ship cannot exceed 10 per cent of the graduating class and each member must be on the Honor Roll.

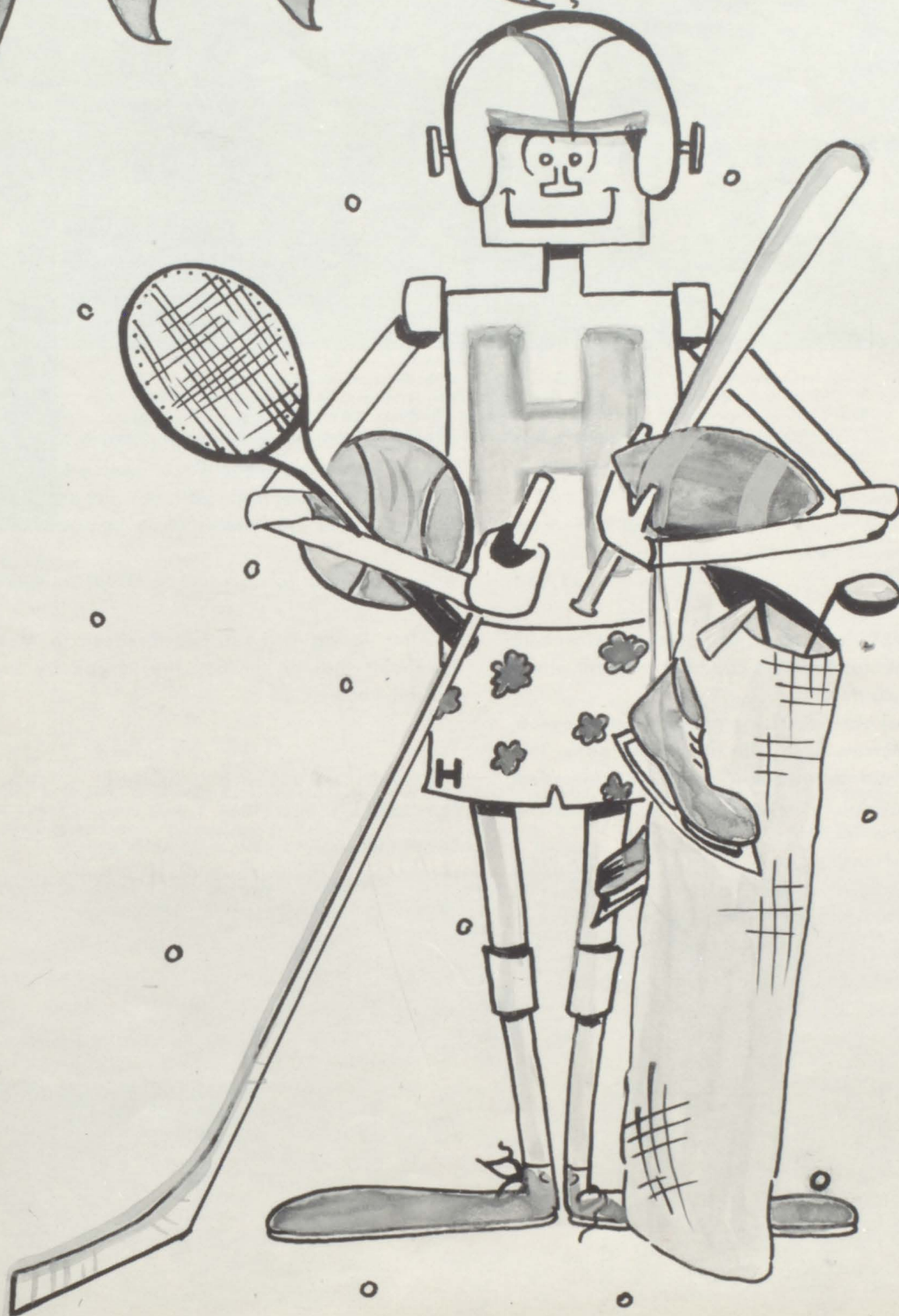

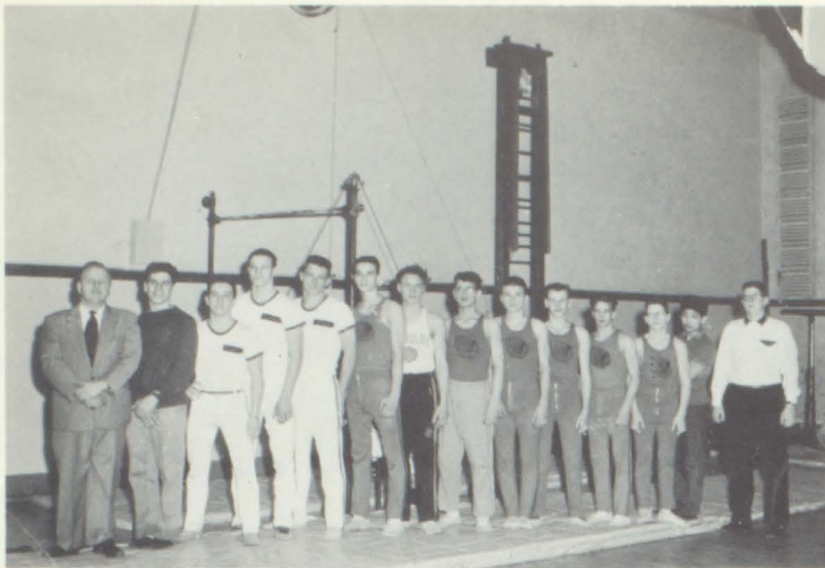

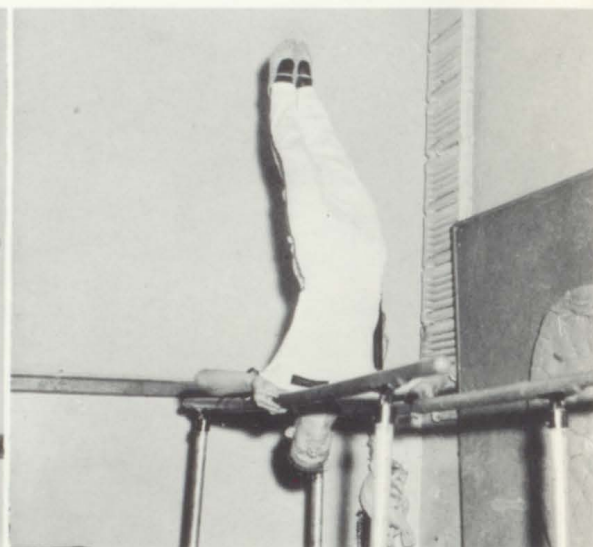
