<p>Use the <a href="#">number cards</a> to create 5 addition problems and 5 subtraction problems. Record and solve them on the <a href="#">graph paper</a>. (ex. <math>3451 + 6,789 =</math>)</p>	<p>Find a comfortable spot in your home and read a book of choice for 30 minutes.</p> <p>Do the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Look back at your reading and find 10 interesting verbs (action words).</li> <li>2. Pick 2 of these to illustrate in detail.</li> <li>3. Write a new sentence for each word.</li> </ol>	<p>Write about <b>ONE or more</b> of the following prompts.</p> <p>*Why is it important to have good manners?</p> <p>*What if everyone lived underwater? What would be different? Would anything be the same?</p> <p>*What <b>four</b> things are most important in your life? Name and explain why for each.</p>
<p>Use the <a href="#">number cards</a> to create 8 multiplication problems to solve. They can be <math>3 \times 1</math> (<math>341 \times 5</math>) or <math>2 \times 2</math> (<math>45 \times 21</math>).</p> <p>Record and solve on the <a href="#">graph paper</a>.</p>	<p>Find a comfortable spot in your home and read a book of choice for 30 minutes.</p> <p>Do the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Write a summary about what you just read.</li> <li>2. Describe something that surprised you about what you read.</li> <li>3. <b>If you read Fiction:</b> Write a list of 5 or more questions that you would like to ask the main character.</li> </ol> <p><b>If you read Nonfiction:</b> Write a list of 5 or more questions you have about the information you learned in your reading.</p>	<p>Use a book that you have in your house. Go get it right now and I'll explain what to do when you get back.</p> <p>Welcome Back!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Go to chapter 4.</li> <li>2. Write the first sentence of this chapter on the top of a piece of paper.</li> <li>3. Create a short story that begins with this sentence.</li> </ol>
<p>Draw 5 different <a href="#">number cards</a>.</p> <p>Write the first 6 multiples for each of the cards. Record on the <a href="#">activity sheet</a>.</p> <p>Create 5 different 2-digit numbers (ex. 32) and record on the <a href="#">activity sheet</a> whether each number is prime or composite.</p>	<p>Find a comfortable spot in your home and read a book of choice for 30 minutes.</p> <p><b>If you read Fiction:</b> Describe the follow from your story: Main Character Setting Plot (what's happening)</p> <p><b>If you read Nonfiction:</b> Write a news article about your topic telling the most important details.</p>	<p>Find the <a href="#">Grade 4 Sentence Sheet</a> in your packet.</p> <p>Follow the directions on the page to complete it.</p>
<p>On the <a href="#">activity sheet</a>, create 2 multiplication and 2 division word problems.</p> <p>Give them to a family member to solve. Check their work.</p>	<p>Find a comfortable spot in your home and read a book of choice for 30 minutes.</p> <p><b>If you read Fiction:</b> Predict what will happen next in the plot. Remember to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Explain your idea.</li> <li>* Support the idea with details from the story.</li> </ul> <p><b>If you read Nonfiction:</b> Make a top ten list of things you learned from your reading today.</p>	<p>Pick a topic that you really enjoyed reading and learning about. It could be a science or social studies topic or even related to a book or book series that you have read.</p> <p>Create an advertisement for the topic or book/s. Include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* The topic or title.</li> <li>* Interesting facts or points about the book.</li> <li>* Why do you enjoy the topic or book?</li> </ul>
