### Arena scheduling salvaged

It was the final school year of the seventies and the second year of the "great merger." Mr. Arley Ludwig, principal, dealt with talk of fewer dollars and students, and teacher cutbacks were part of every-day conversation. A bit of "Is it me?" hit almost every staff member with less than twenty years of service in St. Paul.

There was a threat to do away with arena scheduling and turn everything over to the almighty computer, but a fall survey among students had 98 percent saying, "We like arena scheduling. " (There was less than 98 percent support among teachers.)

Scheduling rested primarily with Mr. John Ettlinger, assistant principal, while both Mr. Ettlinger and Mr. Lou Cotroneo, administrative assistant, continued their own system of scheduling wayward students for 7 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. detention programs.





Officially, eight new teachers joined the staff in September, with four being substitutes for people who were away from teaching for the first trimester.

Mr. Ruben Soruco left to work on an inter-cultural program, and Mr. Fred Kober transferred to Highland Junior High.

Ms. Sandy Smith resigned in August as chief clerk to become a real estate agent. Her place was filled by Ms. Adele Dewall until close to the end of the first trimester when Ms. Valerie Weiss came to Humboldt from the school district's main offices at 360 Colborne.





### shocks downtown St. Paul





Fund-raisers included the sale of three cases of candy and boxes of holiday note cards. The Indianettes' adviser was Ms. Margaret LaVigne.






From the beginning, staff members faced "yesterday" due dates and deadlines that would creep up overnight. Many wondered what they had gotten themselves into.








Humboldt came close several times but lost: to Johnson, 22-14; to Highland Park, 24-18; and to Washington, 14-6.



























Two wins and a tie gave the girls' golf team a 2-4-1 record in conference action, while the boys' team went down to defeat in all nine of its matches.



With a small team, first-year coach Ms. Chris Andrews was able to give the girls more individual attention. This showed as they defeated teams many times their size.


