





### ... DEDICATION






Our counselors take charge of the testing programs and handle the Adult Education Program at Humboldt. These and a great many other responsibilities keep all their days busy.

## MOST LIKELY TO SUCCEED ...







## TWIRP DAY ACTIVITIES ...


Twirp Day is designed to give the boys a day of rest. Girls are to do all the work, serving only the boy that "twirped" her.




