THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY

Kofa High School is part of Yuma Union High School District #70 and is accredited by Cognia. Kofa High School opened its doors in the fall of 1959 with 589 students. The school shares its name with the Kofa Mountains, which were named for the King of Arizona Gold Mine. Students chose "Kofa Kings" as the mascot. Our mission is "The Kofa High School Community is committed to challenging, supporting, and preparing every student to be college, career, and community ready." Through rigorous curriculum, extensive extracurricular activities, and a caring staff who connects with students, Kofa High School prepares students for the challenges they will face as they move from high school to higher education and the workplace.

Yuma is located in Southwestern Arizona and is within ten miles of the border to Mexico. Yuma is the 11th largest city in Arizona, with an estimated population of 97,472, which nearly doubles during the winter months. It is composed of predominantly Hispanic and Caucasian ethnic groups with an additional mixture of Asian, Black, and Native American. The main economic activities of the area are: agriculture, tourism, light industry, and government services, which include two large military bases. Yuma's seven public high schools serve the largest number of migrant students in Arizona. Kofa High School, with a student population of 2357, has 460 migrant students.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Kofa High School offers courses in multiple disciplines with a focus on academic rigor through the Cambridge Curriculum. We also offer several Career and Technical Education programs as well as AVID, Advanced Placement Courses, and dual enrollment. Kofa High School emphasizes the use of technology and prepares students with the knowledge of various systems. Students are well prepared for college, career, and community.
