- Students are acclimating to the academics, pressure, stress, time management, study skills while going through stages of adolescence.

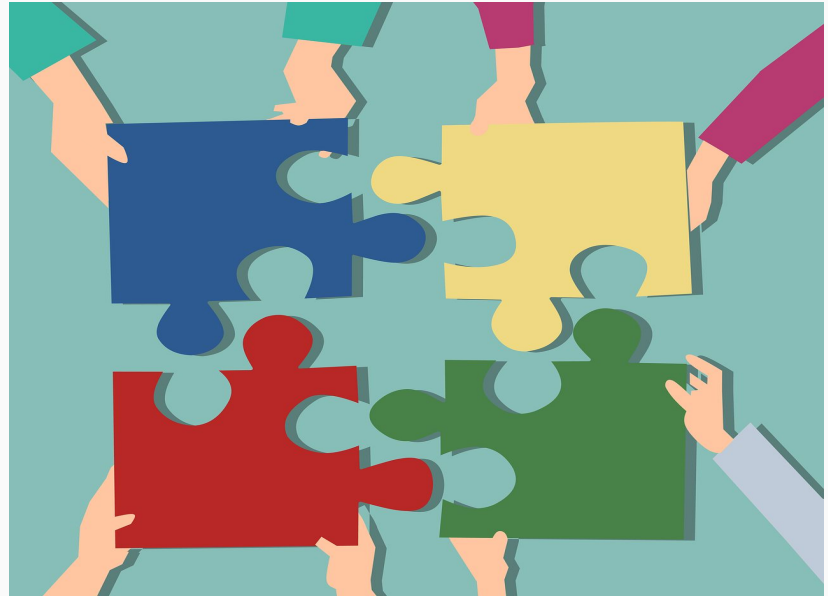
Tips for Students:

Regents Diploma - a score of 65 or better is required on these Regents exams:

Comprehensive English
Mathematics (Any one)
Global History
US History
Science (Any one)
Language other than English (FLACS A)

Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation - a score of 65 or better is required on these Regents exams:

Comprehensive English
Mathematics (All three) (Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II)
Global History
US History
Science (One physical and one life science)
Language other than English (FLACS B)

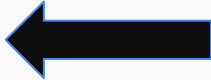
