


















Faculty: Acceptance sought



WILLIAM SAGERT Principal

The Board of Education waited until summer to announce appointment of Mr. William Sagert as new principal to replace Mr. Arley Ludwig, who retired at the end of last year after having served as HHS principal since 1968.

A thirty-year veteran of public school education, Mr. Sagert assumed his new role following six years as principal at Central - an assignment which had him supervising a large building which was in the midst of major rehabilitation.

Mr. Sagert came to the West Side with an attitude of one who hoped to be accepted by this school community and as one who would do all he could to be worthy of this acceptance. He became known as a quiet leader, except when he led the PRIDE cheer at a football pepfest.

He believed in being visible to all in the building and went to work on such objectives as trying to improve student attendance records, build a true sense of school spirit, and help provide a "proper" educational climate for all students.

This was quite a challenge in a year marked by more declines in enrollment, more teacher cut-backs, and fewer budget








When thinking in terms of a win-loss record, the 1980-81 football season was not a prosperous one, but determination, might, and team spirit made the season worthwhile.


All City honors went to Casillas and Rosario, with Casillas also earning Honorable Mention for the All Metro team.





Despite a season which resulted in a losing team record, the coach was proud of the positive attitudes which made his work much easier.







Leading the team in scoring were juniors Tom Deutsch and Dave Johanson.



Due to lack of participation, it was a very tough season. With an eight-member team, the girls were two short of a complete squad.


With Humboldt's best record, 6-1 in conference play, the first doubles team of Debbie Alverson and Dawn Saros took third place in the conference tournament.

Other contributors to the team's point totals included Sue Jorgensen, Lori Mailer, and Laurie Michalec.


Vandenberg closed out a six-year gymnastics career, including three letter-winning years at Humboldt.











At state, Brennhofer lost in quarter-final action, 17-3, to the wrestler who took the state championship. Tonn lost in the first round, 8-4.


Brennhofer, Scheuer, and Tonn were named to the All City team.



In the city tourney, second place finishers were Dan Becker, John Foster, and Gary Walker.







