


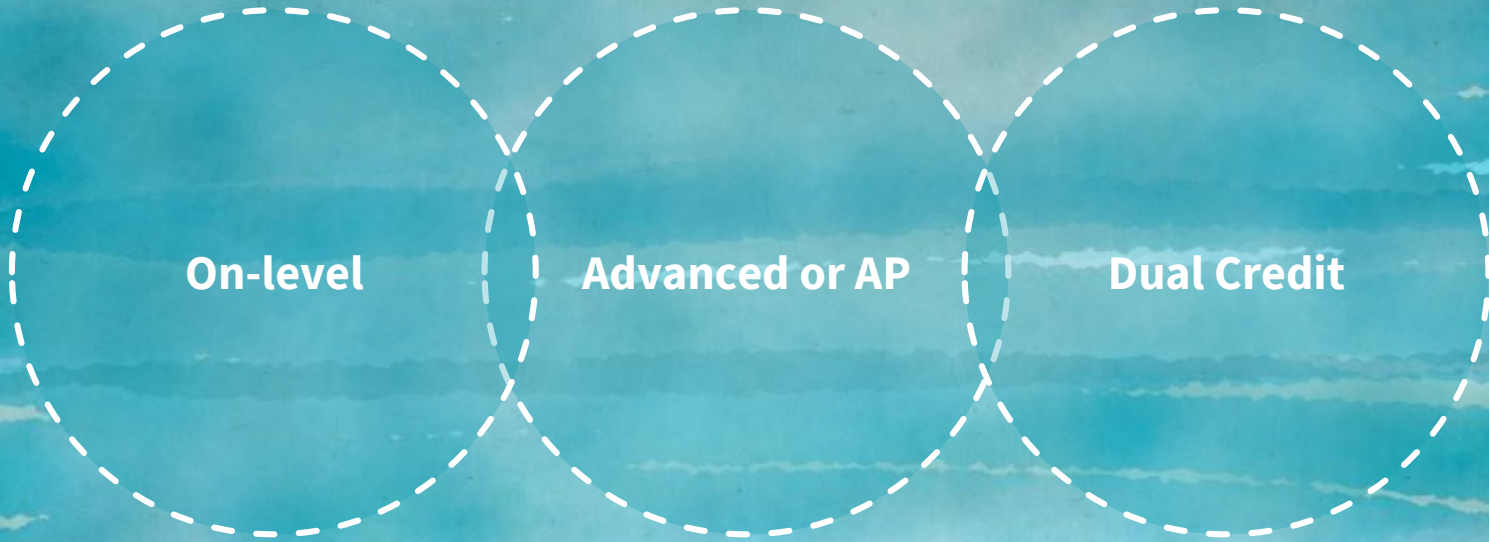

# AP OR DUAL CREDIT??

<b>DUAL CREDIT</b> (MUST MEET REQUIREMENTS: 80+, PAA, APPLY TX, TSI)	<b>AP</b> (ANYONE CAN TAKE)
<b>Earning high school &amp; college credit simultaneously</b>	<b>No guarantee upon completion of course; must pass AP exams with 3+ for college credit</b>
<b>Guaranteed college credit upon successful completion of courses in TX</b>	<b>Accepted nationwide - always check with college/university first</b>
<b>Accepted at public universities in TX and many times out of state</b>	<b>Taught by high school teachers trained by College Board</b>

## LET'S TALK DUAL CREDIT

- ▶ Dual credit allows students to earn high school credit and college credit at the same time.
- ▶ MISD offers dual credit classes for no tuition (AKA: **FREE**)
- ▶ Only courses within our agreement can be coded for dual credit.
- ▶ MISD provides textbooks for your class.

# HOW ARE COLLEGE CLASSES DIFFERENT FROM HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES?

## HIGH SCHOOL

1. Teachers tell students frequently what they need to study, when assignments are due and when tests will be.
2. Grades are based on many assignments, quizzes and test grades.
3. Parents have open communication with their student and the teacher.

## COLLEGE

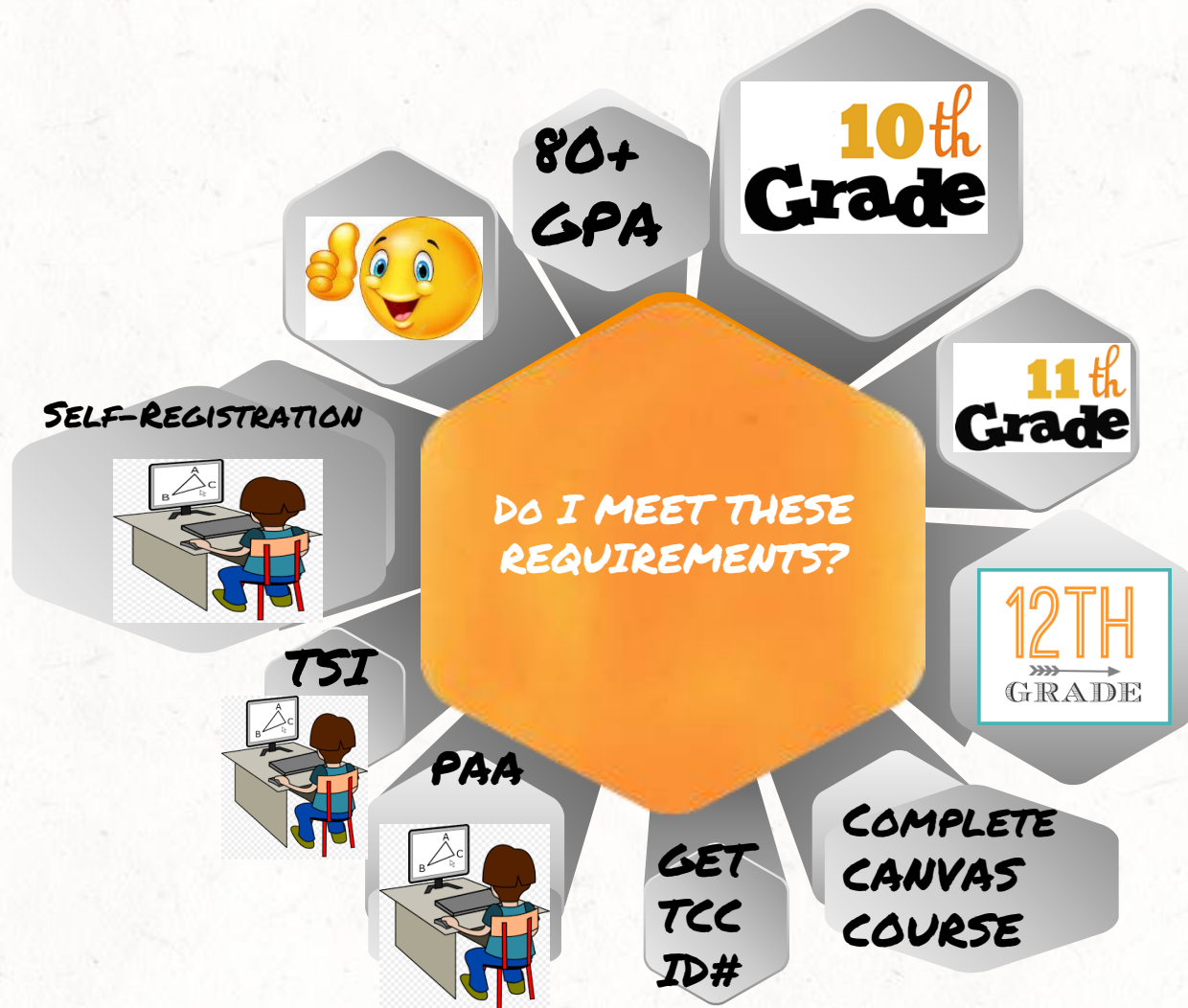
1. Students determine what they need to learn, prepare their own outlines and study guides and are required to learn all material whether it was presented in class or not.
2. Grades are based on a small number of assessments. Students take fewer tests over larger amounts of material and are not necessarily allowed to make-up or retake.
3. Due to FERPA, communication is only between the student and the professor.

## What if I can't attend TSI sessions at MHS?

THAT'S OK! SEE YOUR COUNSELOR BUT KNOW YOU WILL HAVE TO TRAVEL TO TCC TO TAKE YOUR TSI TEST.

I miss a lot of school due to my sport/extra-curricular activity...can I still take TCC?

STUDENTS MUST LET A PROFESSOR KNOW IF THEY ARE ABSENT. ATTENDANCE IS VERY IMPORTANT IN DUAL CREDIT, SO A STUDENT SHOULD KEEP THIS IN MIND IF THEY KNOW THEIR SPORT/ACTIVITY CAUSES THEM TO MISS SCHOOL. .

**If I take the TSI, do I HAVE to take dual credit classes?**

**NO....BUT YOU WILL HAVE MORE CLASSES TO CHOOSE FROM SHOULD YOU DECIDE TO TAKE THEM.**
