Elementary fire safety lessons are well underway. There are 11 members of the fire department participating in their kids' classes this year.

As we all start to turn on the heat in our homes, don't forget to check the carbon monoxide detectors in your home. Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas that is created by burning natural gas, and this is the season to discover clogged exhaust pipes from the hot water heater and furnace that can cause CO to vent into the home. You should have a carbon monoxide detector by your bedroom—you won't wake up because one in the basement is going off. If you only have one CO detector, move it to where it will alert you when you are sleeping.

Leave sweeping starts this week. Don't park your car on the leave pile, or your car might look like this afterwards:

Outreach

QPR Gatekeeper training is for adults who are directly working with our youth to learn peer-to-peer language for suicide prevention. MOMS (Moms of Multiples) will be trained in QPR 11/2 at 7:30pm @ Mt. Lebanon library. Mental Health Meetups at MTL Library are back in session on Mondays from 3:15-4pm until October 30th. Meetups are for students in grades 6-8 who are interested in improving their self-care and sense of self. Registration is required through the library. This is a free event and snacks are provided! There is no meetup on Monday, October 9th.

Group Counseling: Due to the increased demand for services, Outreach has created two groups to support kids and teens in the community. The first group's focus is on positive coping skills related to anxiety and depression. The second group's focus is building and implementing positive social skills. Each group is for teens aged 12-15 to learn coping skills related to anxiety and depression. The group meets weekly for one hour for 5 weeks to work on identifying positive skills to support. A group must have 3 or more individuals to begin. Visit our website to complete a referral form or contact Outreach directly with any questions.

Mt. Lebanon Commissioners

A new sidewalk policy was just passed in August with the goal of improving safe walking routes. Only 68% of Mt. Lebanon has sidewalks. At this time, new sidewalks slated for 7 new streets. The municipality addresses 600-700 sidewalk issues per year. For more information, click HERE.

The Municipality just signed a 5 year contract with Westmoreland trash. It will include curbside glass recycling but we do recommend that you continue to use the Recycling options at Kohls parking lot that we pay for or Michaels Bros because more of the glass will get recycled. We know that Waste Management pick up can be spotty if your trash is missed please either call the Municipality or go to myLebo.mtlebanon.org to report it. If the company is not in compliance with its contract money will be refunded to the municipality.
