Sponsoring Sno Days Week, Homecoming activities, the sale of fruit and T shirts, running the book store, were the type of activities in which the student council was involved this year.

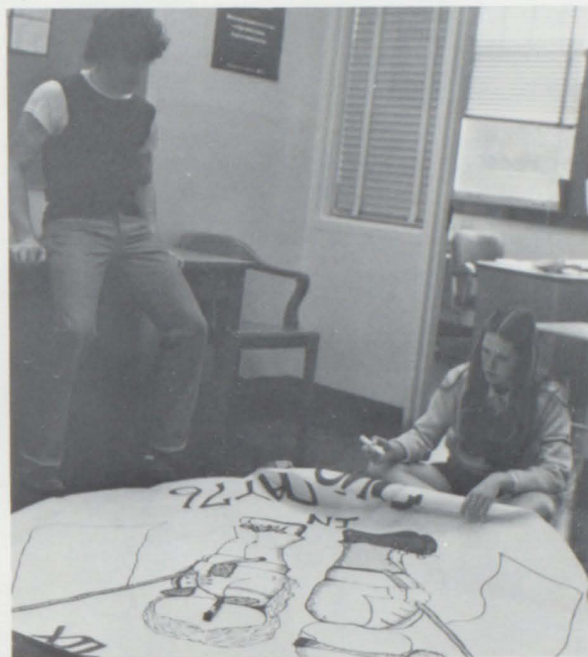
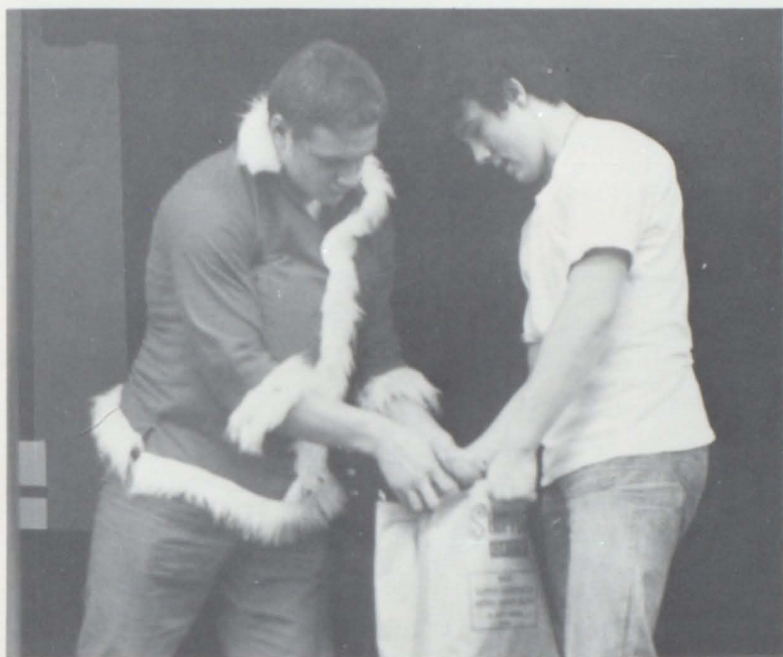
Leading the list of projects was the

Forty-five students in the OJT and work experience classes improved their education and got paid for it. They are, according to Mr. Clausen, on-the-job training coordinator, "Turning themselves into a marketable product in the sense that they can learn something that will allow them to sell themselves to employers." Students attend three classes in the morning and work in the afternoon at such jobs as hairdresser, security agent, draftsmen, or work with teachers in the building as teacher aides.

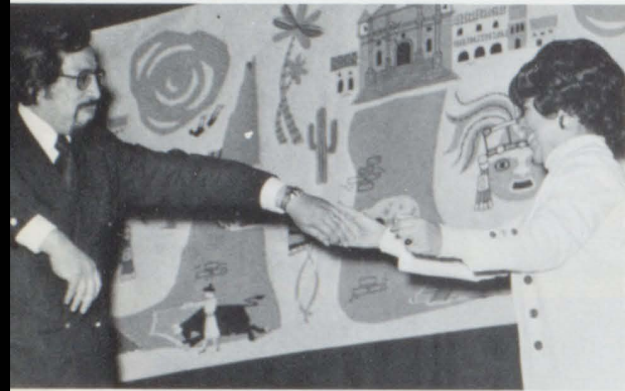


First Spanish Banquet Raises \$264

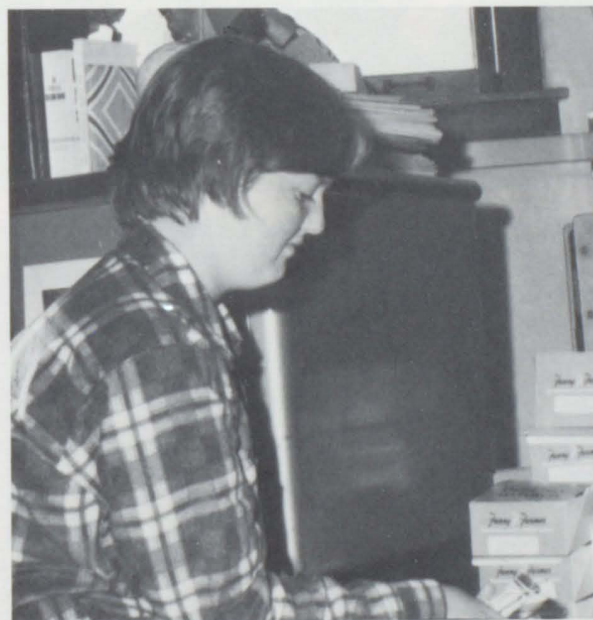

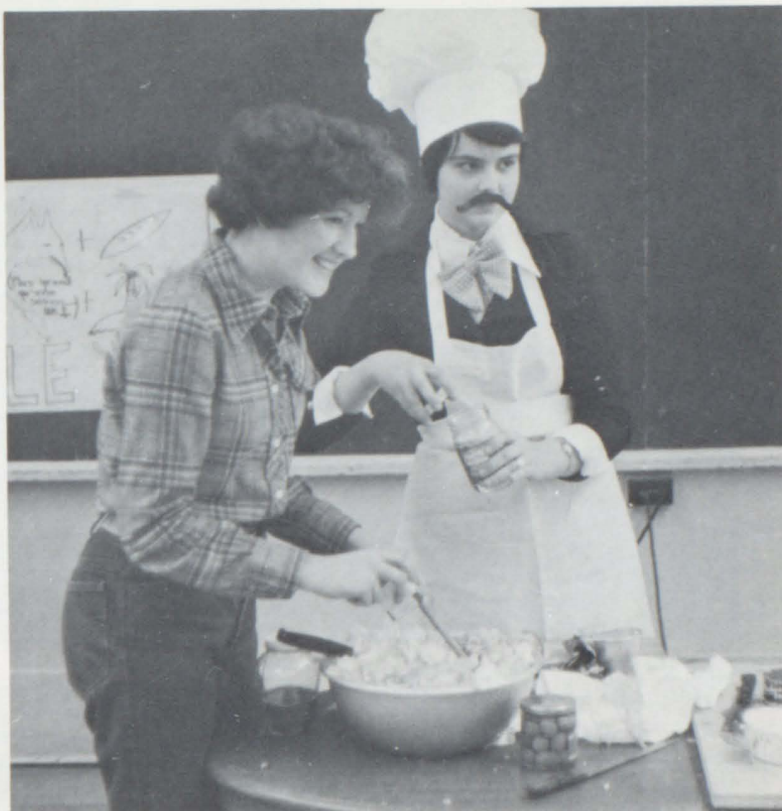

Despite the problems, the girls agreed the satisfactions far outweighed the difficulties.



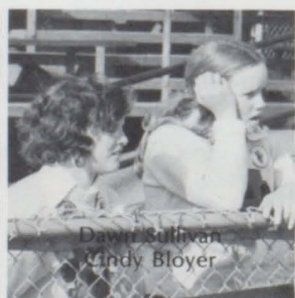

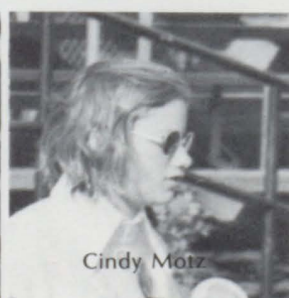

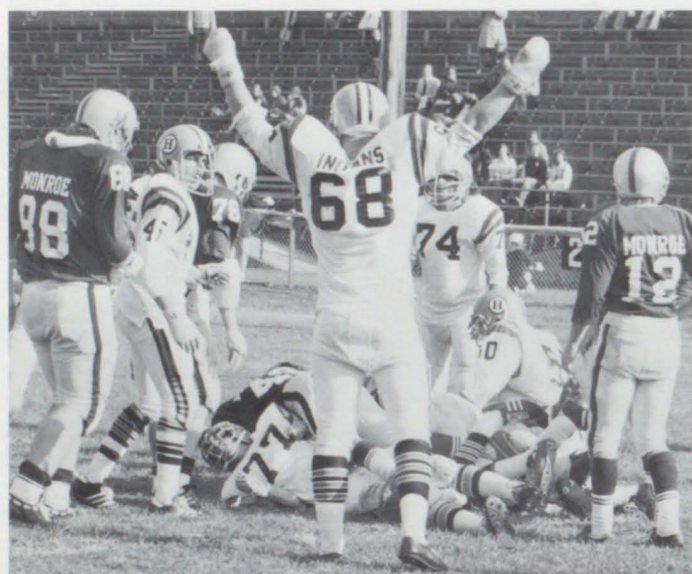

High scorer and leading rebounder was sophomore Tim Brengman.



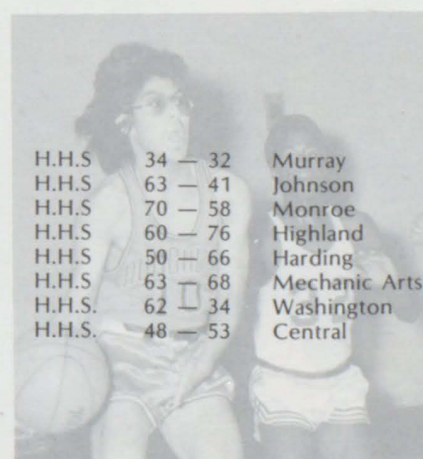

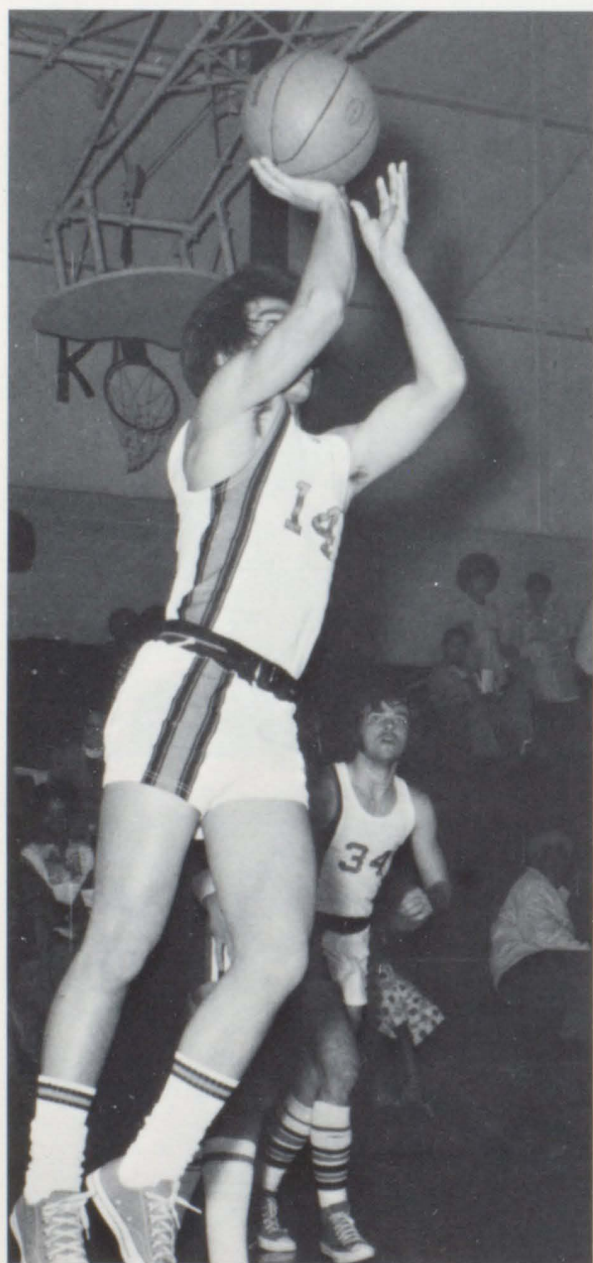

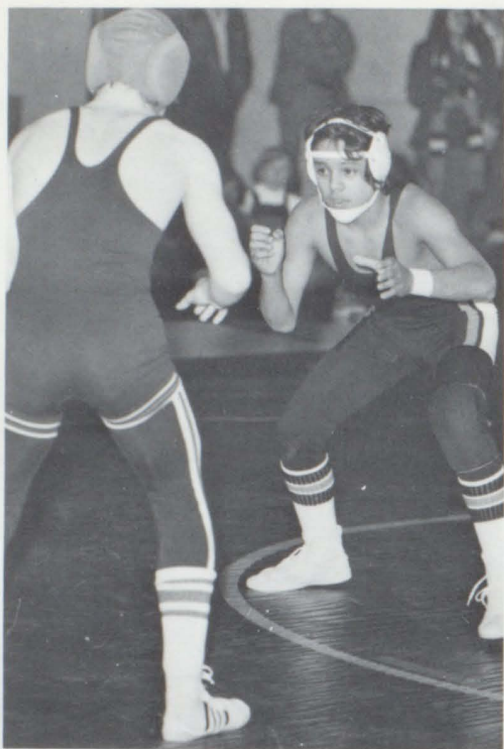

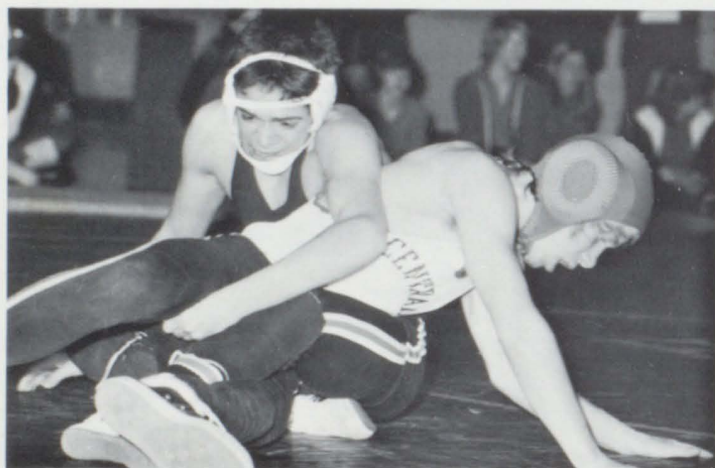


B Team Has 8-0 Record

Coach Ryan states, "These wrestlers, plus some outstanding wrestlers on the junior high team promise to keep Humboldt near the top in years to come."



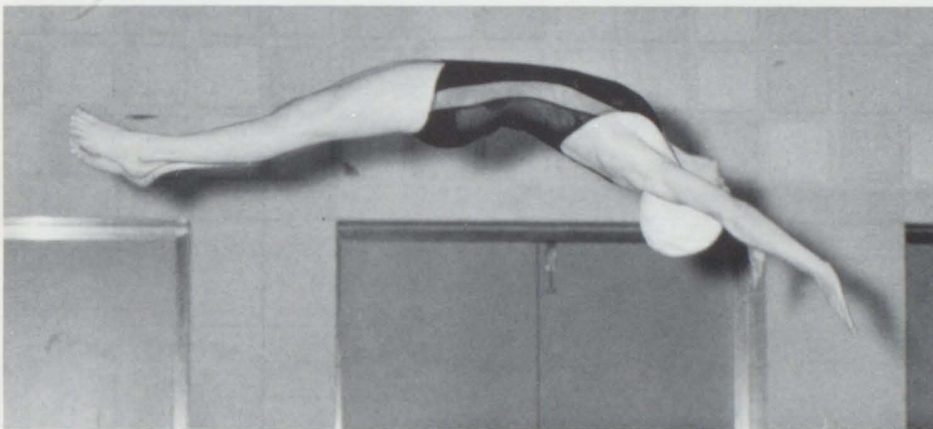

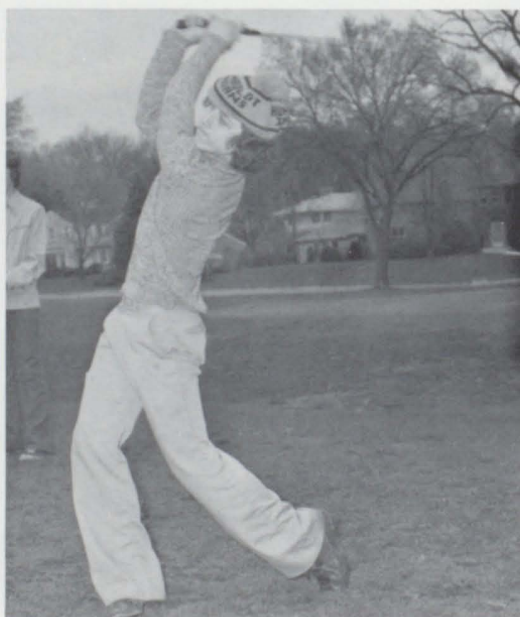
Tennis Has 1-7 Season

Ending a 1-7 tennis season optimistically may seem strange. But Coach Hennig feels that the experience his players gained will be invaluable in the '76 season.

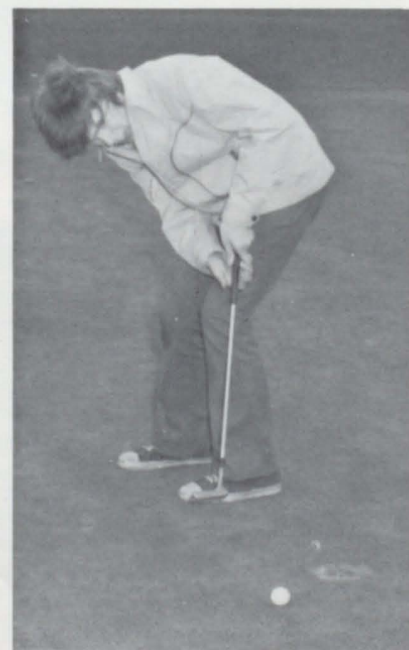

Humboldt Completes 1975

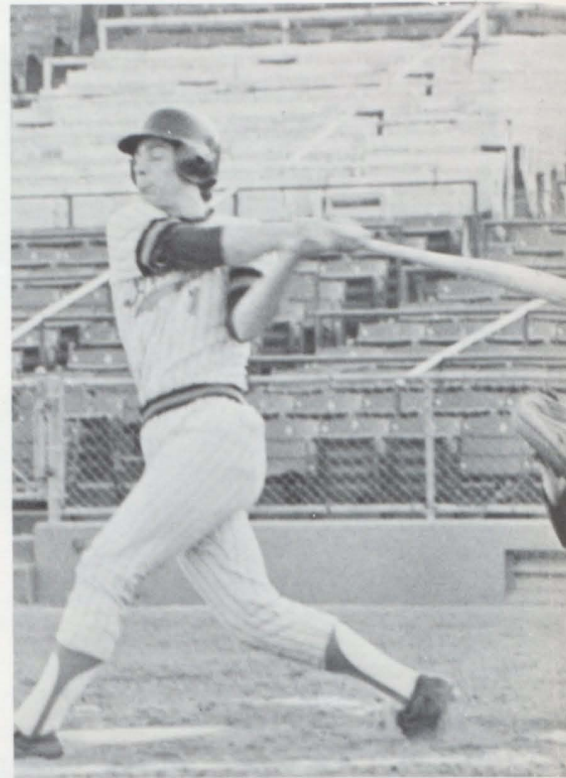

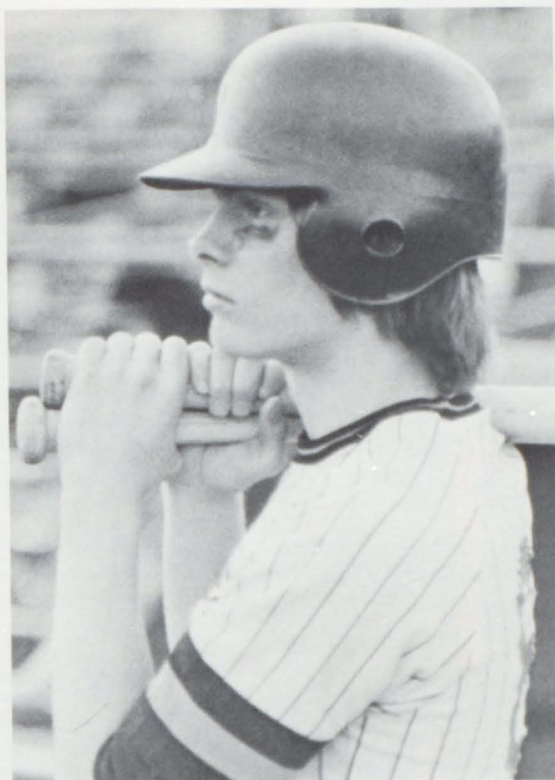

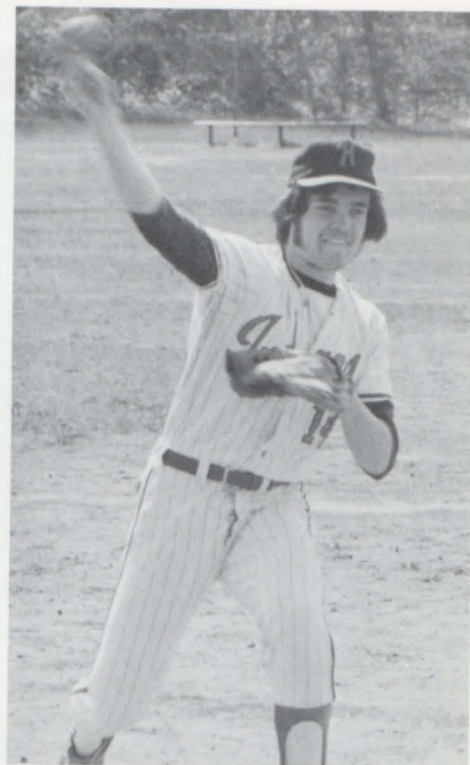

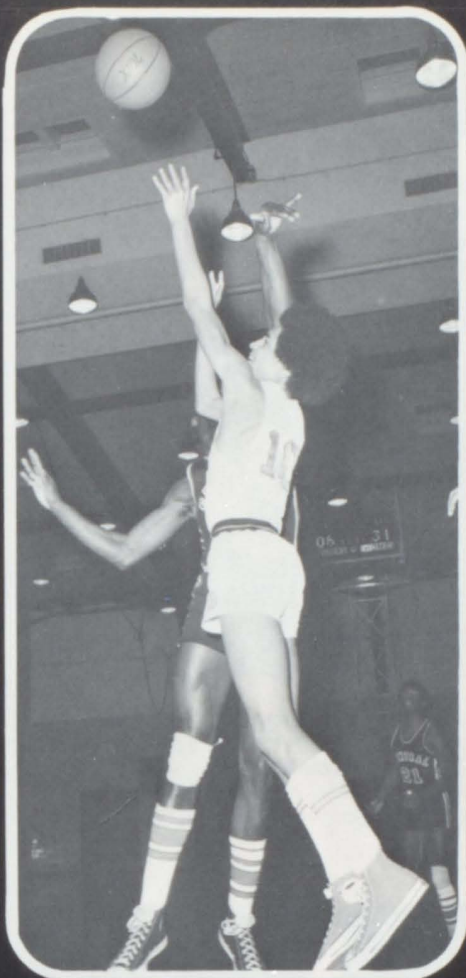
Team's Record Deceptive

Completion of the 1200-student facility is expected by January 1977.

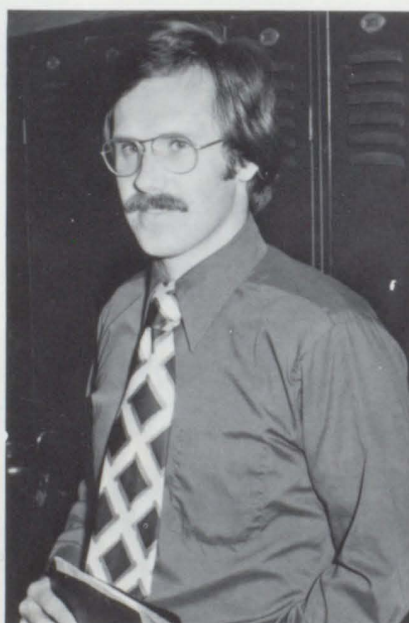

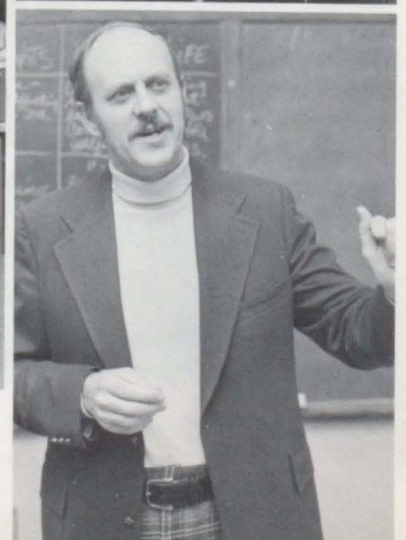

Members of the A and B wrestling squads worked out with the junior high team.



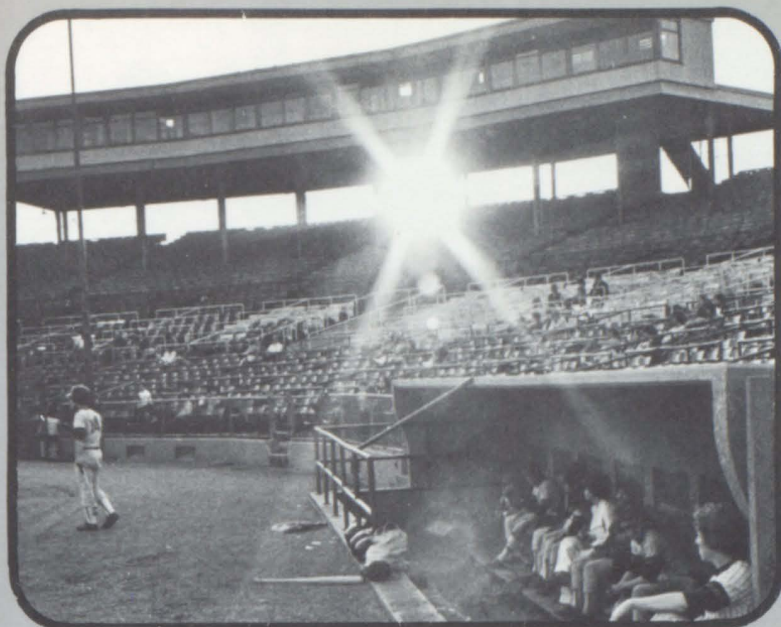
