Please Note the Following:

- To be eligible for transportation, in accordance with Board of Education Rules and Regulations, students in grades K-8 must live more than 2 miles and less than 15 miles from the school he/she wishes to attend. Students in grades 9-12 must live more than 3 miles and less than 15 miles from the school he/she wishes to attend.
- Applications submitted after April 1, 2024, will not be approved.
- Students, **of any age**, will be expected to travel on a public carrier (bus, subway, or train) whenever such carriers are located within reasonable walking distance of the child's home and the school which he or she attends (including but not limited to School of the Holy Child, Rye Country Day, Fordham Prep, Horace Mann, Stepinac, Riverdale Country School, St. John & Paul, Immaculate Heart of Mary, Regis, The Brunswick School, The Dalton School, French American School of NY, Salesian). The District will not be required to furnish transportation directly to or from his or her home (door-to-door).
- Transportation on other than a public carrier may be provided in cases where legal requirement, cost to the District, or the efficiency of economies associated with transporting multiple students to a particular school or to schools located near each other warrant a different consideration.
- Transportation other than public carrier is generally provided within a consortium. This means that students from multiple districts may be transported together to non-public schools. The consortium is managed by Southern Westchester BOCES.
