



Humboldt's Developmental Program


Being handicapped by lack of size and numbers didn't stop our Indians from having a respectable five win-three loss record. The West Side hatchet-

The best effort of the year actually came in the final game. We played Central's city champions on even terms until the last second of the game when


Central kicked a 15-yard field goal to win 10-7.







With a strong group coming from the B-Squad and a formidable nucleus returning, the 1961-62 team figures to be a strong one.


