Mrs. Doris Barron, librarian and friend to many a Humboldt student, will not return next year. She has decided to retire. We will miss her.

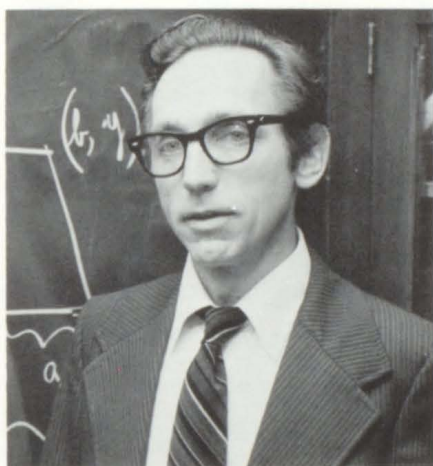

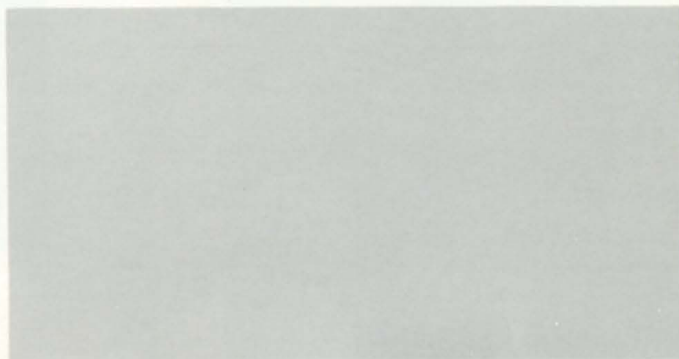
CHILDHOOD FANTASY

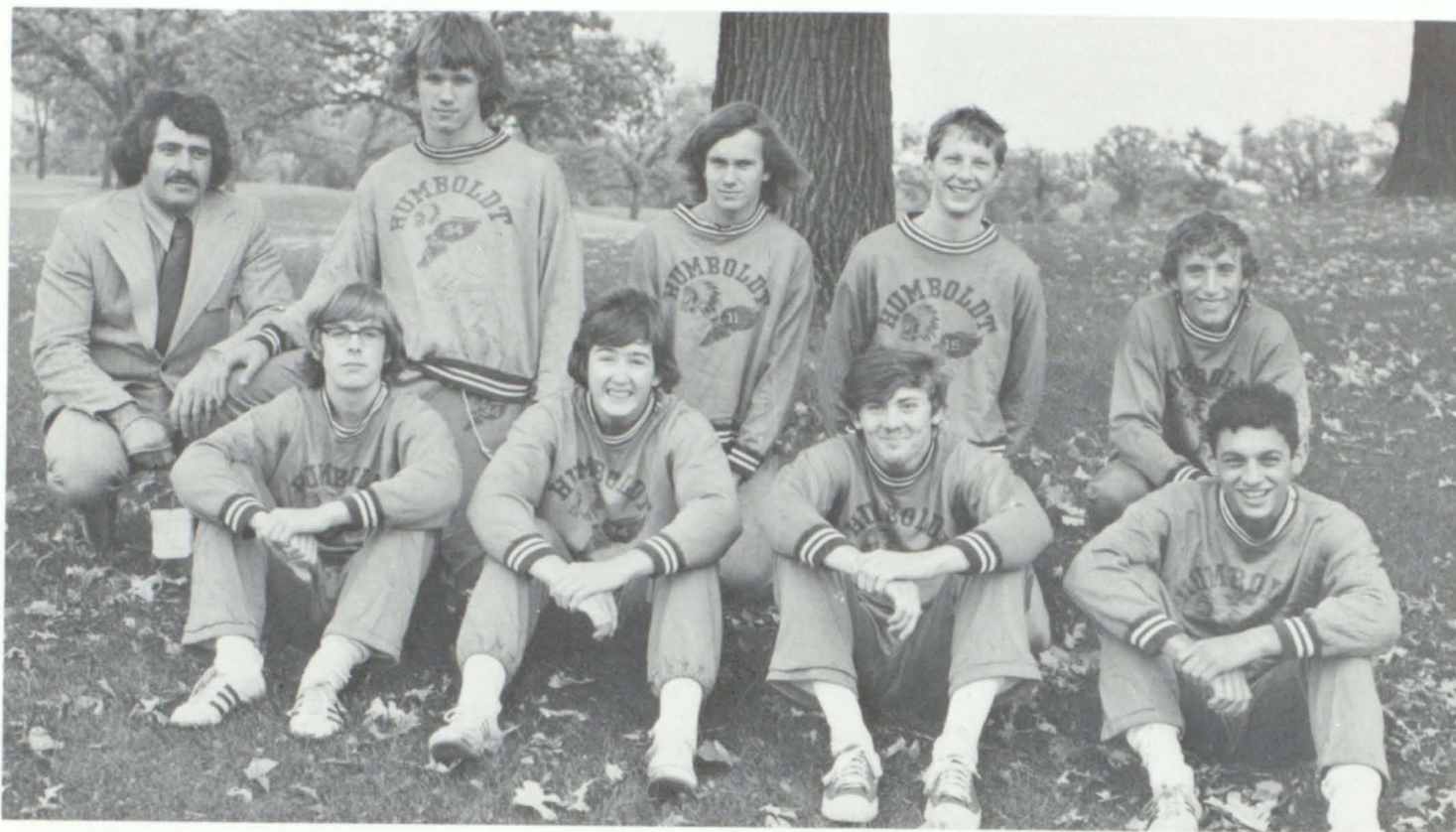
INDIANS BOMB MURRAY FOR A 5-3 FINISH

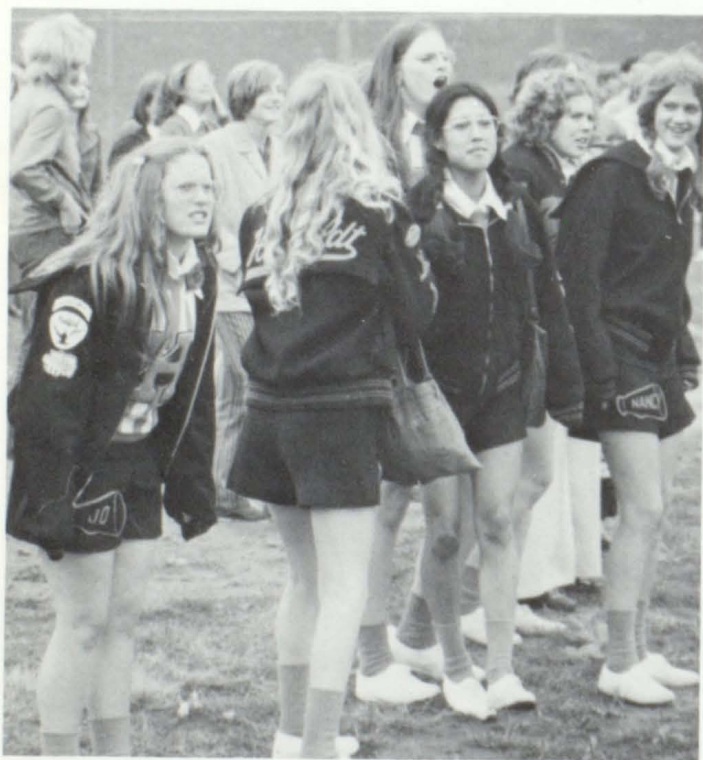

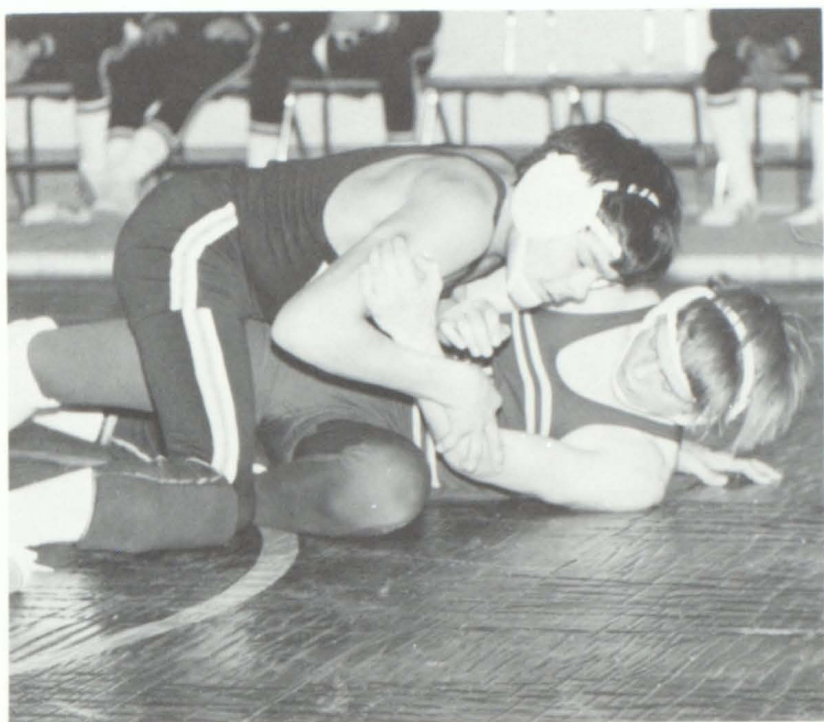

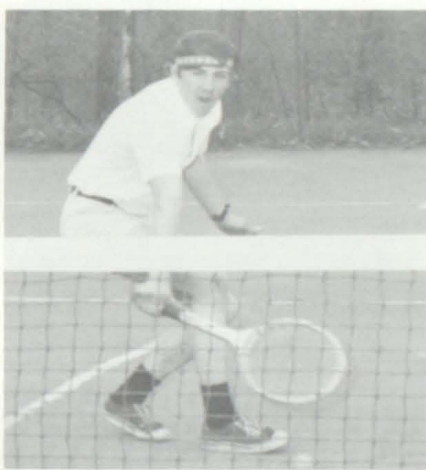

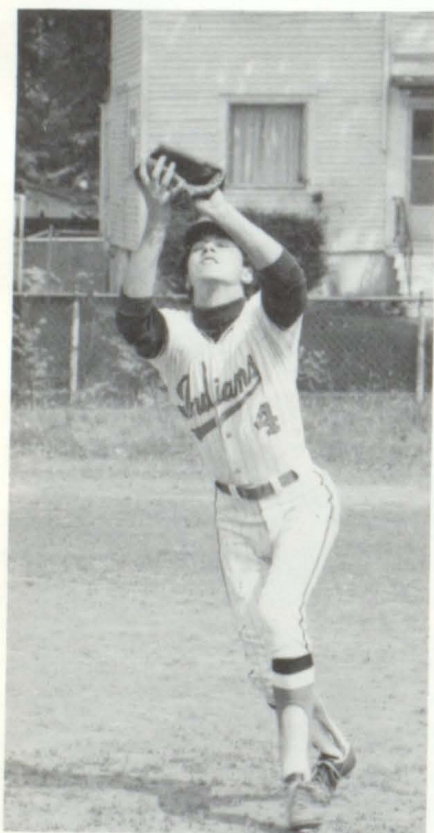
