The returning outfielders and infielders provided the foundation for four wins out of the eight conference games, but loss of experienced pitchers hurt the team.



Chet also batted .476, Humboldt's highest average. He and eleven lettermen return with high hopes for spring-1965.






GYMNASTICS


MAJORETTES






