

Where is the Course Registration info?

Complete the Following (prior to registering for classes)

- 1. Use our Sample Student 4-year Program sheet to check progress toward graduation requirements.
- 2. Review our online <u>Course Description Grid</u>. Look at the detailed description of each course offering as well as the very important grade requirements needed for each class. You should also review the requirements and expectations for <u>AP/Honors courses</u>.
- 3. Fill out the Course Registration Worksheet that was handed out during January presentation days. A duplicate will also be emailed during the first week of presentations. Get signatures from current teachers where indicated on the form (have the transcript with the worksheet so teachers can see previous grades). There are links to the worksheets for each class below. If you don't meet the requirements for a class, you will need to submit an **Appeal Form**.
- 4. Important Note: We will verify grades for all advanced and AP classes to confirm that pre-requirements have been met. You must select classes in which you meet the requirements.
- 5. Parent review and signature.

Students will meet with their <u>academic counselor</u> who will call students out of class for an appointment. At this mandatory appointment the advisor will check the completed worksheet with signatures, verify prerequisites, and input course requests into PowerSchool.

Read the catalog carefully

- You can <u>only</u> register for courses in which you meet the prerequisites

Honors Courses

- All students that want to take Honors/AP courses and DO NOT meet the prerequisites <u>must</u> fill out the Appeal form.
- The Appeal form is online on the Registration webpage.
- Check recommended prerequisites for each Honors/AP course. This list is online.
- The appeal will go to the department chair and will be reviewed by the department.
- Due Date: February 28th for Honors/AP appeals

Appealing for an Honors/AP course

- If you do not meet the prerequisites for an Honors/AP course, you will need to appeal.
- The appeal will go to the department chair and will be reviewed by the department.
- You may be placed on a waiting list until you are approved for the course.
- Those appealing will have their grades reviewed at the end of the second semester to confirm placement.

Registration

- You need to take 10 Units from the following subjects (for a competitive college prep curriculum):
 - Religion
 - Math
 - English
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Ten credits (1 yearlong or 2 semester courses)

60 credits total

Study Hall?

- If you need the extra time for studies/homework, you can choose a "Study Hall" (a semester class). Study Hall is not a credit course. You can take Study Hall both semesters if you wish.
- Note that you will have 7 period day should you sign up for a Study Hall

Before we review the courses...

- Print your name at top of your worksheet
- Print February 10th near name (it is when we start meeting to register you)
- If you are going on Close-Up, you will need to meet with your counselor before you leave (and all required signatures).
- -Check *DLS Only* if you wish all your courses on this campus
- As we go through the courses, you can check off (in pencil) the ones you think you will probably be taking (or circle the ones you have questions about)
- Current teachers will sign your form
- A parent/guardian will need to sign your form before you register

- Three years of Social Studies is required for graduation and college entrance
- You can choose either DLS or CHS courses
- You must meet the prerequisites for any AP courses
- You may not take AP US
 History and AP European
 History at the same time.
- You will need your most recent Social Studies teacher's signature for the AP courses (circle signature line if this affects you).
