EXTENDED STUDY WEEK

Each spring, students participate in experiential academic programs connected to the thematic curricula. With additional focus on one or many aspects of their Barrie education, including community service, cultural studies, or environmental education, this program also embeds a community presentation following their experiences. Recent programs have included conducting research at the Chincoteague Bay Field Station, spelunking with experienced vertical cave experts in West Virginia, learning about the pop music industry from Eurovision award-winners in Sweden, and contributing to the public art scene in Puerto Rico.

CURRICULUM

Barrie offers a rigorous academic program anchored in the essential capacities for the 21st Century. Students acquire their learning through a **Project-based Curriculum** ranging from Discovery & Invention to Diplomacy & Global Issues.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The curriculum pivots on a wide range of courses and experiences both on and off-campus. The vast majority of students exceed these minimums. The following courses and experiential programs are required for graduation:

ADVANCED PLACEMENT & SIGNATURE COURSES

The Upper School currently offers the following Advanced Placement course opportunities: Calculus AB/BC and Statistics. Students can also take AP courses online through Pearson Education, which are designated by an asterisk on the transcript. We also offer a range of project-based signature courses, including Marine Science, Advanced Topics in Chemistry, and Advanced Topics in Spanish.

HUMANITIES CURRICULUM

The Humanities curriculum is a distinctive Barrie academic experience that combines the study of English, history, political science, philosophy, comparative religion, and art history. These double credit courses offer greater depth and intellectual challenge for students than traditional English, history, and social science courses taught separately in most schools. The four-year cycle of required courses includes:

Grade 9: American Studies

Grade 10: Early World Studies

Grade 11: Modern World Studies

Grade 12: The United States in the World

SERVICE LEARNING AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

All students participating in Barrie's service learning and internship programs complete a range of pre- and post-reflective exercises. Our standard requirements for service learning and internships is 100 hours; however, for the classes of 2024 to 2025, only 75 hours are required due to COVID-19.

Grades are reported numerically and GPAs are calculated on an unweighted, standard 4.0 scale. We do not recognize a valedictorian, and we do not rank students.

Barrie School students apply and are accepted to a wide range of public and private colleges and universities.
