January 16th to May 21st, 2024

- It is recommended that you enroll with your counselor, but not required
- Middle School Students (incoming 9th grade students) may only enroll in World History.
- Applications received after the May 21st deadline are not guaranteed to be placed
- Enrollment in classes is limited, therefore, register early for a desired class.
- Classes will be offered with sufficient enrollment of students (at least 15-students for High School).

Attendance Policy

Summer school courses move at a rapid pace. Some half-credit courses run 13 days for 4 hours and 40 minutes, some half-credit courses run 26 days for 2 hours and 20 minutes, and a one-credit course runs 26 days, as a result, attendance is very important. Students are allotted a certain amount of time to be out of class (absences + tardies) and when that limit has been exceeded, students are unfortunately dropped from the class, without the ability to earn the credit. The attendance policy is strictly enforced and unfortunately, there are no exceptions.

Absences:

Students may be out of class (absences plus tardies) for a total of ten (10) hours in a one-credit course or five (5) hours in a half-credit course. Time out of class in excess of these limits will result in the student being dropped from the course with loss of credit.

Absences are not categorized as excused or unexcused, so there is not a need to call in for a student absence.

Tardies:

Tardies will be in increments of 20 minutes. If a student is late 1 minute or 20 minutes, it is characterized as 20 minutes.. After the 20 minute mark, (for the same tardy), it will go in 10 minute increments. For example, a student who is late 34 minutes, will be designated as 40 minutes. Tardies are not categorized as excused or unexcused, so there is no need to call in for a student tardy.

10 hour (600 minutes) Absences Classes

Students are able to be out of class (absences + tardies) 10 hours or 600 minutes in the following classes and if that number is exceeded, the student will be dropped from the class with loss of credit.

*Students enrolled in section A and B of the same course will be allowed to miss 10 hours total, it is not designated to section A of the course or B of the course.

5 hour (300 minutes) Absences Classes

Students may be out of class are able to miss 5 hours or 300 minutes in the following classes. Absences in excess of 5 hours or 300 minutes will result in the student being dropped from the class with loss of credit

What happens if a student goes over the time limit?

Students are allotted a certain amount of time out of class (absences plus tardies) and when that limit has been exceeded, students are dropped from the class with loss of credit. At this time they will have some options:

Option 1

Take the class during the upcoming school year. You will need to contact your student's counselor to change the schedule for the upcoming school year to reflect the change.

Option 2

Take the class the next summer school session. You would need to go through the process of enrolling in the class during the registration period.

Option 3

Take the class via North Dakota Center for Distance Education (NDCDE).

- Summer School is offered to
 - Retake a required course for credit
 - Complete a required course prior to beginning of school year
 - Study a course of specific interest
- Monday, June 3rd to Wednesday, July 10th
- Grades 9-12
- Other important information
 - You are encouraged to talk with your counselor and parents about your plans prior to enrolling in any of the summer school courses offered to you. Please see attendance guidelines
 - You are expected to complete all assignments and should be aware of the workload required and pace of classes.
- Enrollment in classes is limited and courses will only be offered if a sufficient number of students are enrolled. You will be notified by email prior to the beginning of summer school (Parental Email address that is in powerschool) of your schedule, room assignment, and teacher. Attendance in summer school is extremely important, and the policy will be strictly enforced.
- Conduct
 - Possession of tobacco products, alcohol, or any controlled substances is not permitted on school property. Violation of this policy or any other school policy regularly in effect during the school year is grounds for being dropped from the summer session with loss of credit
