Welcome - Bridget Huffman open the DAISY meeting and welcomed the committee members that were present. Minutes were approved from the May 9, 2017 meeting.

Bridget Huffman, Extension Agent, 4-H Youth Development,

The 4-H Outreach Program is now being implemented in the schools, during school hours. The 4-H Outreach Coordinator, Taryn Whaley, is working with school social workers on referrals and making this transition go smoothly. The 4-H Outreach Program is a life-skills program that works with youth referred by juvenile court, school, parents, and/or law enforcement. Curriculum that the program uses was passed around for the committee to review.

Duplin County 4-H is holding a fundraiser on Wednesday, December 6 from 11am - 6pm at Cooperative Extension : Holiday Hustle Shop-A-Rama (numerous vendors will be on site) and a soup and sandwich luncheon for \$5.00. The luncheon will be held from 11:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. To-plates will be available.

Dawn Smith, Student Support Services, introduced the Student Support and Academic Enrichment Federal Grant. She explain that DCS had received \$106,351 to be used for for programs that fosters safe, healthy supportive, and drug free-free school environments. She explained that Support Services had planned on funding Professional Development for Support Services through the National Center for Youth Issues, Assist in funding for the TipTxt program and supplies and equipment for the Physical Education Departments. No questions concerning the grant and the use of the funds.

Dawn Smith noted that there was a quarterly update for Duplin Christian Outreach Ministries in the packet that the board members picked up when they came in.

Suzanne Burchett, Vidant Health, presented a detailed program on the importance Colorectal Cancer Screening.

Sue Ellen Cottle, DCS Lead Nurse, Our Nurses have completed the vision and hearing screening in all schools now. We have completed 2348 vision screenings, referred 244 students and secured 22 students as of the present time. We have completed 2837 hearing screenings, referred 65 and secured 0 at the present time. We received a grant to purchase a spot vision screening machine and we have been using it for all our failed vision screens and it have cut our failures in half. We are planning to apply for another grant to help get another spot screener this year. We have completed our staff flu clinics in all our schools now. We had good participation in all schools. We are planning to hold staff cholesterol screening in January in all schools. Our

telemedicine project is continue to move along. We are hoping to be doing our first telemedicine visit in the next month

Nancy Jennings, Vocational Rehab, reported that she had sit aside a day each week to be at the High Schools and would be making contact with EC. Mrs. Jenning also expressed an interest in making contract with our nurses and social workers for referrals. VR works with students from 14 to 24 years of age and her funding is secure.

Lisa Jones and Heather Best, DCS Physical Education Teachers, attended the NC Healthy School Summit. Lisa reported that our SHACK was recognized with how well we had worked with our PE Departments on ideas for teaching Sexual Education Classes

Jasmine Williams, Cooperative Extension, The Duplin County 4H Prevention Program successfully partnered with all the schools in the county during their Red Ribbon Week celebrations. Schools received an incentive of either coloring books, pencils, ribbons, bookmarks, or stickers for students in grades K-2. Lunch n Learns were held at 4 of the 5 high schools. Speaking engagements were held at BF Grady, Kenansville, and Beulaville Elementary schools as well as a speaking engagement in the Exceptional Children's class at N. Duplin Jr/Sr High School. Contests were extended to all schools and all K-8 schools participated in 1 or more of the following contests: coloring, poster, bookmark, poetry, essay, and door decorating. Winner of the contest received a drawstring bag with earbuds, a water bottle and a Walmart gift card ranging between \$5 and \$15. Winning classrooms of the door decorating contest received an ice cream party.
