(ex. 4,281 - 3,560)</p> <p>Optional Challenge: Use the number cards to create a problem with the greatest difference and a problem with the least difference.</p>	<p>Create a blanket nesting spot and read to yourself for 20 minutes.</p> <p>Summarize what you have just read in a paragraph.</p> <p><b>If you read Fiction:</b> Include: * Character Name/s * The main event.</p> <p><b>If you read Nonfiction:</b> Include: * 5 things you learned about your topic</p>	<p>Find 5 objects around your house.</p> <p>Draw each object.</p> <p>Write 3 or more words to describe each object.</p> <p>Optional: Choose one or more of these objects to include in a short story.</p>

Write 3 describing words for this character's personality around the character drawing.</p> <p><b>If you read Nonfiction:</b> Write about and illustrate at least 5 things you read about today.</p> <p>Optional: Around the Main Character, draw little pictures of some other characters in the book. Label with the character names.</p>	<p>Find a comfortable place to sit: a window, the busy kitchen, etc.</p> <p>Make a list of 10 or more things you observe while sitting in this spot.</p> <p>Create a story about one of your observations.</p>
<p>Complete the <a href="#">Roll A Product Activity Sheet</a>.</p> <p>Use the <a href="#">number cards</a> to create ten multiplication facts. Record and solve on the <a href="#">graph paper</a>.</p>	<p>Create or find a comfortable place and read to yourself for 20 minutes.</p> <p><b>If you read Fiction:</b> Fold a piece of paper in half two times to create 4 areas on the page. Draw the most important happenings in the book you just read in order.</p> <p><b>If you read Nonfiction:</b> Use each section to either write about or draw about 4 key learnings from your reading.</p>	<p>Pick from <b>ONE</b> of these choices:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Have you ever been blamed for something? Tell about it.</li> <li>* What would happen if you grew taller than trees? How would this change your life?</li> <li>* What do you like about school? What don't you like? <u>Explain</u>.</li> </ul> <p>Optional: Choose one more to write about.</p>
