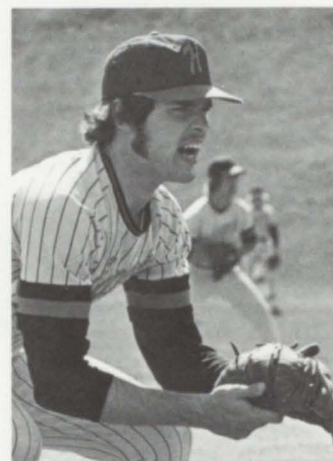
A-Squad 12-6

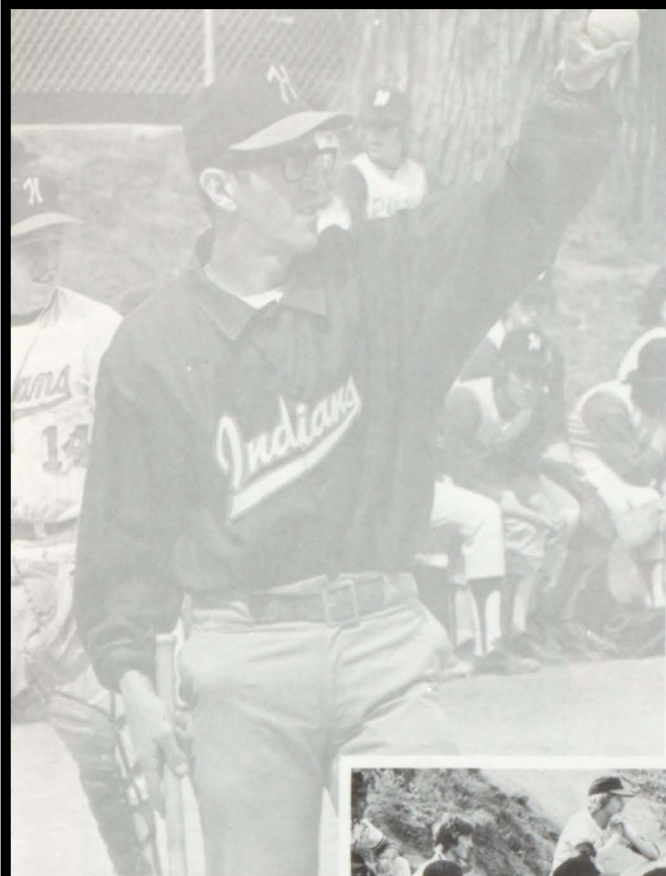

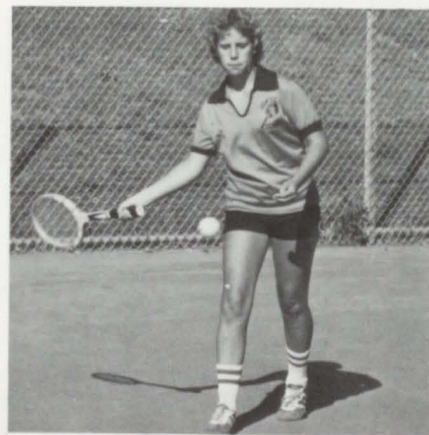
TENNIS TURN OUT SHOWS IMPROVEMENT

Coach Hennig is looking forward to next fall's season when Humboldt and Monroe combine High Schools.



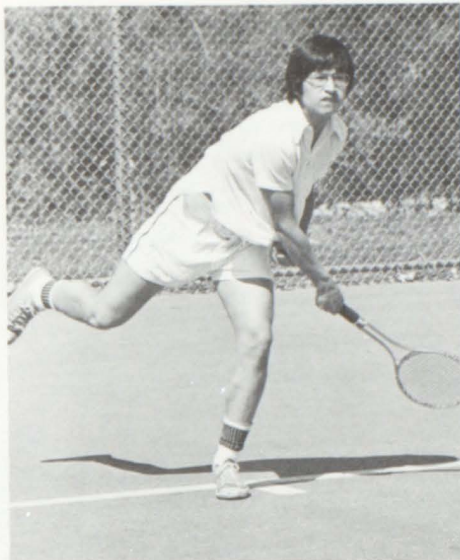

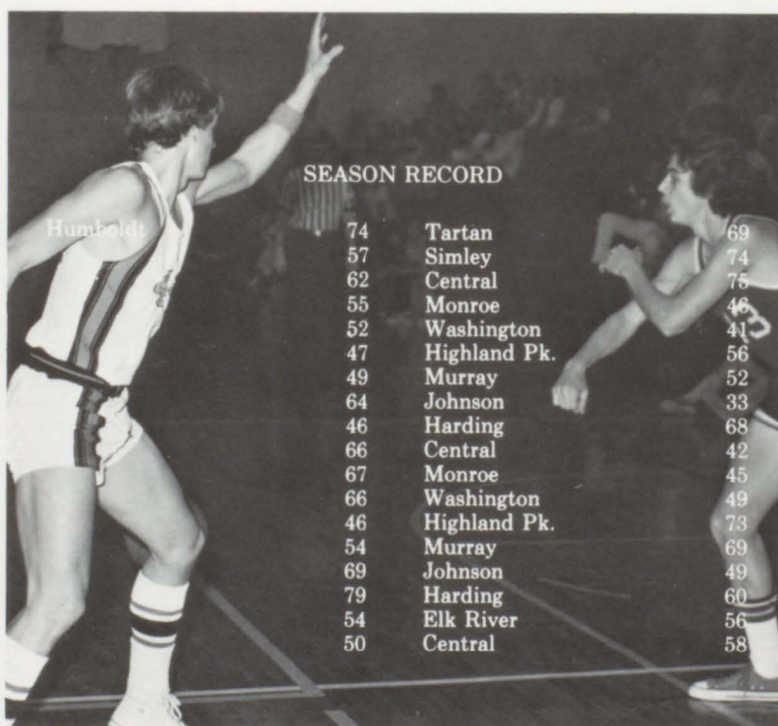

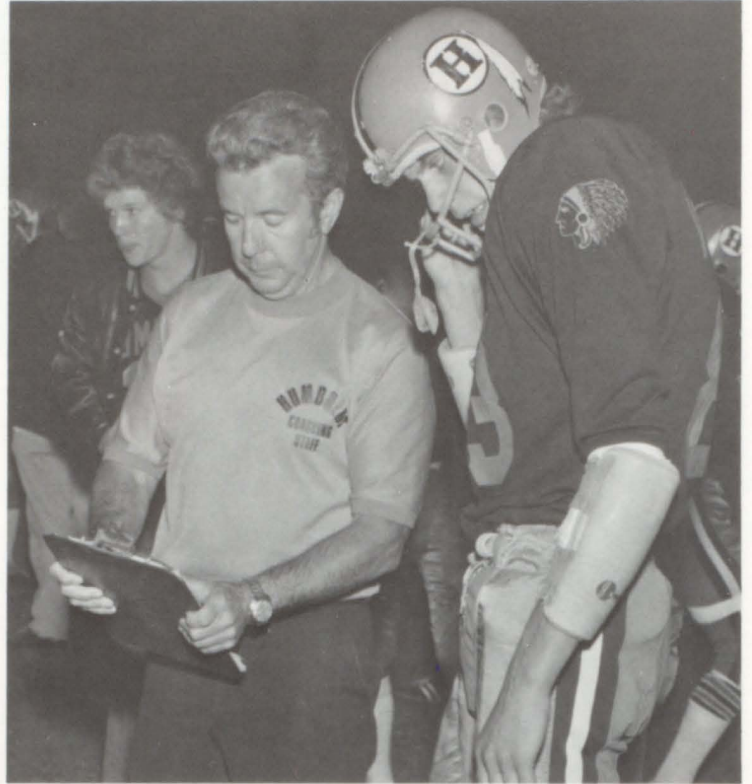

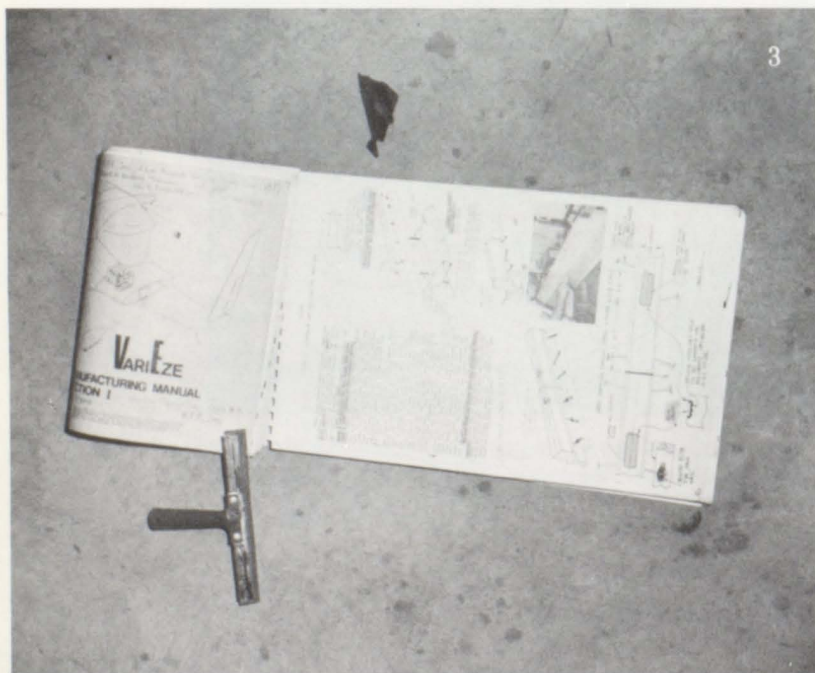

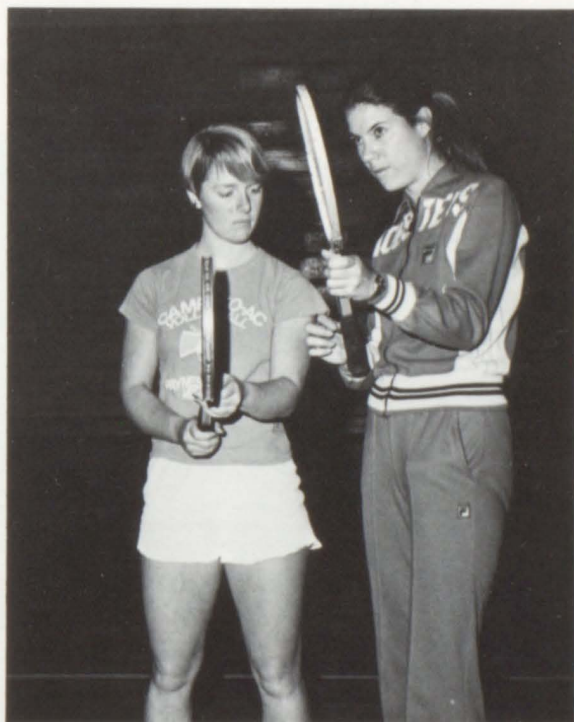

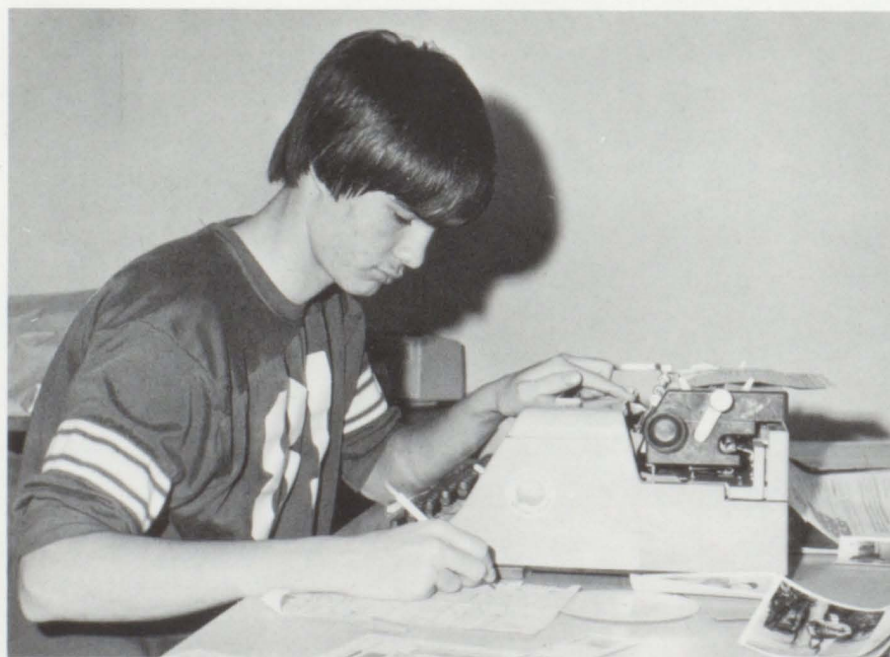

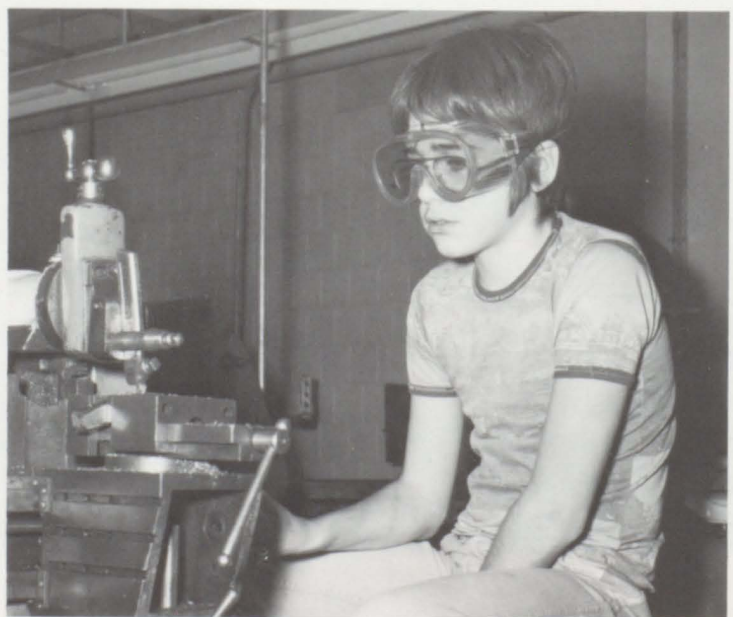
THE CLASS ROOMS —

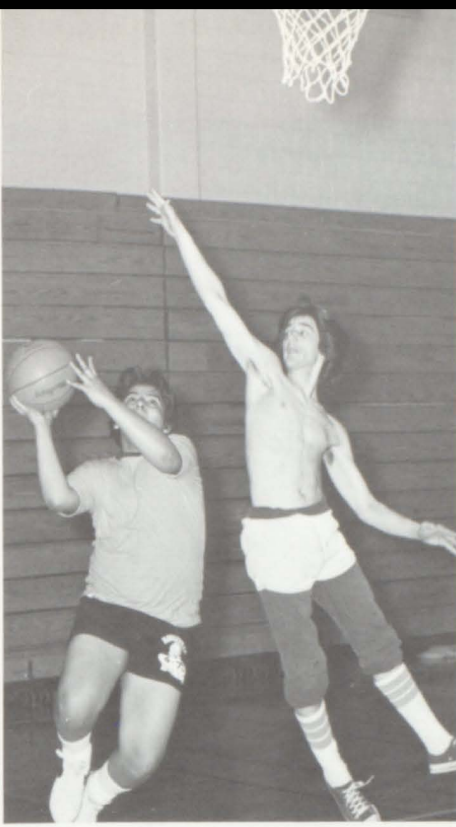

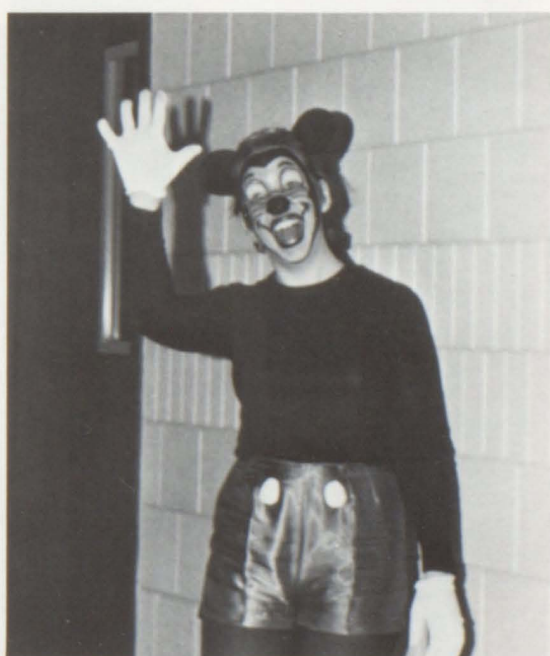
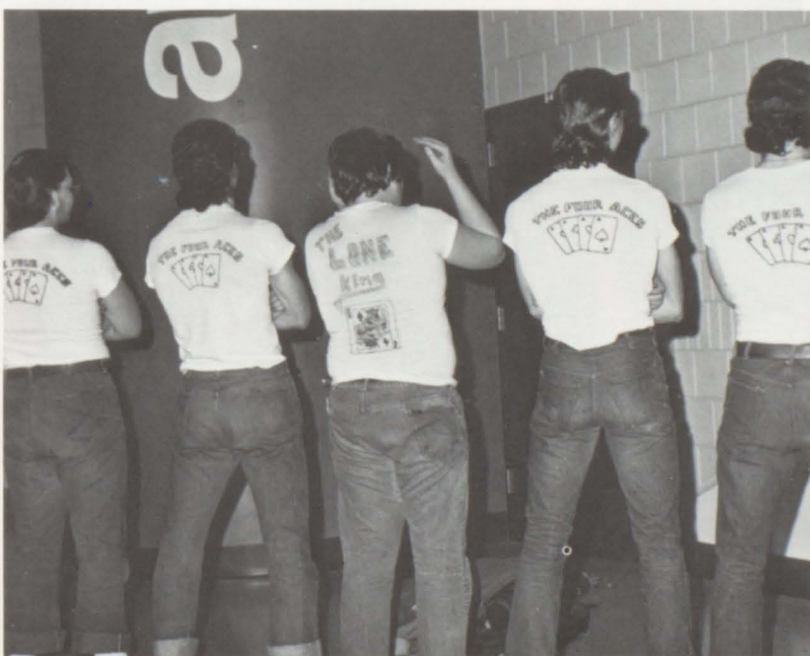
ENDS WITH GREAT SUCCESS
