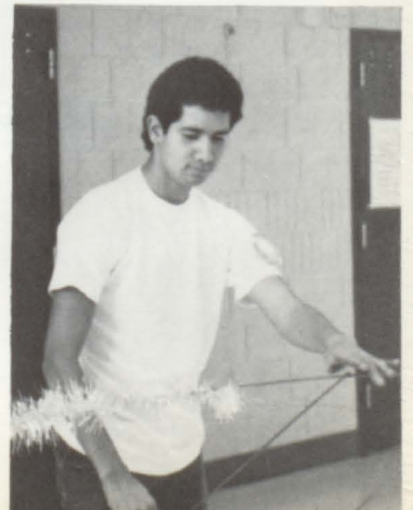

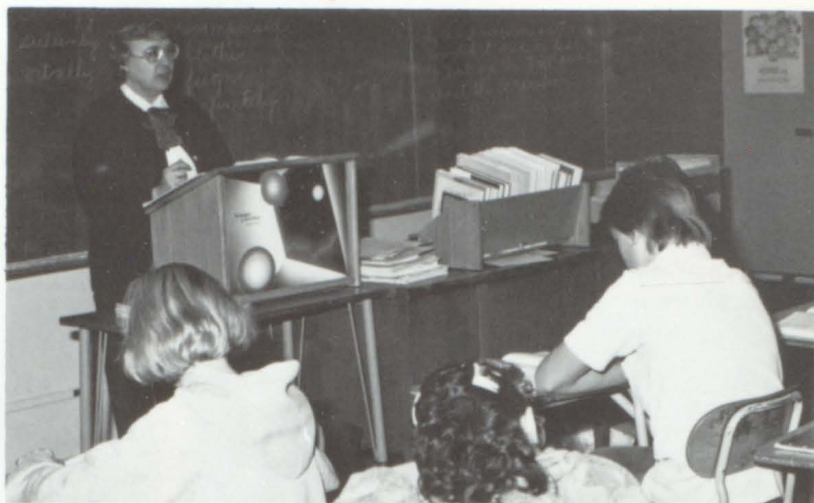

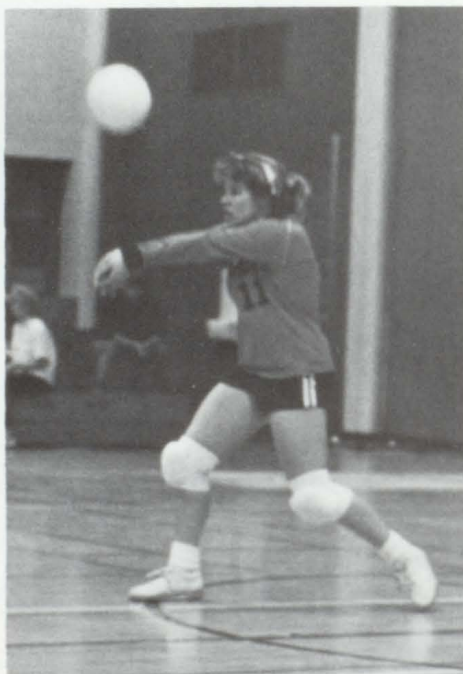

Football game highlights week

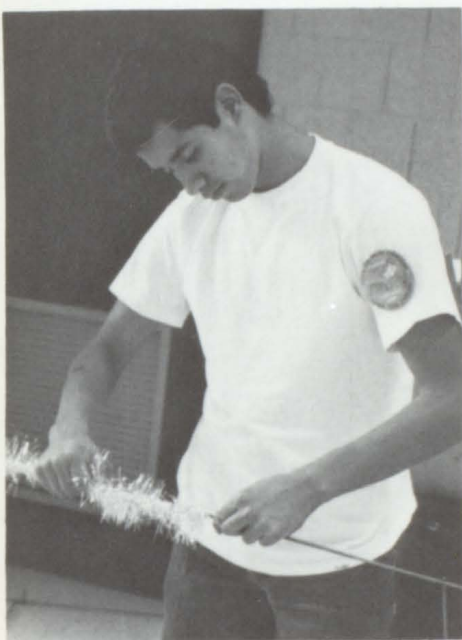
Homecoming was a special event at Humboldt as the football game was played at Mickelson, our home field, for the first time.

Council sponsors Jet's concert

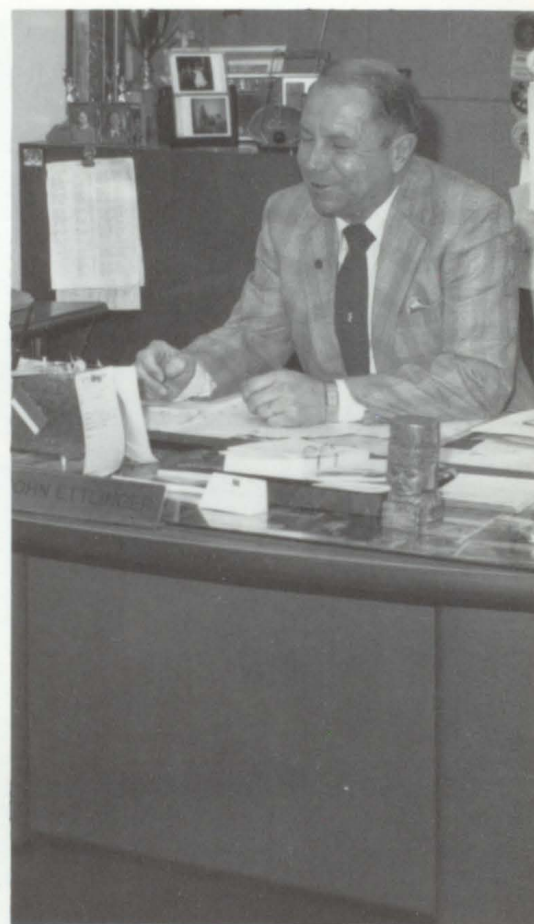
Highlighting Student Council activities was a visit from the famous musical group the Jets.

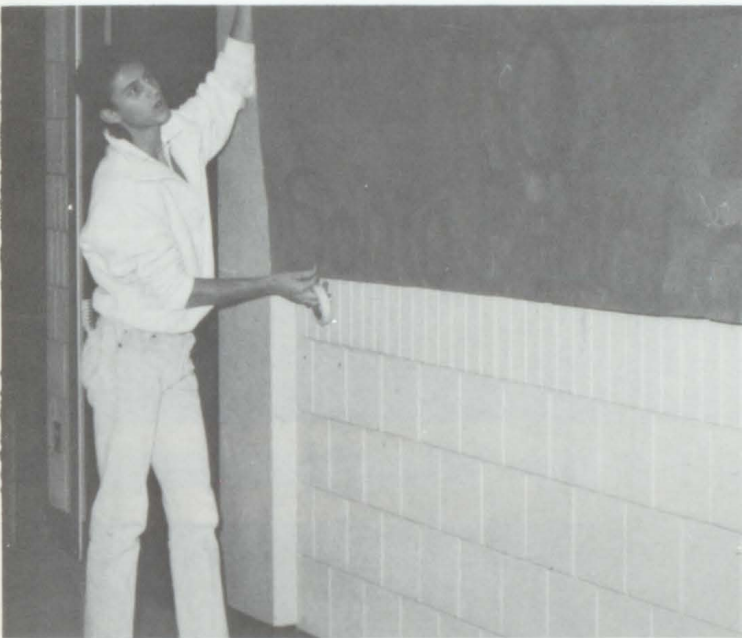

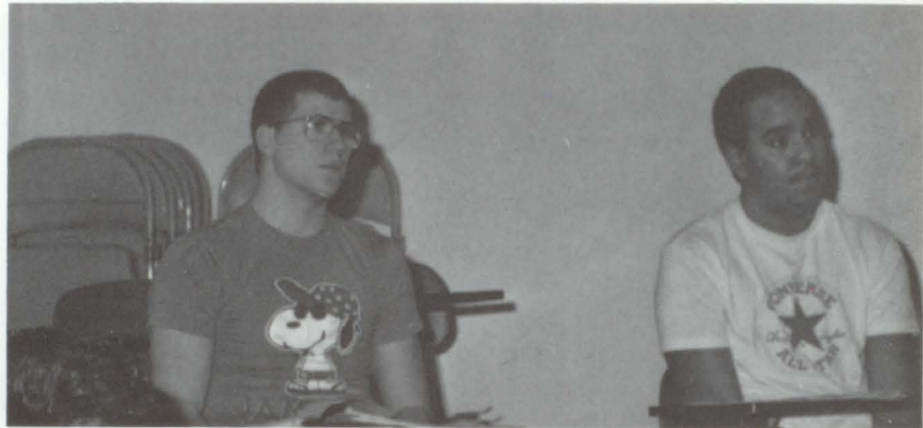

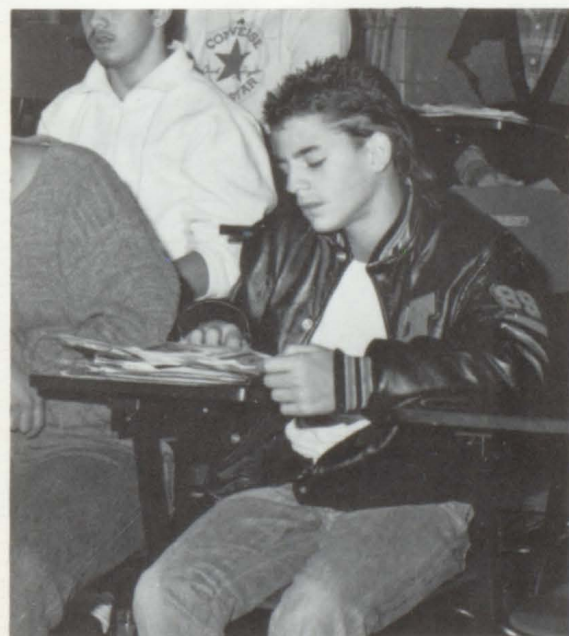
One of the more unique places where the chorus performed was at the Eco-Lab headquarters in downtown St. Paul.

As an additional way to earn money, the musicians sold cheese and sausage. The goal was to earn enough to buy new drum equipment.

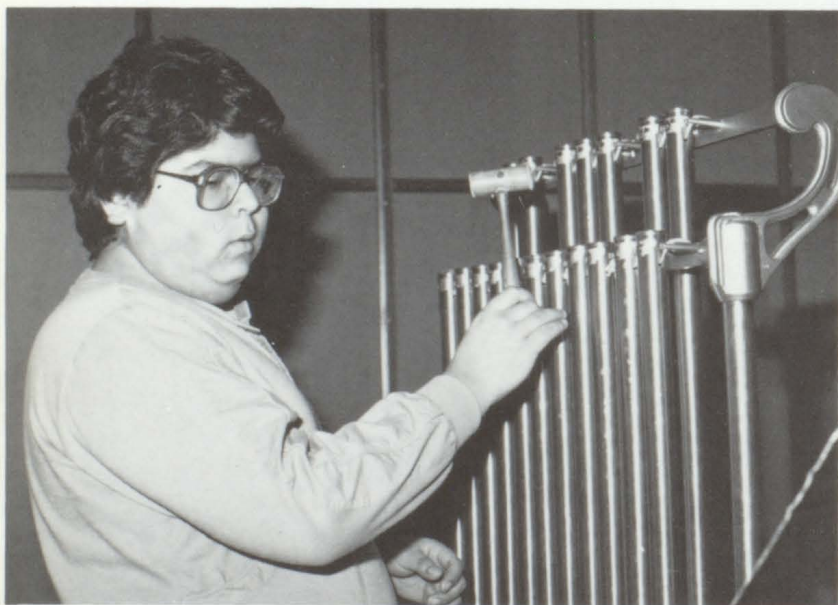
Mr. Richard Curran directed the band through the many performances that displayed the school spirit, such as those at sporting events and pep fests.

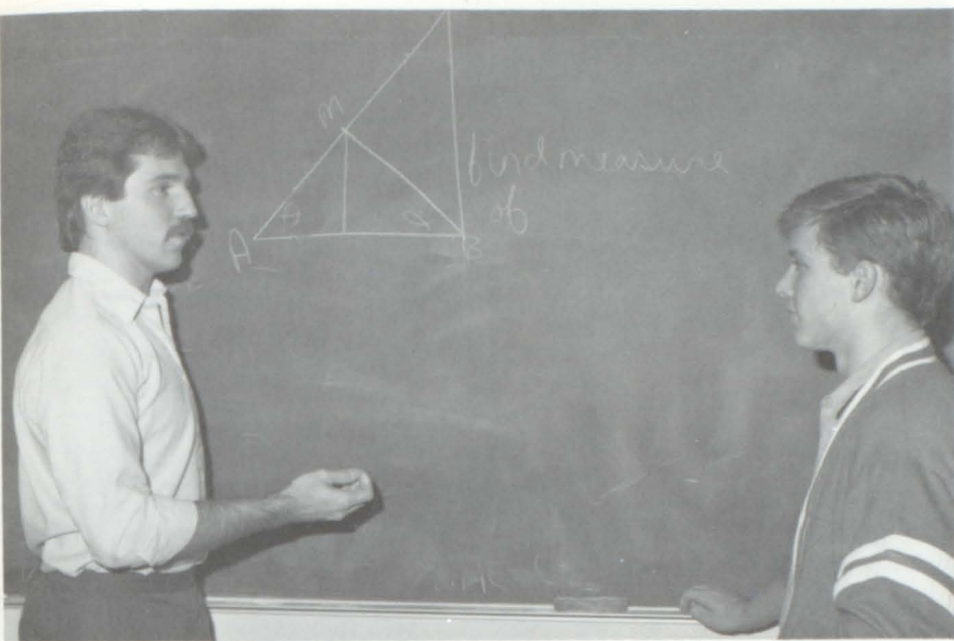

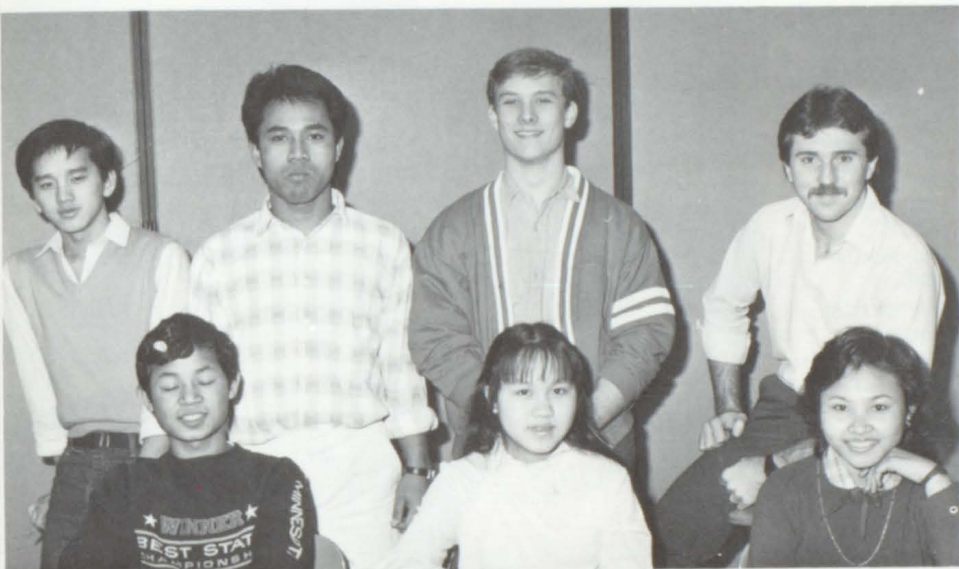


League close to victory but weak

Ms. LeMay led the staff through the many months of grueling work on the *Life*, and was successful in the completion of this 120 page publication.

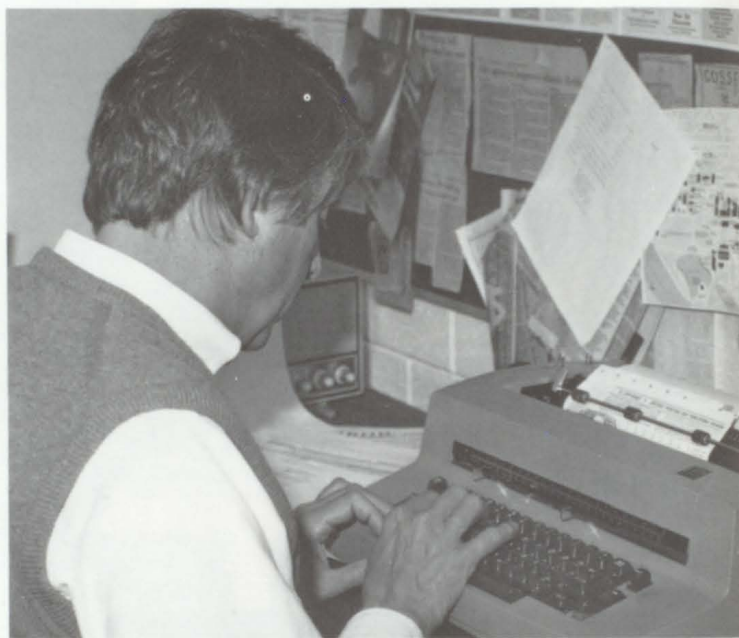

The spring publications were produced even more efficiently than usual with the aid of a long-awaited computer.

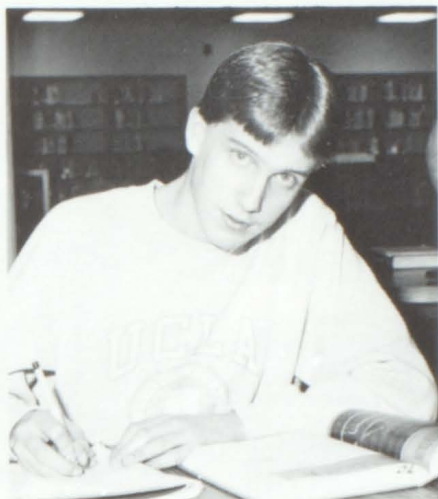


ABOVE. Left to right: Editor Paula Bortz, Advisor Ms. LeMay and Dawn Bryant correct a yearbook page.

Nathan Glessing, of Nate's Corner fame, entered Humboldt in the Radio Broadcasting category for the first time.

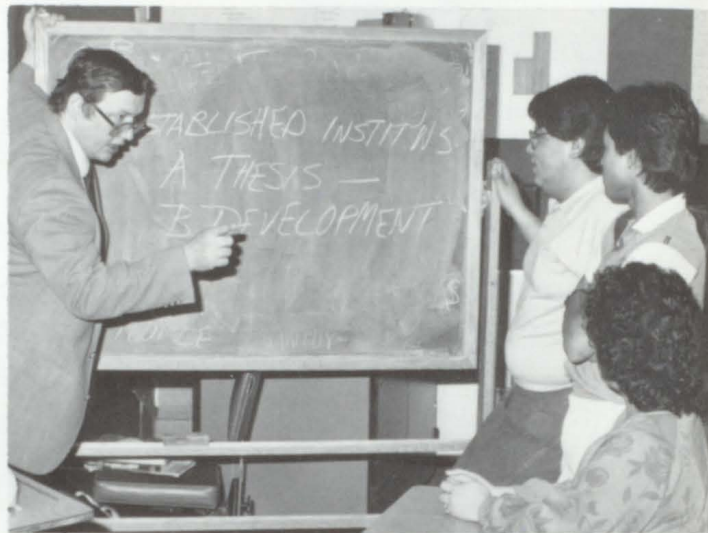

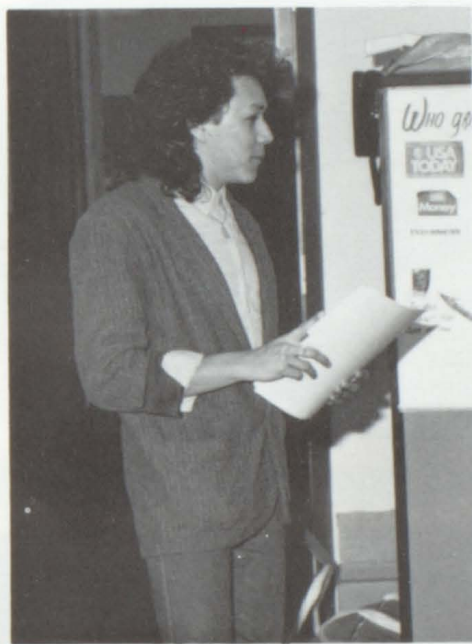


Debaters dedicated and eager to learn

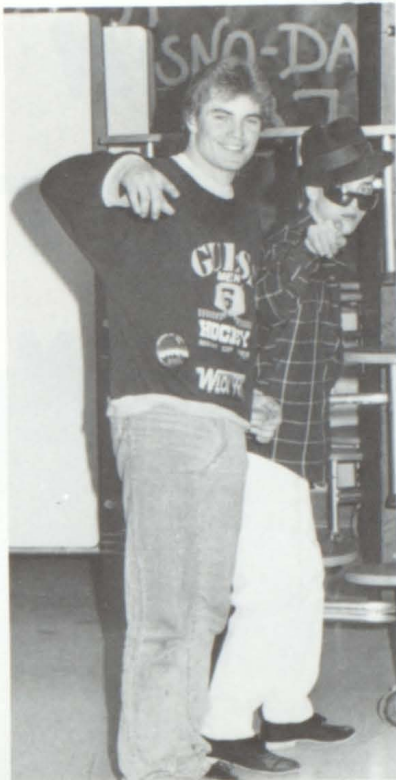

Jon Brennhofner led the offense aided by Brannon Drees and Joe Herrera.

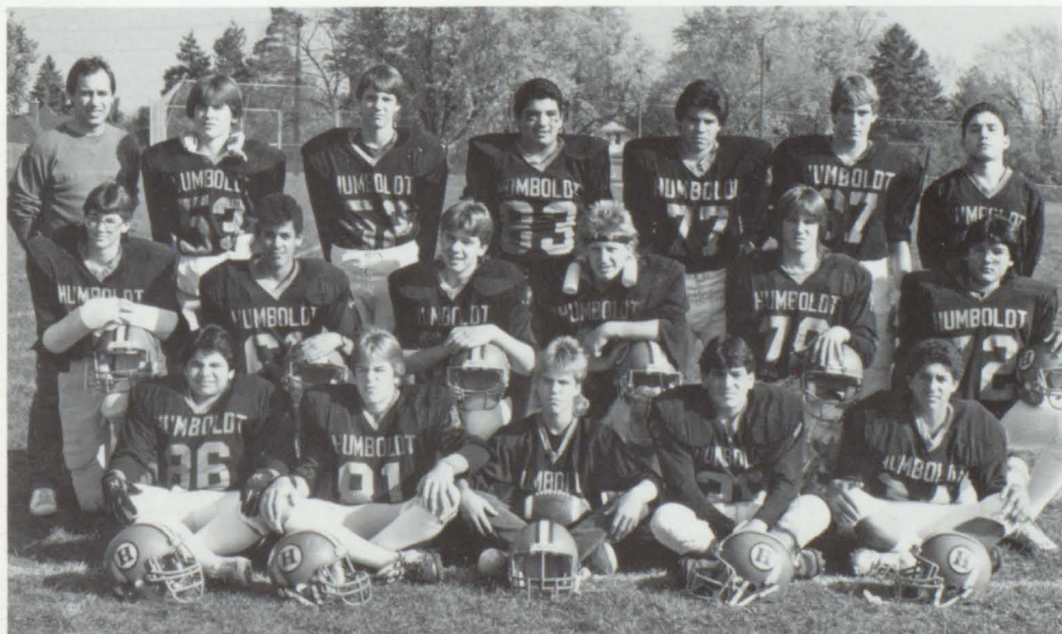

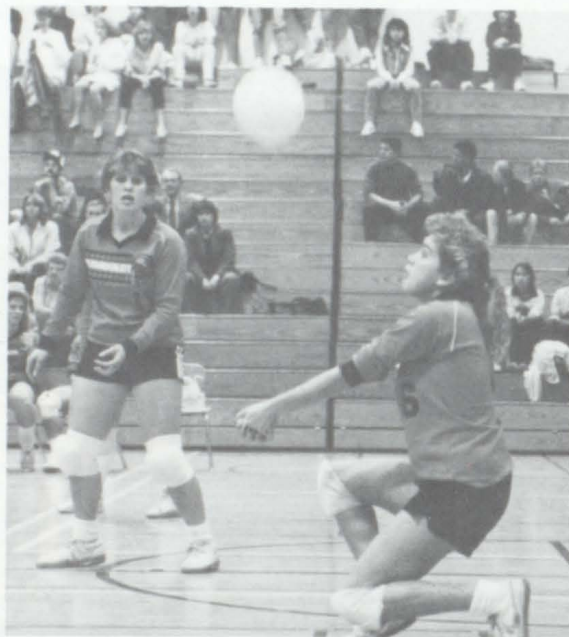

Lack of height and turn out hurt the squad, as did injuries. Key player Lisa Miller broke her foot.

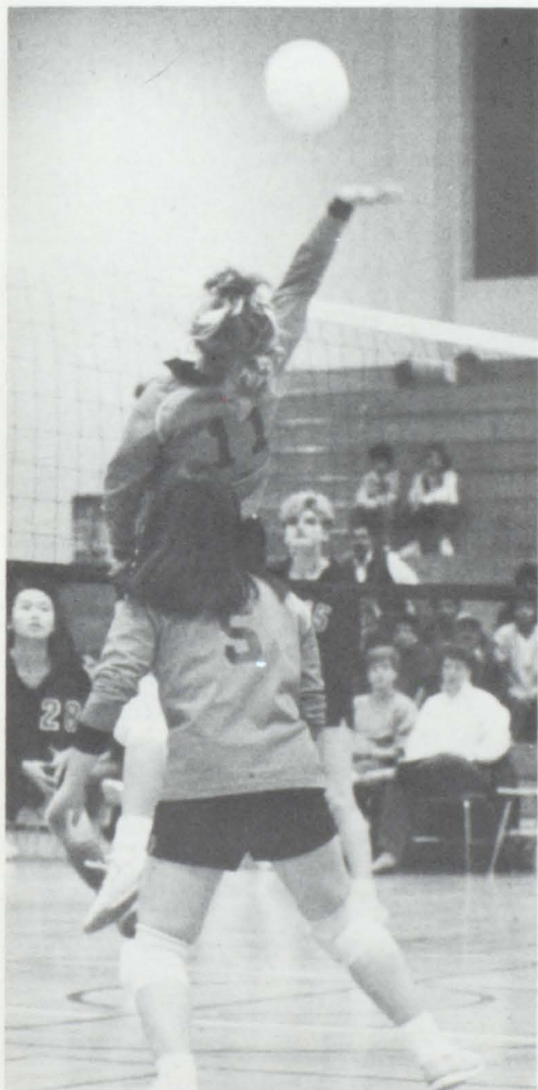
One of the strongest areas for the team was serve reception.

JV volleyball has up and down season

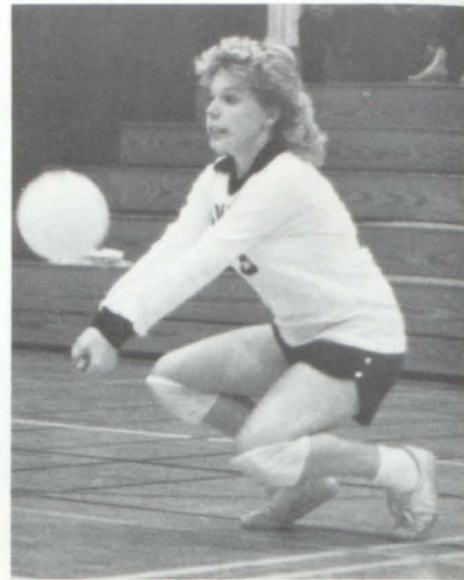

For the second time in three years, Heather Nelson has become the Region 3AA Singles Champion, earning herself a spot in the state tennis tournament.

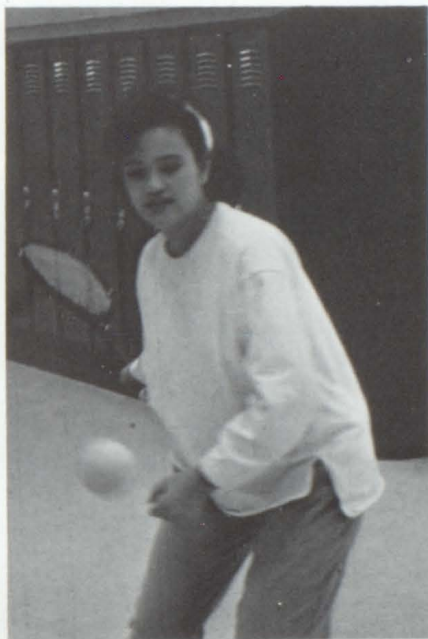
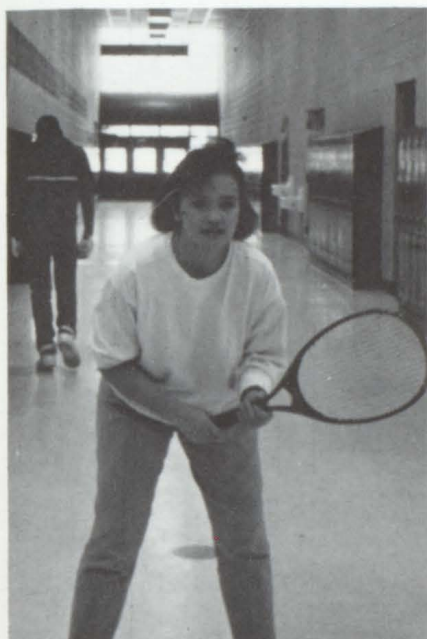
She did this while a member of Humboldt's team which, unfortunately, has had only two wins in the last five years of competition.

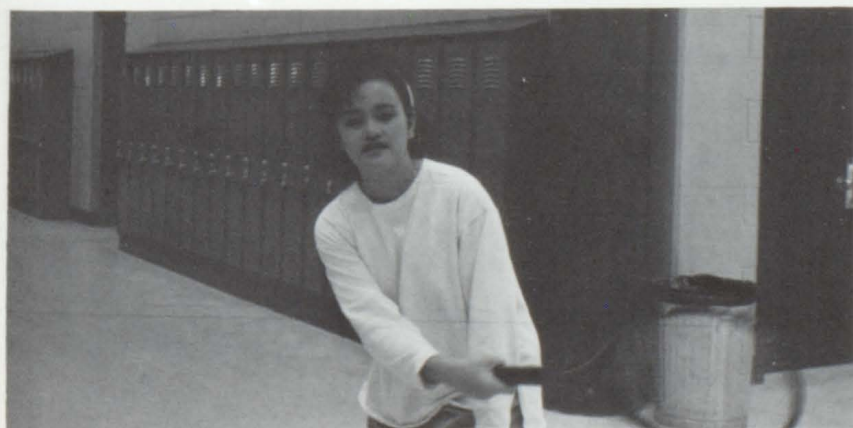

The team looks towards much improvement for next year, following the experience they have gained.



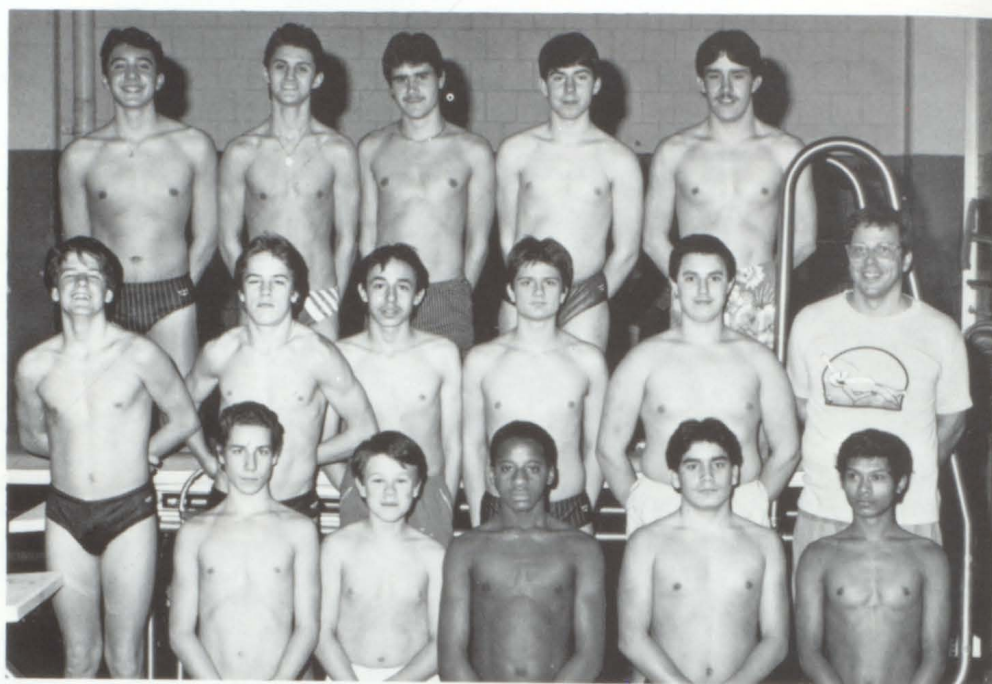

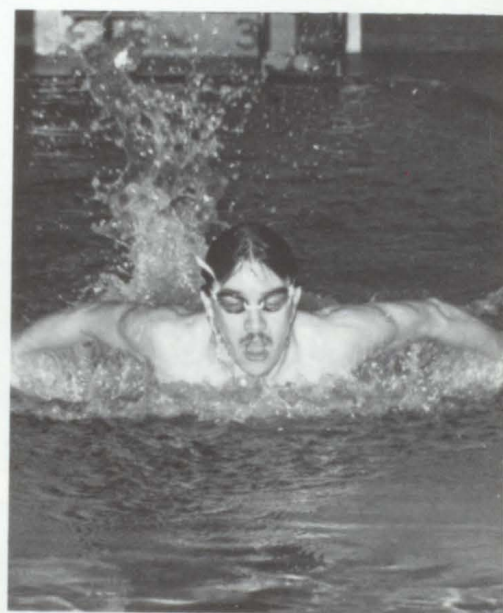
The swimmers were unable to pull off any victories, but showed steady improvement this season.

Greg Herrera earned the most points for the team and swam some very close meets with many second place finishes on his record.

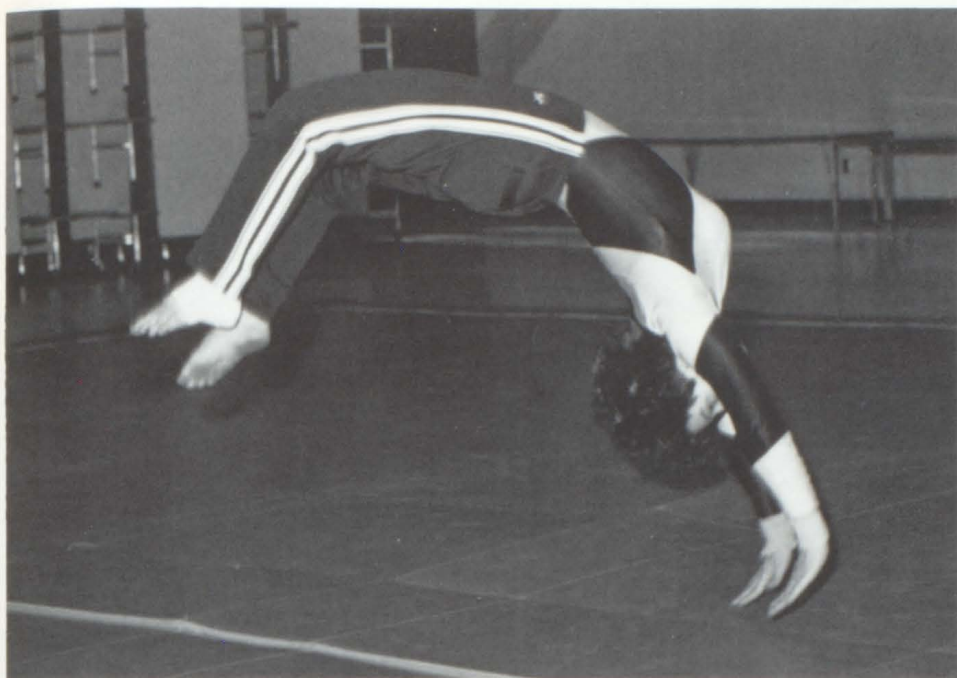

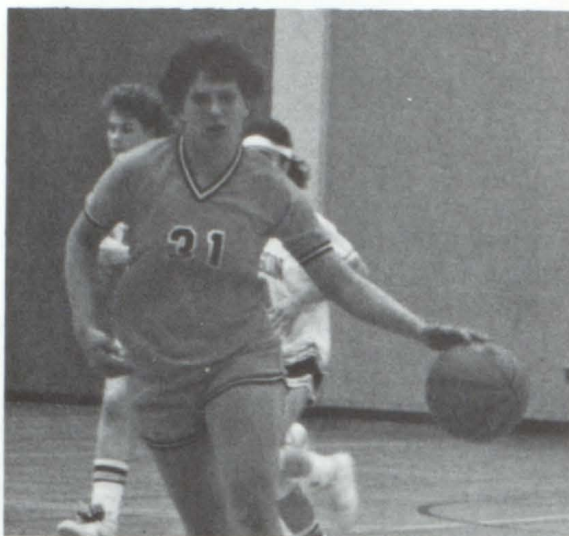

Coach Lucio was assisted by Mr. Don Luna.

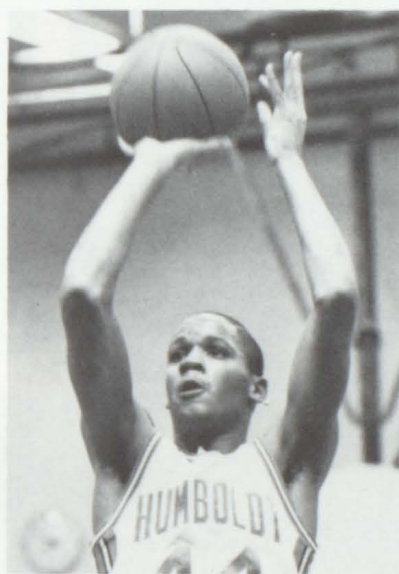
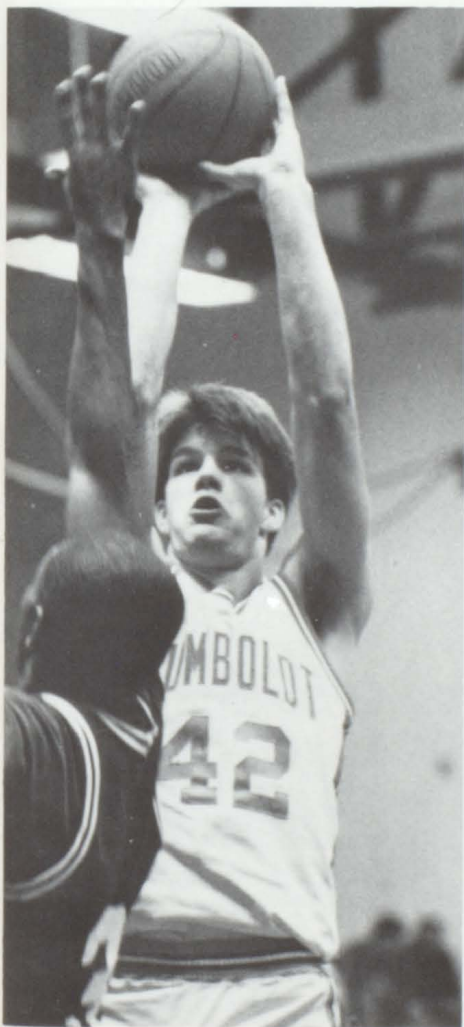

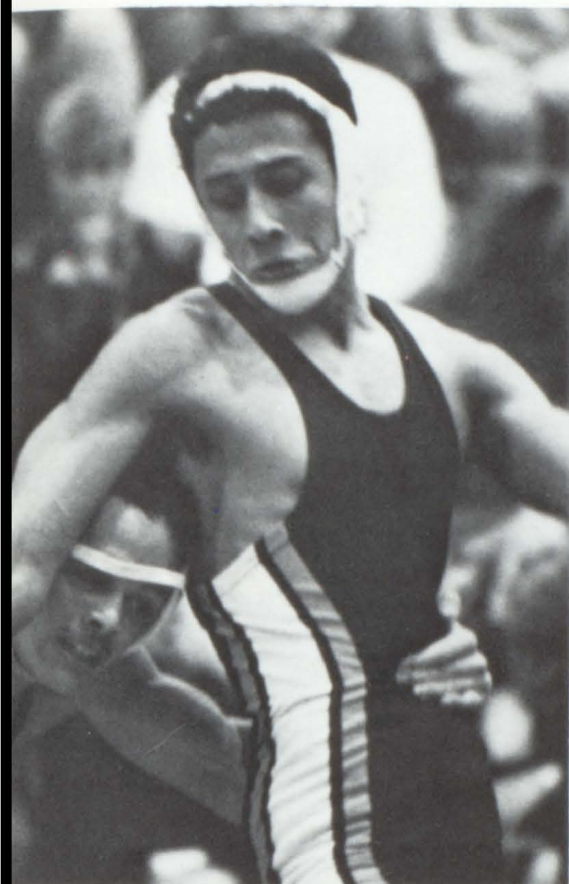

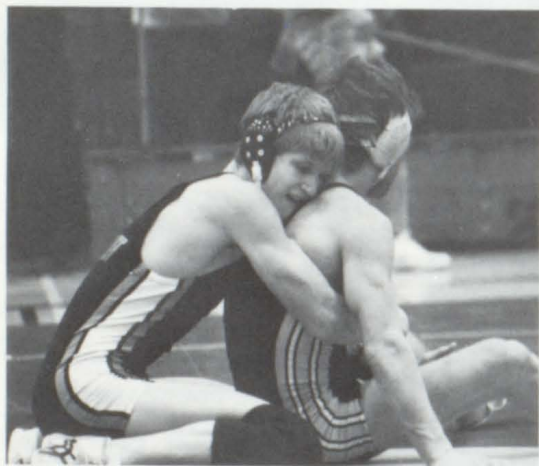
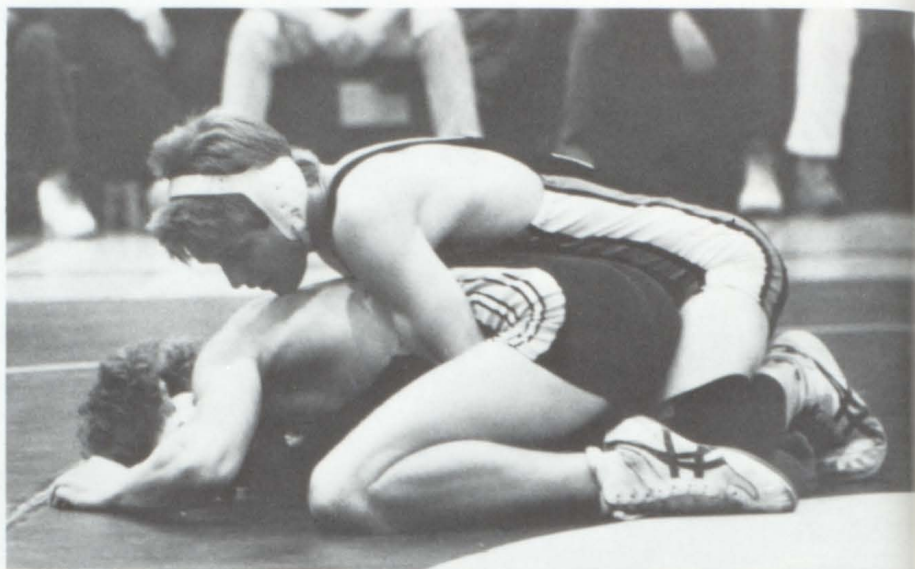
Three wrestlers finished in the top of their weight classes in region competition to qualify for the state tournament.

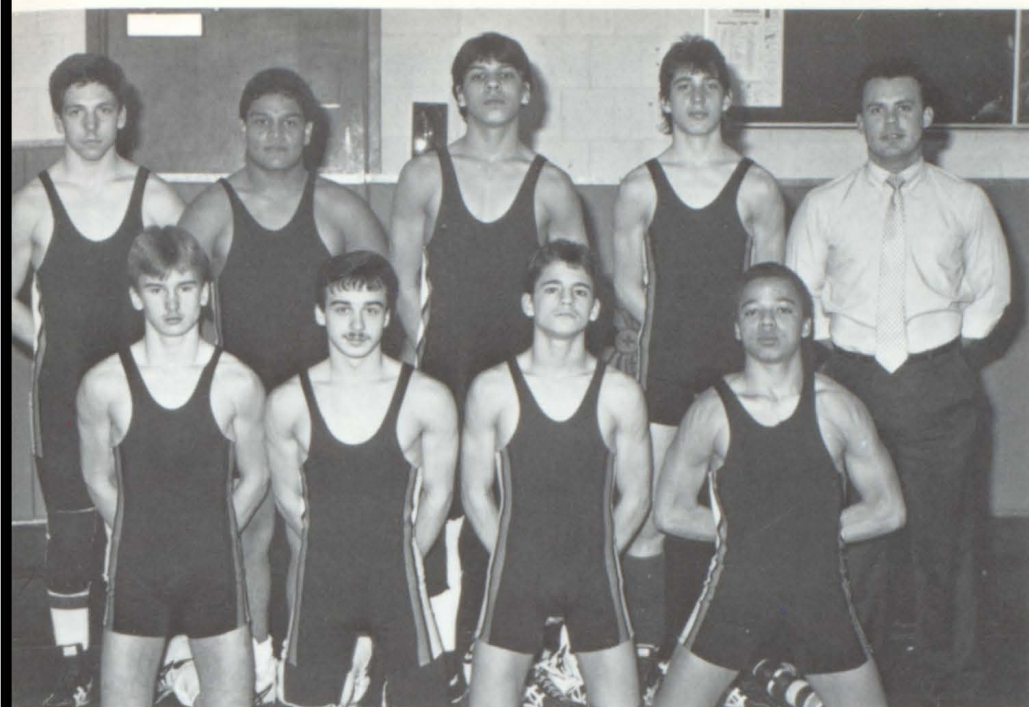

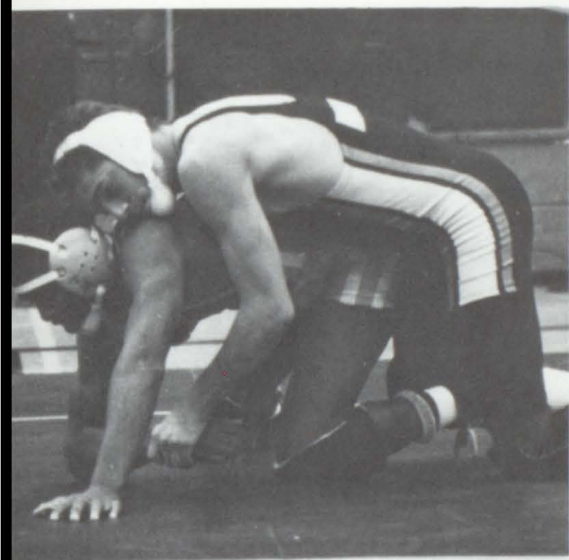

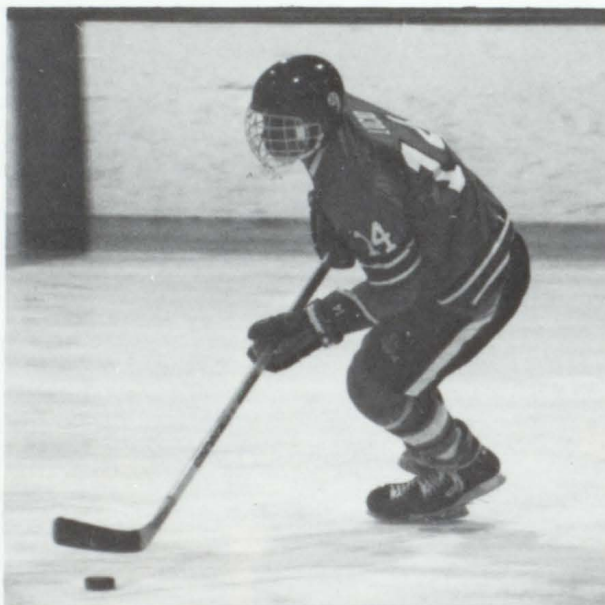

Sean Kealy and Scott Ksiazek kept the team in the game with their terrific goaltending.

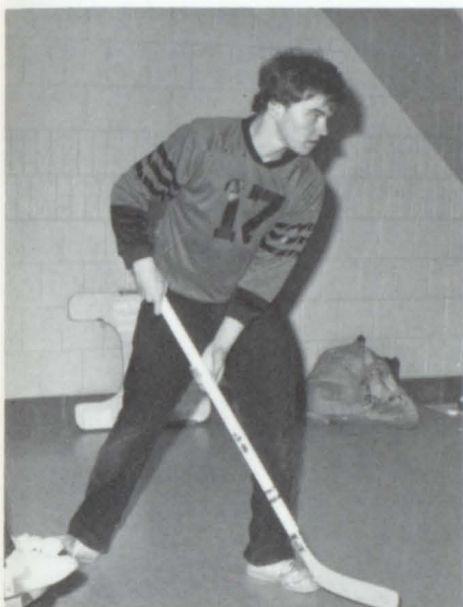
"This year the team has matured, they stayed together. Now they are as good as any other team, they are contenders," stated Assistant Coach William Swanson.

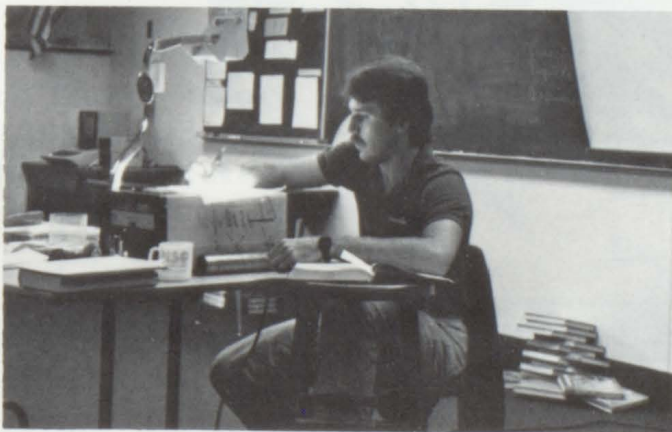
