To the athletics, for the sportsmanship that was encouraged;

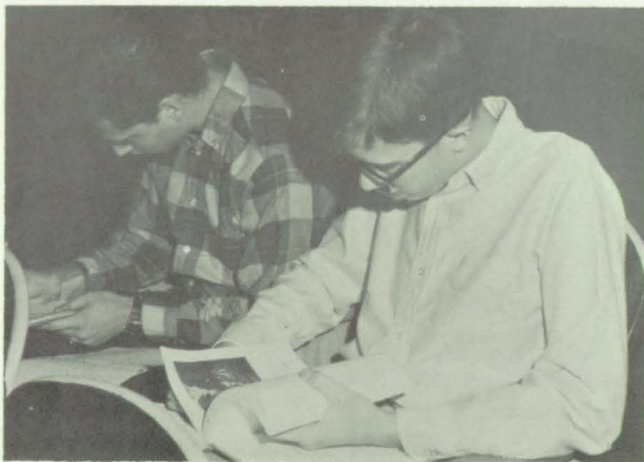
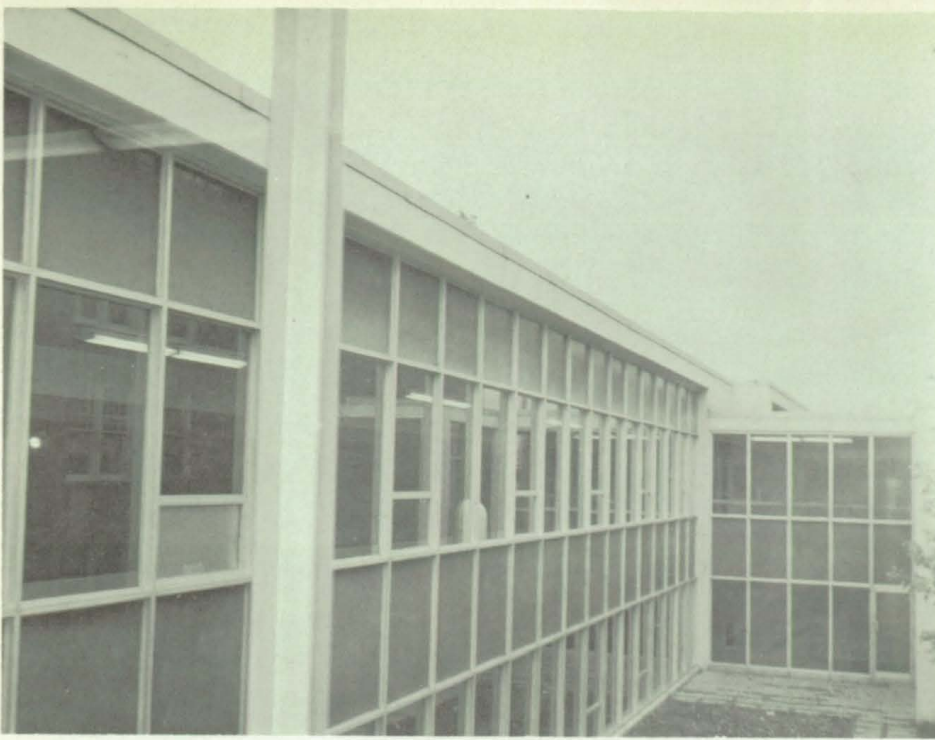
But most of all, this annual is dedicated to the small period of time which makes up our life at Humboldt.

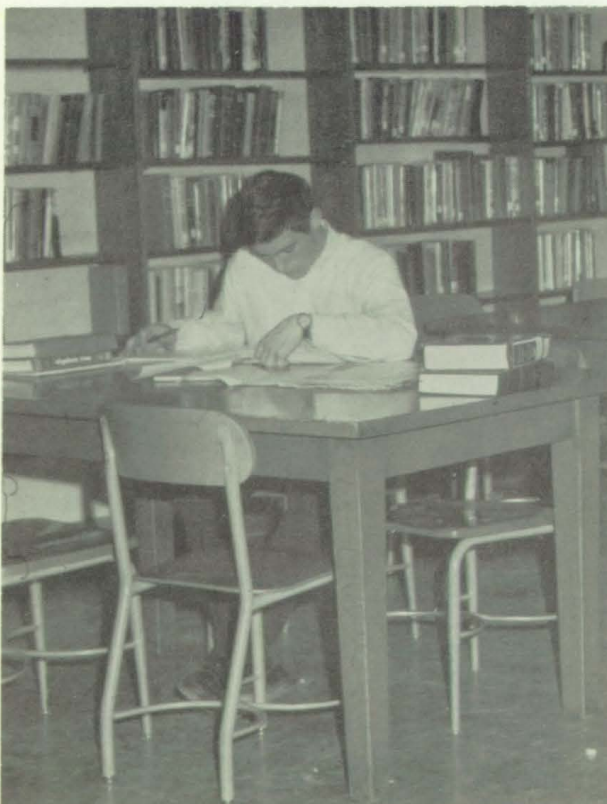

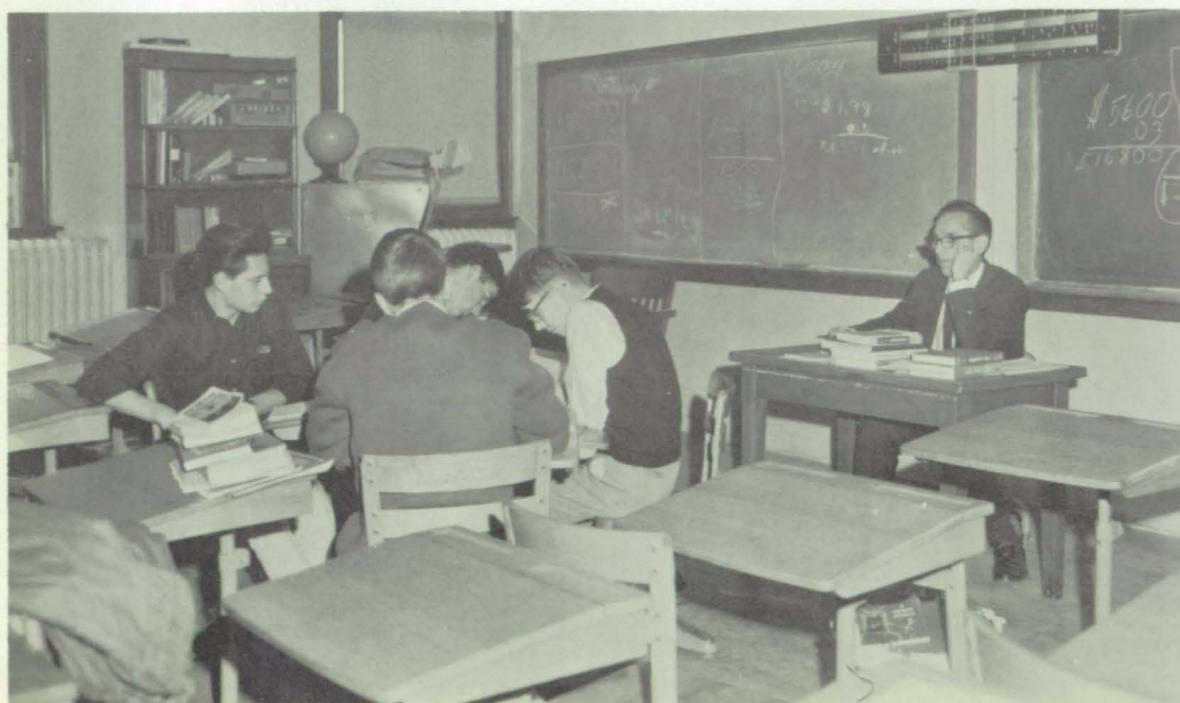

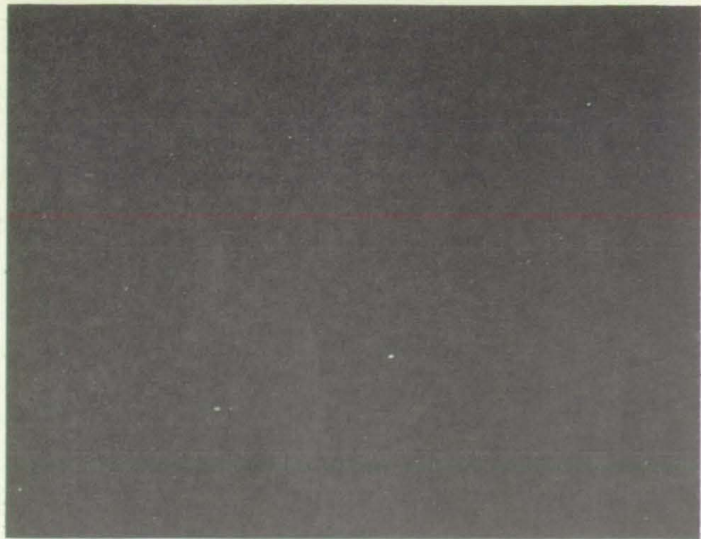

Mr. Arley Ludwig, Assistant Principal, aids Mr. Ingebretson in the administration of Humboldt.

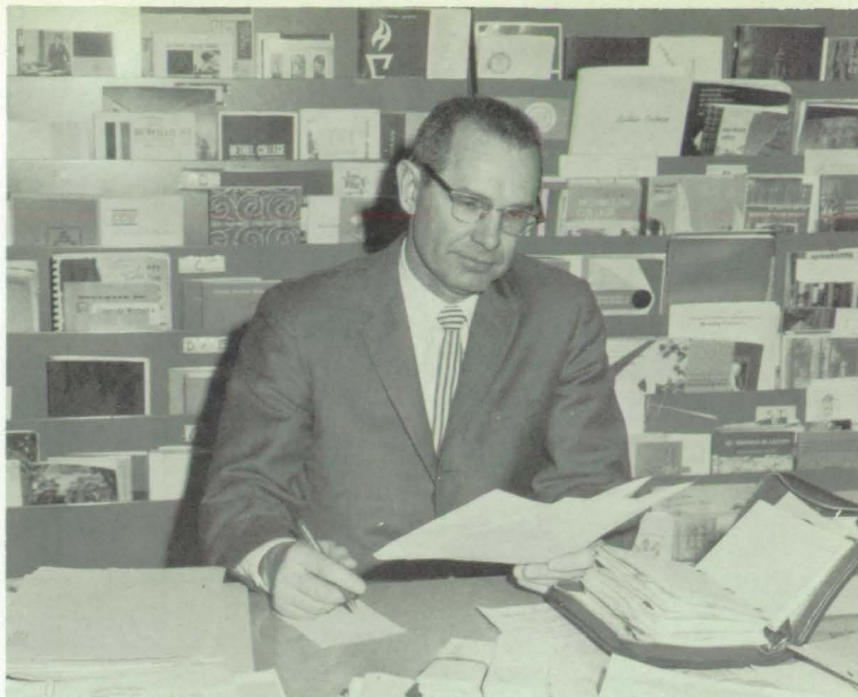


## COUNSELORS

Mrs. Norma Erickson and Mrs. Ellen Walton are our office help. Their duties include the many office tasks involved in the daily routine of our high school.





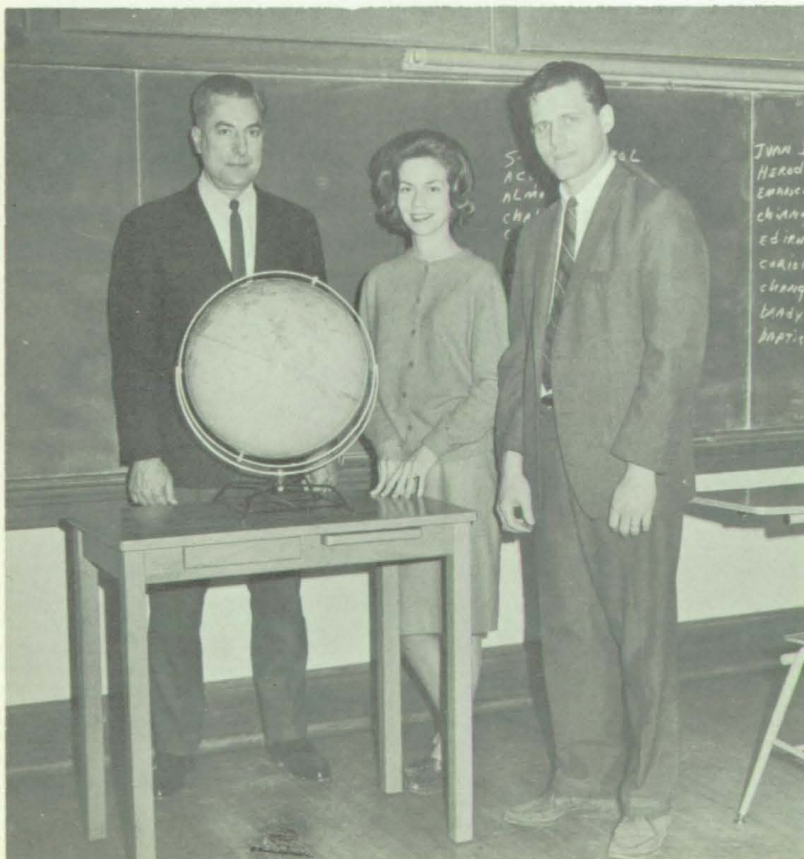


Our nurse, Mrs. Mary Pederson, R.N., is at Humboldt every day except Tuesday to look after all ailing students.

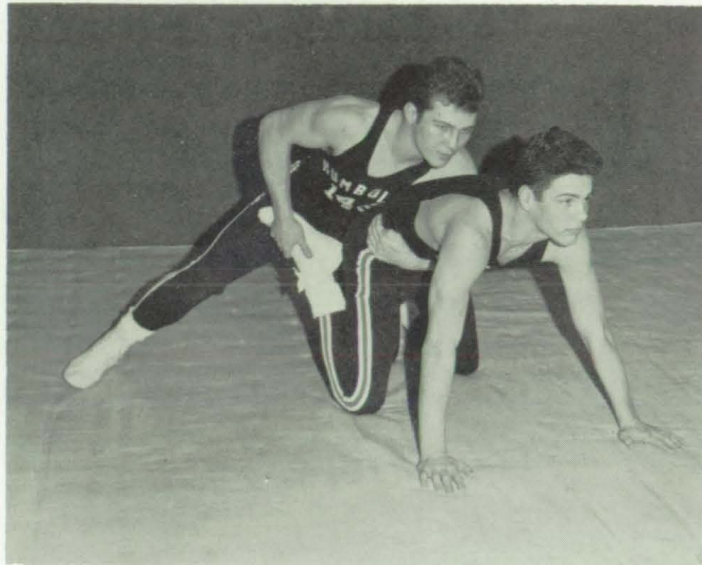
