The verdict, "Go home, or go back to your class," is given to students who feel unequal to class work or fancy they do, by Miss Janice Lindberg, our school nurse.




The first really exciting game of this year was played against So. St. Paul. Our 2-1 victory over their state tournament team was a thrill to all of the boys on the team.


