How long is the program?

- Students can attend for one, two, three years




What are the skills that lead to greater independence?

Therapies

- Students take speech therapy, occupational therapy, counseling, and physical therapy, as needed
- Include small groups for students to work alongside peers
- Are incorporated into the schedule
- Are led by a New York state licensed speech-language pathologists and occupational therapists
- Focus on building life skills and independence
- Focus on individualized goals and overarching themes
