School Goals

Lower Campus:

Reading: The percentage of all students in grades 3-4 scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 34% to 44% by April 2021 as measured by the MCA III administered by the state.

Math: The percentage of all students grades 3-4 scoring proficient or higher in math will increase from 36.7% to 46.7% by April 2021 as measured by the MCA III administered by the state.

Upper Campus:

Reading: The percentage of all students in grades 5-8 scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 33.1% to 43.1% by April 2021 as measured by the MCA III administered by the state.

Math: The percentage of **all students grades 5-8** scoring proficient or higher in **math** will increase from 45.3% to 55.3% by **April 2021** as measured by the MCA III administered by the state.
