Quarterback Ron Clevenger earns All-Time Humboldt Passing Award

The varsity football team went through the season without a victory. After getting that bit of bad news out of the way, make room for the good news. First there was Ron Clevenger. The 6-1, 180-pound All-City quarterback became the school's all-time leading passer, with 121 completions and 1600 yards to his credit during a threeyear varsity career. He had eight touchdown passes this season, with his favorite target being Tom Brennhofer who had five TDs. Brennhofer was also named as top receiver and defensive back. Others who helped make the season less dismal included Tim Albrecht, who was honored as top offensive lineman and MVP; Andy Austin, most dedicated; Steve Montantes and Jerry Zigan, top offensive backs; and Dave Theno, top defensive lineman.















A new coach, Ms. Jane Nichols, and three returning members, Mary Ambrose, Stephanie Wilson, and Nora Vanyo, were not enough to get the gymnastics team into the victory column this season. 






It was a long season for the hockey team: twenty regular season games and sixteen losses. Despite the record, veteran Coach Ralph McDonough was quick to praise his team - particularly the seniors. At the end of the conference season, an 11-2 loss to St. Thomas, he said, "I would like to give special thanks to all seniors for their fine leadership this season. When you lose as many games as we have, the team's morale drops. But the seniors kept everyone up. I attribute good morale to good seniors." The four seniors on the squad were Ron Clevenger, Dave Lofgren, Jeff Sailor, and Maurice Vasquez. Lofgren led Humboldt in scoring with 35 points, including five goals in an 8-6 loss to St. Agnes, and was named athlete of the week by the St. Paul Dispatch. Other leading scorers were Eddie Zepeda, a junior, with 29, Clevenger with 24, Victor Lucio, a sophomore, with 16, and Keith Nielsen a junior, with 15. The best game of the season was probably the 5-0 shutout of Como with sophomore Mark Osborne in the nets. The other league victory was a 9-2 pasting of Highland. Clevenger led the way with three goals, followed by Nielsen and Lucio with two each. The third victory was over South, 5-2 and there was a 5-5 tie with Central.



GIRLS' BASKET-BALL






In 1971, girls' basketball was added to the Humboldt athletic roster. Since that time, the varsity squad has never finished conference action with a winning season. Though the Indians didn't succeed in breaking that record this season either, the girls' did accomplish a 6-8 record, the best in the sport's history at Humboldt. Junior Jenine FourCloud led the squad in individual accomplishments, averaging 17 points per game, hitting a career high of 27 points against Johnson, and then going on to perform that feat again against city champion Hill-Murray. Other players having exceptional games included Angie Perez, who had 22 in the conference opener and 24 against Harding and senior captain Anne Nehring, who was named MVP and scored 15 points over Como Park to lead the Indians that night. She was also praised by Coach Bob Jackson for her dedication throughout the season.






JV MATMEN



Included among the special programs available at Humboldt are IGLD. TESL, Project Explore, and a health clinic. Those with intensive learning difficulties are served by the IGLD Program, with students coming from throughout the city to gain special individual attention and vocational guidance. With ten staff members, this program moved to Humboldt this year after formerly being housed at Harding. About seventy Southeast Asian students were served by the Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) Program. After learning English, students are placed in regular class programs which are monitored by a TESL teacher. A similar procedure is followed for Spanish-speaking students. Project Explore is designed to provide practical work experience for physically impaired students and for those with learning difficulties. An addition to third floor was the health clinic, which offered professional medical services beyond those normally taken care of by the school nurse. This facility was served by two fulltime practitioners and a number of part-time specialists.

The friends we made through the years Are, perhaps, the most important parts Of our past, present, and future lives. As we face this moment in life We will always remember:


Laughing together, crying together



Individual performers led the way for the track teams, as a lack of members caused both the boys' and girls' squads to be "under-powered" when it came to competing in City Conference dual meets. The result was 0-4 records for both teams. Robin Dilts and Susie Hughes led the way for the girls' team, particularly in dash events. Dilts usually did best at 200 meters, while Hughes had her best showings in the 100 and 200-meter events. Dilts and Hughes also teamed up with Chris Hofstede and Shannon Royce to form a 400-meter relay team which finished fifth in the conference meet. Vance Rolfzen was regarded as the outstanding member of the boys' team. For a second year in a row he was Humboldt's top runner at 100. 200, and 400 meters. He had a third place finish at 400 meters and a fourth place finish at 200 meters in the Conference Meet. Others singled out for their performances were shot-putters Scott Clark, Mike Cruz, Bill Lee, and Greg Sabin. They earned a sixth place showing at the City Relays. The best Humboldt could do as a team was 35 points against St. Thomas. Opponents with twice the squad members averaged 100 team points against the Indians. According to veteran Coach Jerry Lundeen, these overwhelming totals were of little importance when compared with the dedication and effort put forth on an individual basis by members of both squads.








Coach Ryan's 'impossible dream' becomes a reality

Wrestlers march to State Tournament

A capacity crowd in Humboldt's gym on February 27, 1982, witnessed sports history. The Indians slammed Como, 24-19, to become the first mat team in the history of the school to advance to the State Tournament. Humboldt had lost to the Cougars, 24-19 for the City Conference championship but regained the confidence needed to take the Region 3AA title. After Humboldt gained the title of region champs, there was pride evident all over the school, and that carried on to the St. Paul Civic Center as school shut down to allow everyone to support the team. The Indians lost in the first round to Anoka, 33-13. This placed the team in the consolation bracket, and Humboldt lost to Shakoppe, 31-21. In individual competition, Tom Brennhofer, wrestling at 132 pounds, pushed his season mark to 28-2-1 by winning four of five matches. Brennhofer took home a third place medal. Greg Brennhofer, at 105 pounds, also qualified for the individual tourney and finished the year with a 20-8-1 record after losing in the first round. The season was an obvious highlight in the thirty-year teaching and coaching career of Mr. Bob Ryan, who started the school's wrestling program in 1961.







26 seniors inducted into Honor Society




