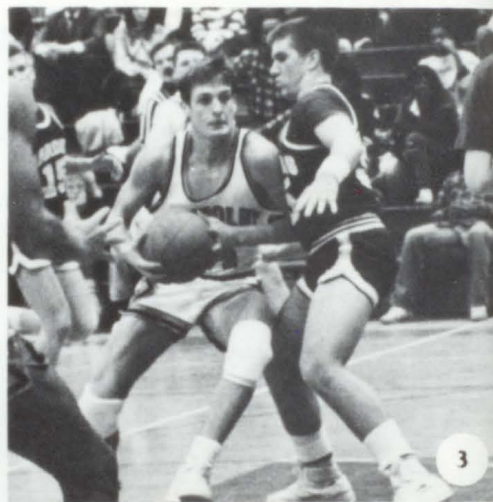
"OUR players' true colors were exposed this season after they lost Scott Aeilts' leadership to his second injury in two years," commented Coach Larry Lucio.

Senior Terry Singleton's performance on the court earned him the honor of being named to the all-conference team.

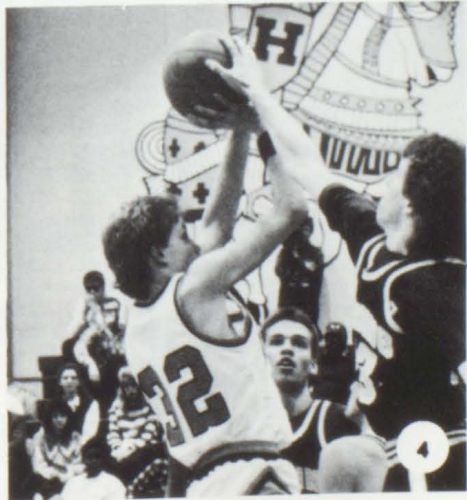

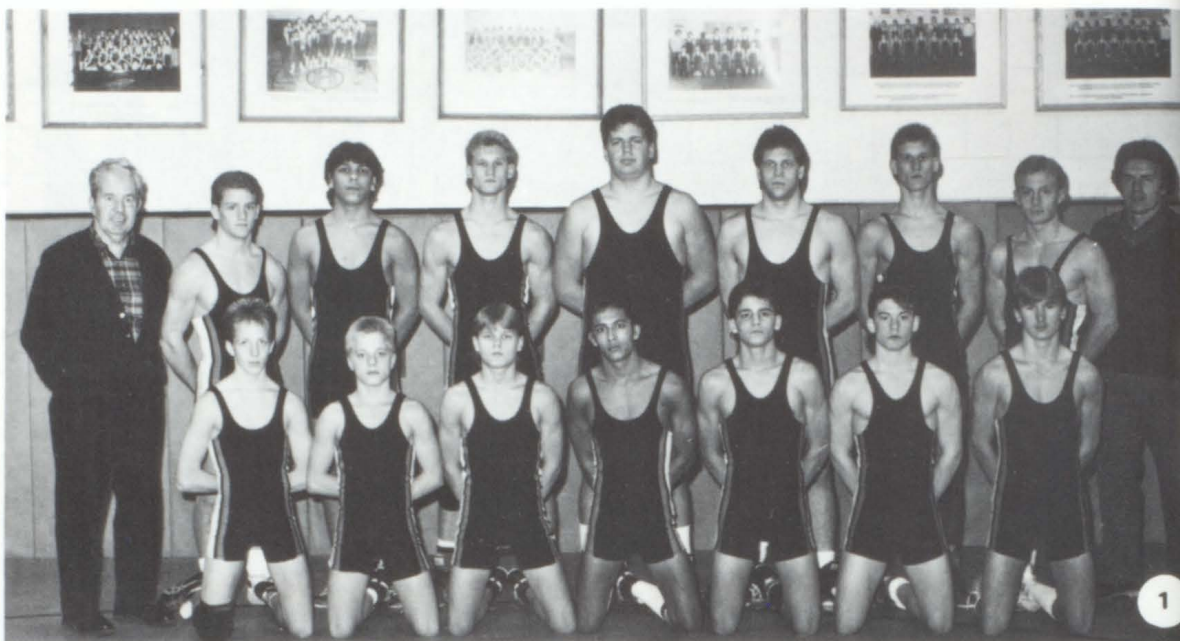

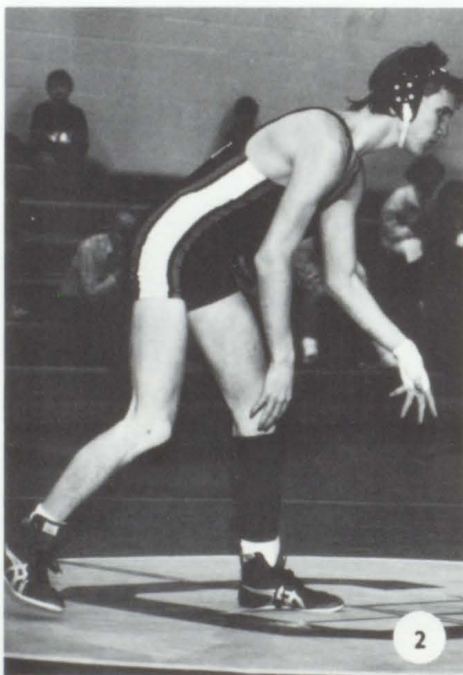

Once again the 23 members of the squad remained undefeated in the conference due to their experience, talent, consistency, and good coaching.

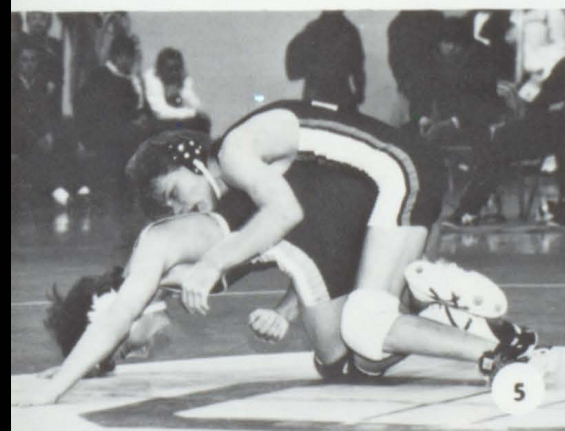
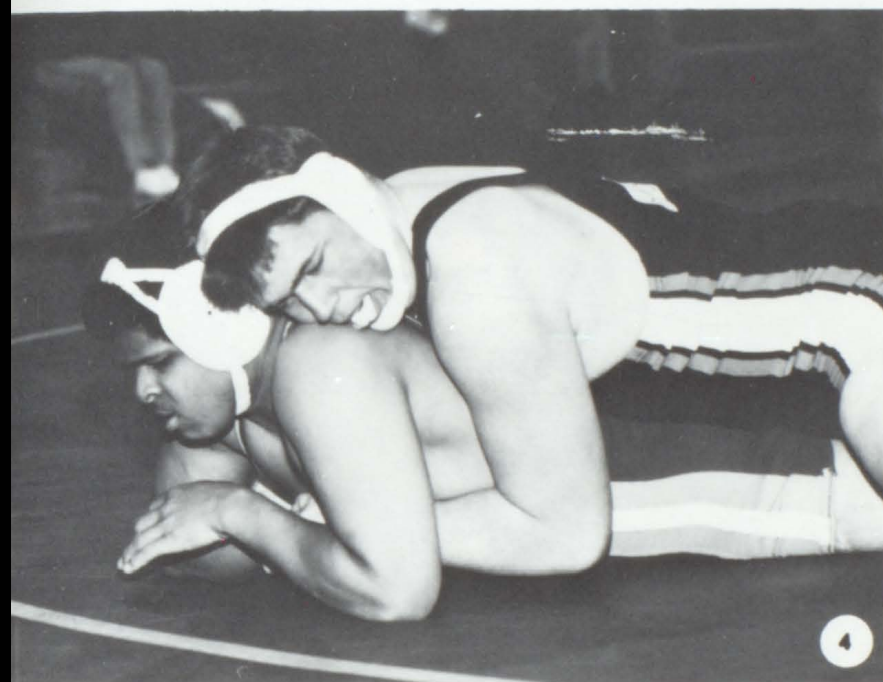
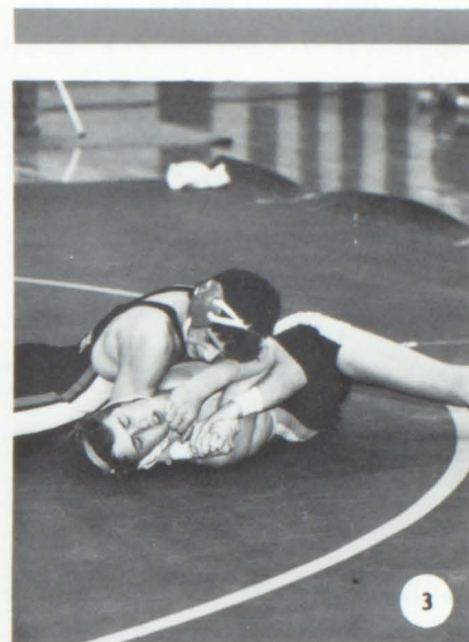
Johnson and Victor Santana made it to the state competition.

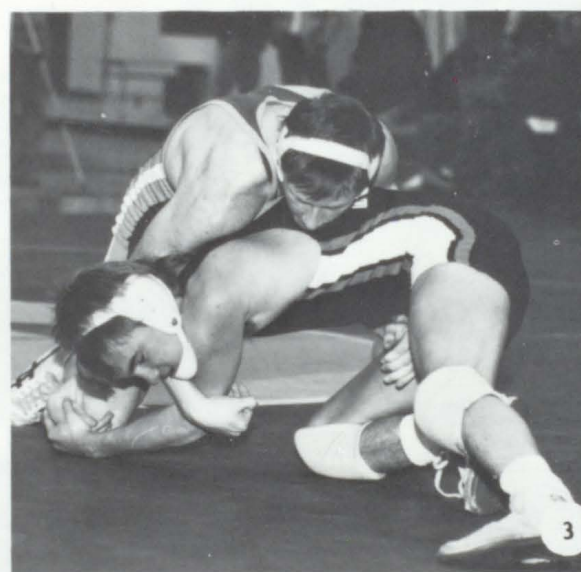
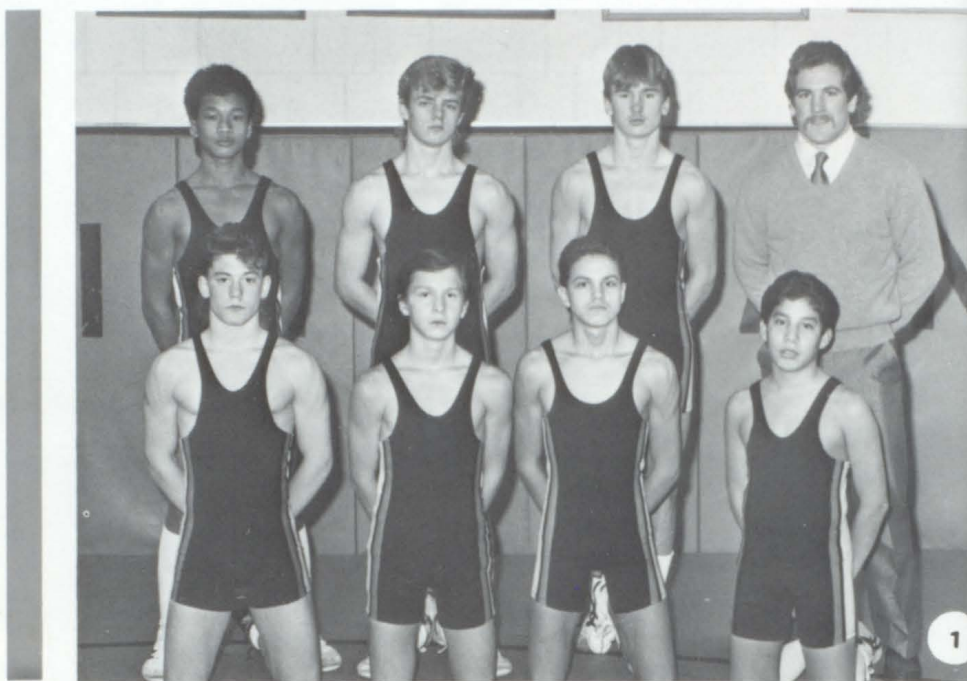
J. V. Dominates

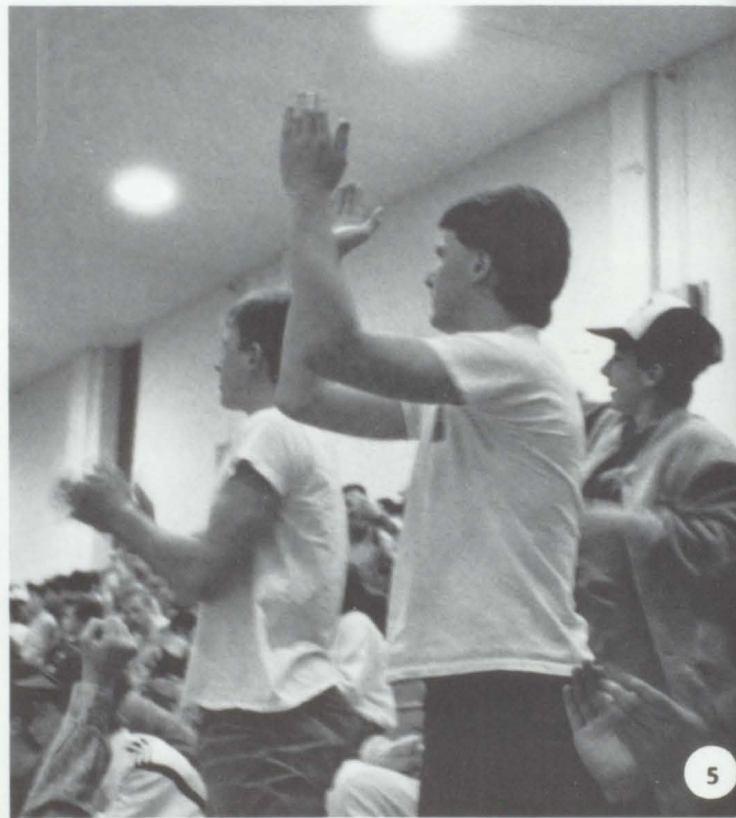
They were very competitive against Harding and Cretin-Derham Hall. Though the varsity team did not win any meets, they reached their goal of improving their scores from last year.

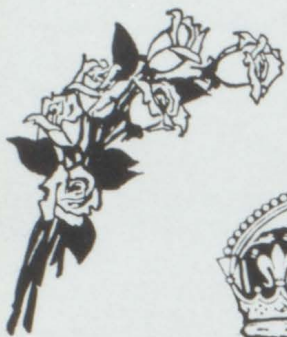

Jr. High Sponsors Store



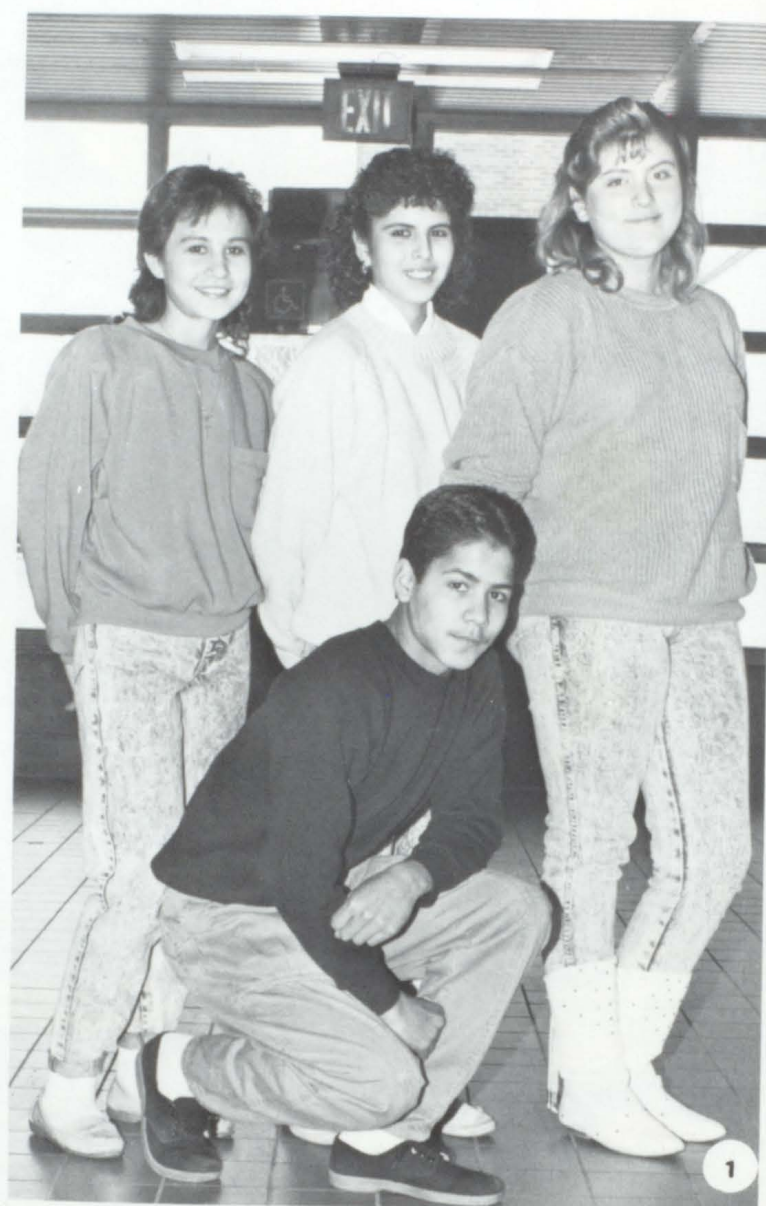
THE Junior High Student Council started out the year with a Halloween dance. During the second semester, they sold school supplies in a new junior high store.

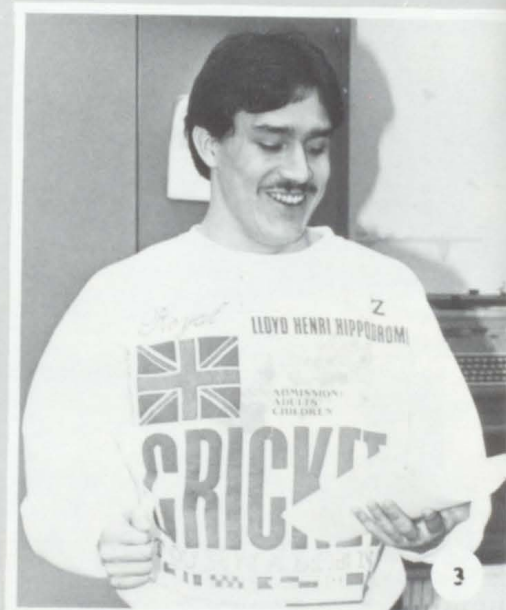
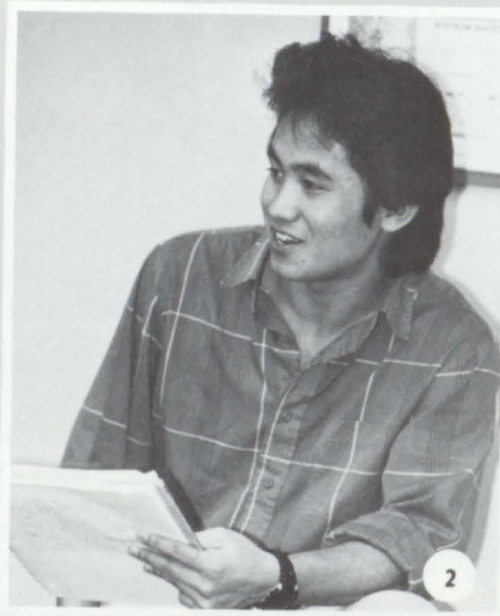
UNDER the guidance of Mr. Steve Egyhazi, approximately 35 students participated on the Speech Team. This was the largest team in five years.

Heather Nelson placed second in regional competition for the "Voice of Democracy" contest.



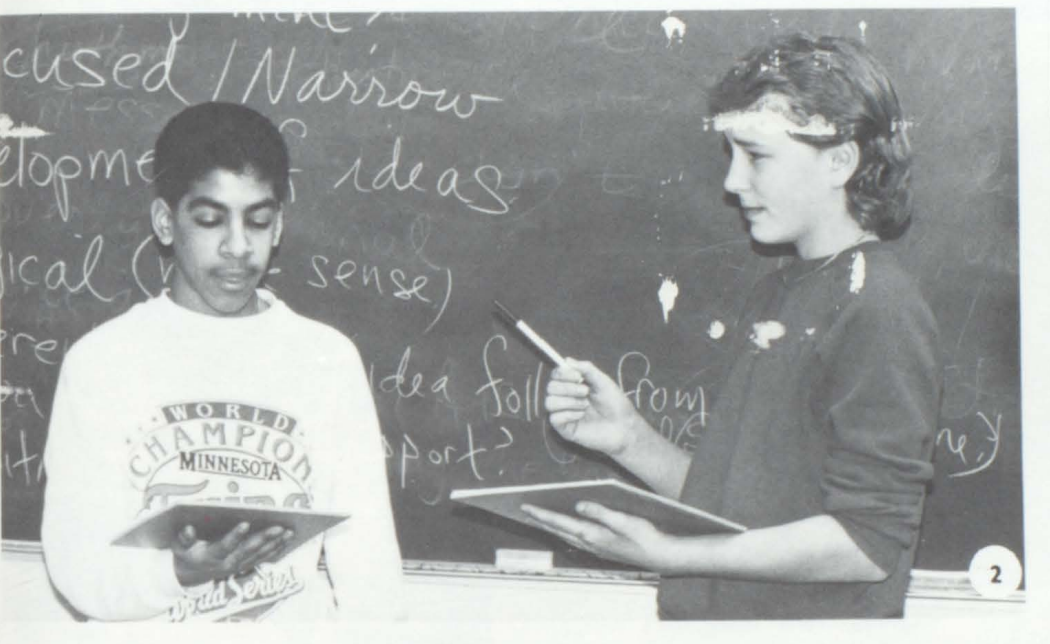
Novices Go For The Win

The club hopes to have tournaments to see who the top players are, to possibly meet with other schools who have clubs, and to improve the skills of each member.

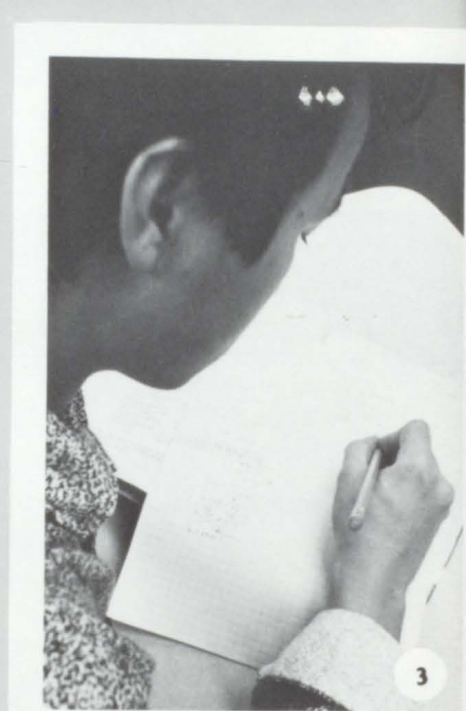
ALTHOUGH they were a small team competing with larger schools, and had a poor season record, the math team made a strong start with a total score of 14 points in their first meet.

There was no one star player. Different team members scored higher at various meets.

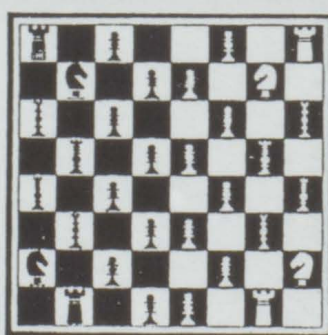
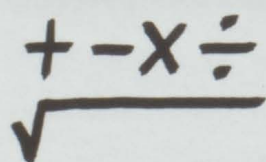
This was Mr. Gaslin's first year teaching, and he had never coached before. He had "no idea" what to expect.

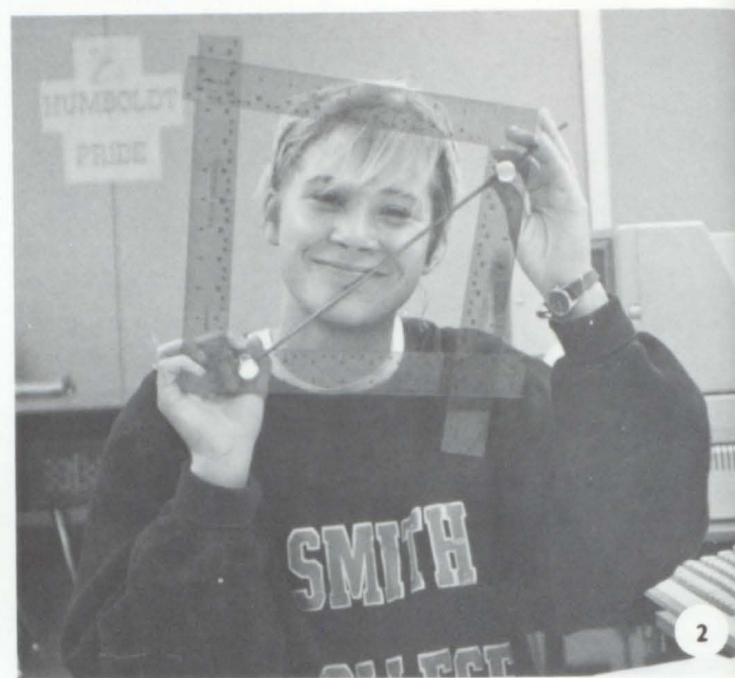
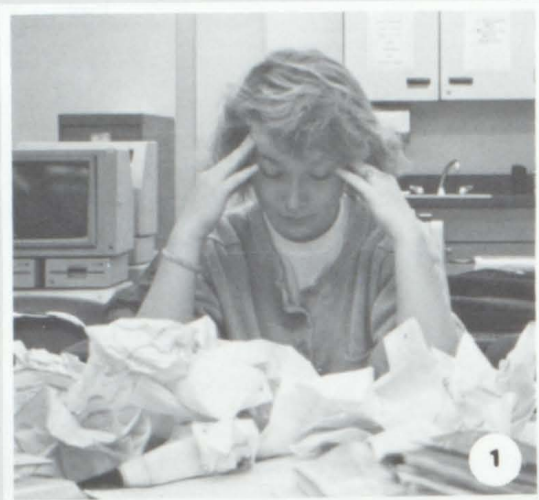

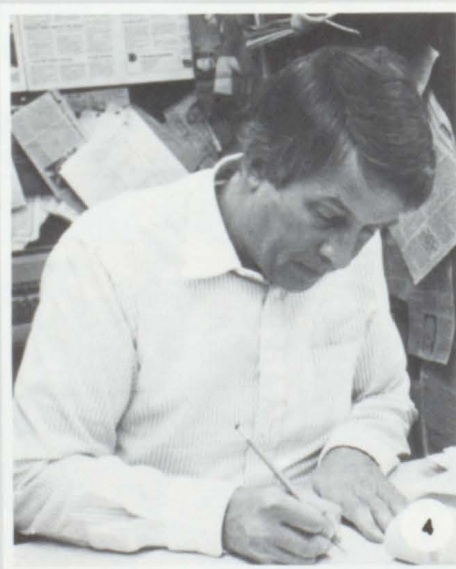

The programs included upbeat disco numbers by Mr. Ales and up to 100 student participants, singing carols, doing the hokey-pokey, and passing out Christmas gifts.

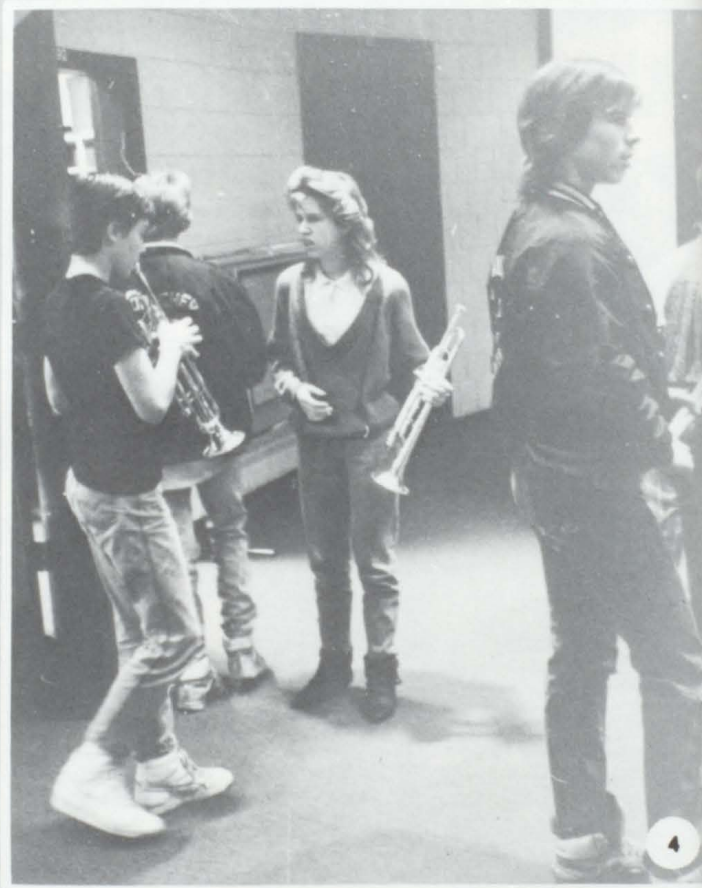

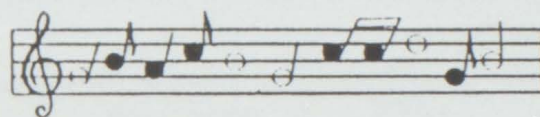

They ended the year with an annual picnic and singing at graduation.

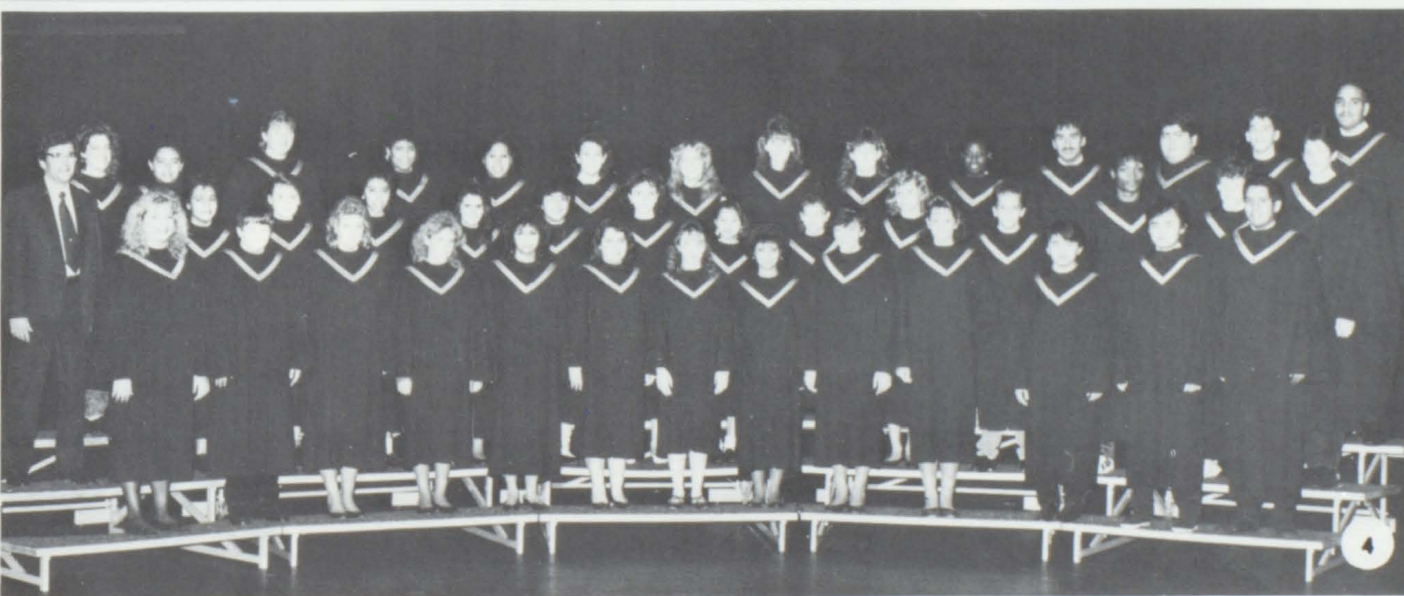

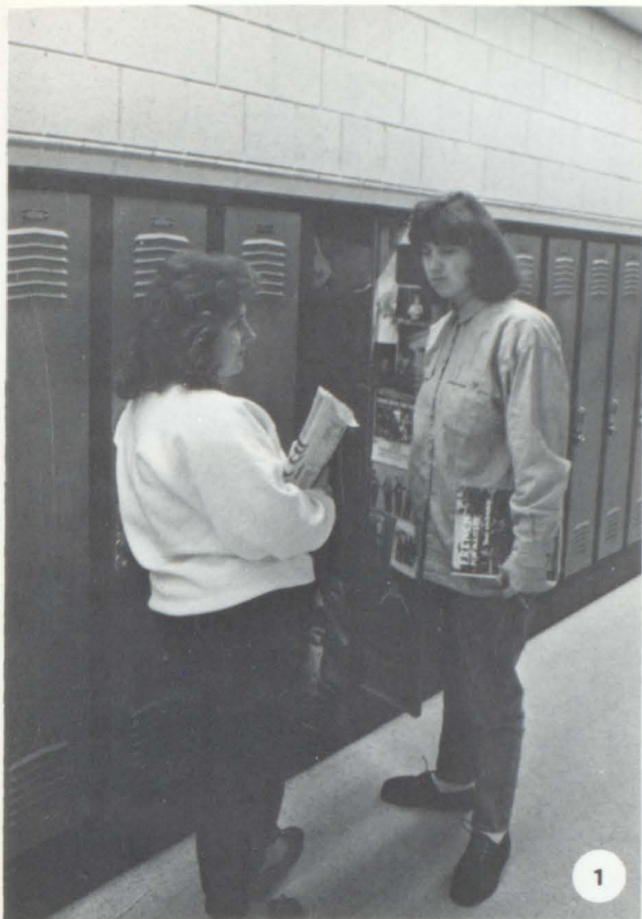
