



School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Kuehn-Haven Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Through a comprehensive needs assessment of multiple data points Montrose Community Schools identified two areas of critical focus: *Student Engagement* and *Literacy in all Content Areas*. Student Engagement is the active engagement in positive relationships between ALL students, ALL Staff, and the MCS Curriculum. Literacy in all Content Areas will focus on building a student's comprehension, writing skills, and overall skills in communication. Key initiatives for improving Student Engagement and Literacy are the implementation of Kagan Cooperative Learning

Strategies and a strong Multi-tiered System of Supports such as Positive Behavior Supports, Social Emotional Learning, and Intervention services. We will work to build a strong Professional Learning Community structure focused on analysis of student work and data to drive our instruction. The Essential Practices in Literacy for Grades 4-5 and the Essential Practice in Literacy for all Content Areas Grades 6-12 from the Literacy Task Force will drive our work to increase the rigor in our content area curriculum.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Montrose Community Schools is a small rural school with one elementary school, one middle school, one high school, and one alternative education center. We also offer virtual options through Bobcat Virtual Learning. There is not a need to have a process for assigning students to a school.

STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

In the 2020-2021 school year our district completed a Comprehensive Needs Assessment and updated our District and School Improvement Plan. Our new plan was derived from two areas of need discovered in our data analysis. Our five year (2021-2026) district and school focus will be in the areas of *Student Engagement* and *Literacy in all Content Areas*. The District and School Improvement Plans are published and posted on our Montrose Community Schools website www.montroseschools.org.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Montrose Community Schools has an alternative education high school for students who struggle in the traditional high school setting. The Choice school provides a smaller teacher to student ratio and offers a blended learning approach for students using online programming. We currently offer a virtual option for all students grades K-12 through Bobcat Virtual Learning.

CORE CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION

Kuehn-Haven Middle School has identified priority-learning targets and essential vocabulary at each grade level and subject area to determine the important concepts to assess as well as to provide our students with identifiable learning targets for the Michigan Academic Standards. Curriculum maps were recently reviewed and updated by each grade level and content area team. Access to the core curriculum maps can be obtained by contacting the school principal at 810-591-8832.



Finally, our staff is committed to providing our students social and emotional learning through Restorative Practices, the Positivity Project, iWellness, and a daily Advisory class. These help build skills in student self-motivation, self awareness, problem solving, and character development.

AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

Data in Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies from the state’s MSTEP tests is in the AER Combined Report. In addition, Montrose Community Schools assesses students in K-12 using the nationally normed Renaissance Learning STAR assessments to determine proficiency levels in Mathematics and Reading.
