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Welcome to Pre-K

Alabama's Voluntary Pre-K is part of the Office of School Readiness. First Class Pre-K provides effective, high quality early childhood experiences that prepare Alabama's children for school success and lifelong learning.

Office of School Readiness defines school readiness as a condition whereby children enter school with:

- an enthusiasm for learning,
- an ability to function in a social setting,
- age-appropriate communication and problem solving skills,
- age-appropriate physical and emotional skills, and
- optimal health.

Numerous studies have shown that students who have participated in high-quality pre-kindergarten programs:

- are less likely to repeat a grade, require remedial education, or be placed in special education,
- score higher on achievement tests,
- are more likely to graduate from high-school and go on to college
- get higher paying salaries as adults, and
- are more likely to stay out of prison and off welfare.

Alabama's voluntary First Class Pre-K program continues to provide one of the highest quality state-funded pre-kindergarten programs in America.

Pre-K Student Attendance Policy Morgan County Schools Pre-K

Pre-K is not covered by the state's compulsory attendance laws, but if you enroll your child in the program, regular, punctual attendance is expected.

• Regular attendance ensures Pre-K children benefit from participating in a quality early education. Regular attendance is a school readiness skill, in addition to a good measure of parent engagement. If your child is sick, please let the teacher know. If you have a planned absence, please clear it with the teacher and/or principal in advance. While we understand that life happens, we are required to address chronic attendance issues. If attendance issues are not resolved after several attempts, your child may be withdrawn from the program.

Chronic Attendance Issues

Chronic tardiness is defined as late arrival or early departure more than 2 days per week. Arriving more than five minutes after the designated drop off time or being checked out before the end of the school day will be considered tardy.

Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing more than 4 days per month without medical or other reasonable explanation. Chronic tardiness or absenteeism may also be defined by an established regular attendance pattern(s), e.g., if a child is late every Monday or absent every Tuesday or leaves early every Friday. (From OSR)

- After 3 unexcused absences or tardies: A phone call may be initiated to remind parents of the attendance policy.
- After 5 unexcused absences or tardies: The Pre-K Director will be notified and a conference may be held with the parent/guardian.
- After 7 unexcused absences or tardies: The situation may be referred to the OSR First Class Monitor.

The Parent Contract items that follow are important components of the Pre-K program participation guidelines and enrollment process. The intent of the First Class Pre-K program is for your child to gain the greatest possible benefits from this preschool experience. As space is limited, selection for the program is a privilege that requires parental responsibilities. Please carefully consider the following requirements for participation. Your signature below will acknowledge that you understand and agree to abide by these guidelines.

- I understand that upon admission into a First Class Pre-K program, I will be asked to provide evidence of up-to-date immunizations (blue card) or a signed affidavit of religious beliefs against such immunizations for my child.
- I understand that there will be a tuition fee associated with participation in this program, based on the income I reported. The tuition is due on the 10th of each month.
- I also understand that no transportation will be provided.
- I understand that my child needs to be potty trained unless there is a documented related health condition.

I agree to:

- 1. Attend an orientation session prior to the beginning of the school year.
- 2. Attend two scheduled parent conferences, one each semester.
- 3. Attend additional conferences, when requested, to discuss my child's progress.
- 4. Complete a minimum of 12 hours of parent involvement during the school year.
- 5. Have my child at school according to the designated arrival time, and pick up my child according to the designated dismissal/pick up time schedule provided by the Pre-K program.
- 6. Send a written excuse to my child's teacher after every absence and follow the program attendance policy.
- 7. Submit all required forms and documentation to my child's teacher by the published deadlines.
- 8. Assume responsibility for my child's conduct and progress.
- 9. Work cooperatively with my child's teachers and other site personnel.
- 10. Give the Alabama Department of Early Childhood Education permission to assess and follow the development and academic performance of my child.
- 11. Give the Alabama Department of Early Childhood Education to use my child's non-personally-identifiable demographic information for reports and publications.
