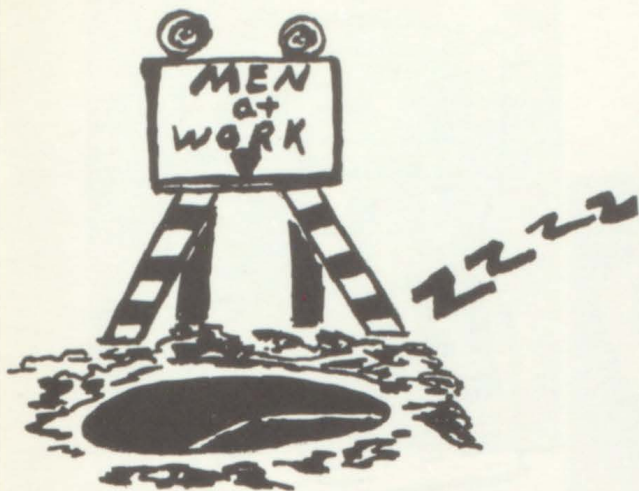
Past 'N Present

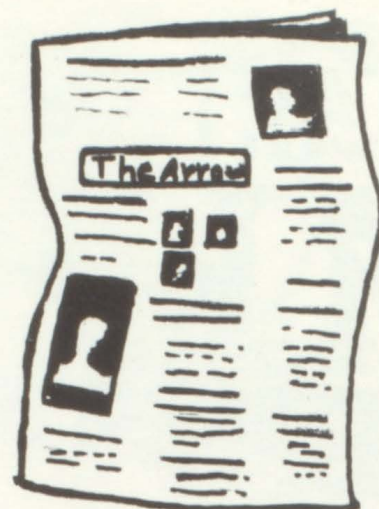
Work 'N Pay

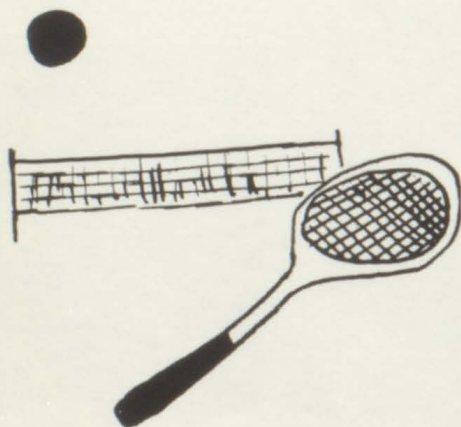
Golf
