The Board of Trustees and the School's Senior Leadership Team have recently undertaken a refresh of the strategic objectives and plans for the Brisbane Grammar School (BGS or the School) intended to have currency for the next five-year period (2024 – 2028). We believe this step is timely as we are about to open our magnificent new STEAM precinct which will bring with it significant changes to the way we seek to educate future cohorts of the boys of the Light Dark Blue.

The advent of the STEAM precinct reinforces the fact that we live in a complex, rapidly changing world in which the pace of change is accelerating and in which our past success as a School is no guarantee of future success. Given the pace of change there is no room for any 'strategic' complacency. The School's strategic approach must necessarily be a process which we constantly seek to evolve and develop as we pursue our ambition to be the best school for boys in Australia.

Purpose

Brisbane Grammar School educates boys within an innovative learning culture that nurtures their intellectual, physical and emotional wellbeing to become global citizens who contribute to their communities.



History

Born of a strong connection to our community, Brisbane Grammar School values the pursuit of excellence through a broad liberal education.

Today BGS is a thriving learning community of over 1900 students and a diverse team of skilled educators, coaches, tutors and business and services staff.

The preservation of the School's traditional ambience, the fostering of pride in its success, and celebration of the ongoing achievements by its alumni, will give all students, past and present, a sense of belonging to the Grammar community.

The Grammar Schools' Act, passed in 1860, provided for the establishment of secondary education in this state. By 1868, enthusiastic public subscribers had raised enough money to establish our School.

The first Headmaster, Thomas Harlin (1868-1876), welcomed 94 students in February 1869 at the original site in Roma Street. That same year, Sir Charles Lilley endowed a gold medal for the dux of the School.

By 1881 the School had moved to its current site at Spring Hill under Headmaster Reginald Heber Roe (1876-1909). That year the Great Hall and classrooms were opened. When the Boarding House opened in 1886, the School became one of the first to provide unified

boarding facilities on site.

Innovation in curriculum, pedagogy and learning spaces is a hallmark of the School's history. New laboratories in 1912 and 1960 set benchmarks in science education. An expansive library and assembly hall was built for the School's centenary in 1968. A pioneering Outdoor Education facility was created at Lake Moogerah in the 1970s. The School's Indoor Sports Centre was opened in 2000, the Middle School was established in 2003, followed by the construction of the collaborative learning spaces of The Lilley Centre in 2010.

The School's most recent major infrastructure project - the STEAM Precinct 2024 - continues this trend of educational innovation. It provides inspiring learning spaces, integrating the disciplines of science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics and gathering place for our community.

Brisbane Grammar School continues to fulfil its mission to develop multiliterate students who are critical, reflective and creative thinkers with higher-order skills required for an evolving global and increasingly digital economy.
