

Course Selection in PowerSchool


- Use the Parent/Student Portal to input your requests

- Even if you are applying for Peer Group, Teen Pep, Princeton University courses, etc. please still enter a full schedule (8 periods)
 - Keep in mind which courses you would drop if you were to be accepted into one of these placements







Why Should You Take Planning Your Schedule Seriously?

Changing your schedule once you receive it has limits

If you want to make a change after school starts, we have to get approval from your parent/guardian, teacher, and department supervisor

A student who is allowed to withdraw from a year or semester course at any time after the deadline will be removed from the class roster. A record of Withdraw (W) will be maintained throughout the remainder of the year and recorded on the student's permanent transcript.

Why Should You Take Planning Your Schedule Seriously?

Deadline	Schedule Change Desired/Grade Transfer			
September 27, 2024	Drop/Add Without Penalty (Note: Dropped classes will not appear on the transcript.)			
Before/Prior to the End of Q1	Grades Will Not Transfer to New Class			
After the End of Q1 (Q2 to December 20th, 2024)	Grade in New Course = Grade in Previous Accelerated Course + One Letter Grade Increase			
Last Day Before Winter Break (December 20, 2024)	No More Schedule/Class Changes			

Scheduling Revisions

June 7th, 2024 is the last day to make changes to your course requests

Once Schedules are Released:

- Email your counselor to make an appointment
- Contact counseling services for:
 - Correction of an incomplete or incorrect schedule
 - Need to fulfill district and/or state of New Jersey graduation requirements
 - Alteration of a schedule due to failure of a course
 - Alteration of a schedule as a result of summer school



Scheduling Revisions

Schedule changes will NOT be made for the following reasons:

- Class during the AM/PM session
- Course selection based on a "trial period"
- Course choice based on a preferred teacher


