But, if memory serves, she was having a ball.

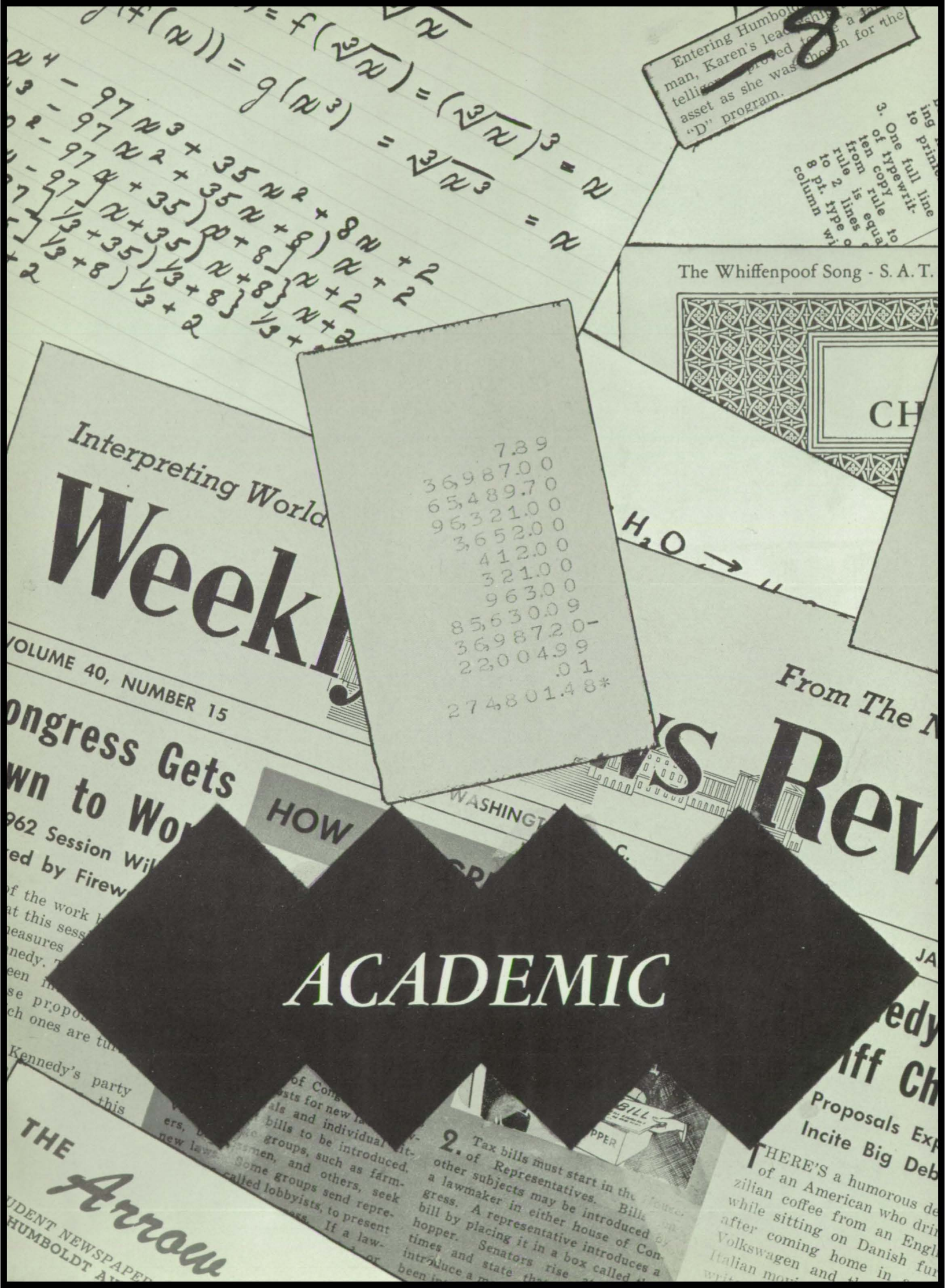
Faintly I heard, above her quick chatter

This is the first part of a four year accelerated program for the superior science and mathematics student.

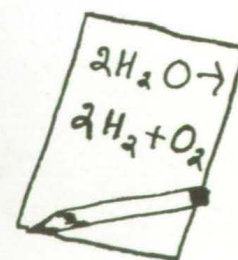
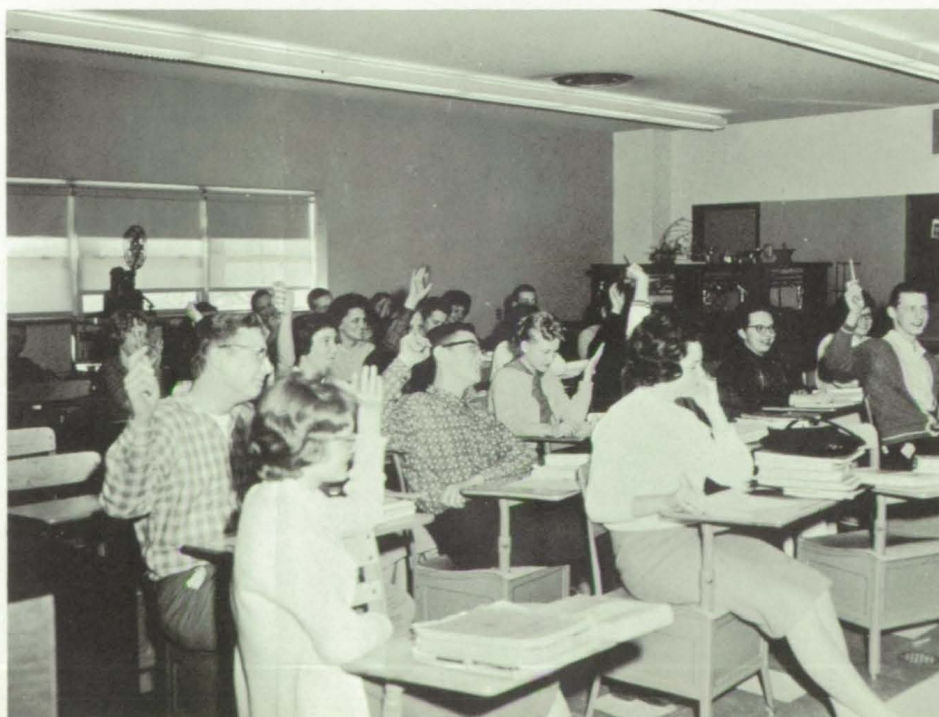
They study a more advanced course in algebra and biology.

By now they are studying the difficult subjects of physics and higher algebra.

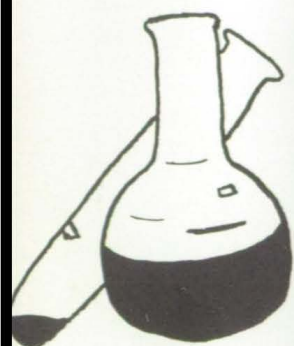

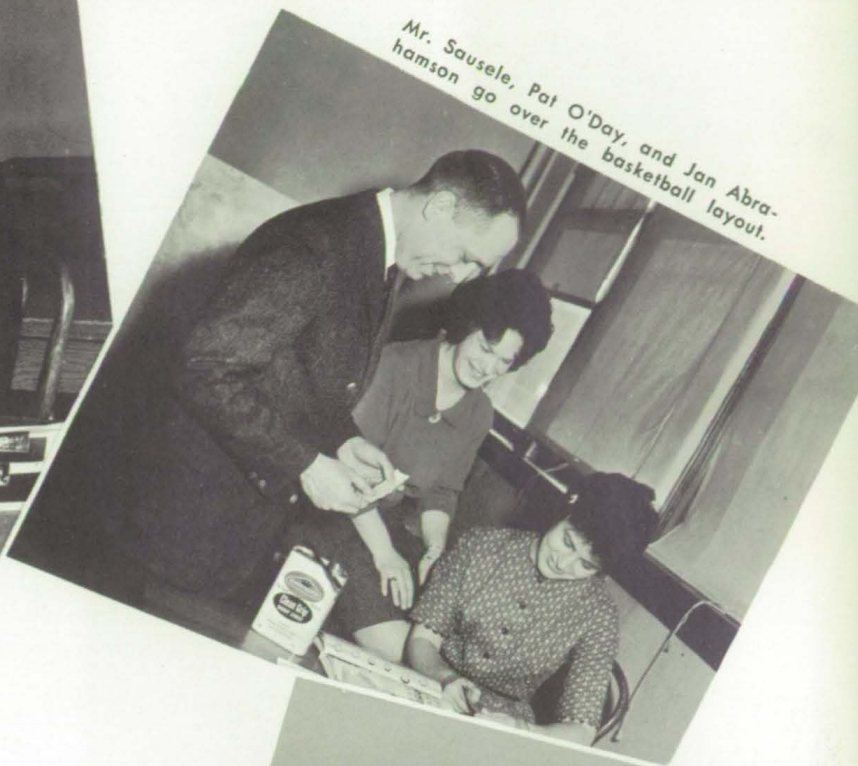

Players on the All City Team were Jim Semerad and Mark Leseman. The only returning All City player is pitcher Marty Mendez.



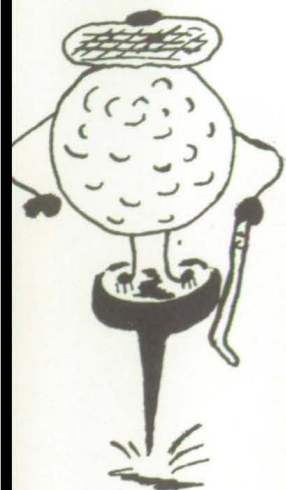
