Executive Summary: In accordance with local policy DEA, the administration submits the attached resolution for consideration by the Board of Trustees. Essentially, the resolution allows salary/payment to all employees and long-term substitutes for the dates/times missed because of the closure of our schools due to inclement weather on January 16, 2024. Furthermore, the resolution provides additional pay to those critical wage-earning staff who were required to work during this same period of time.				
Specifically, policy DEA Local states: During an emergency closure, all employees shall continue to be paid for their regular duty schedule unless otherwise provided by Board action. Following an emergency closure, the Board shall adopt a resolution or take other Board action establishing the purpose and parameters for such payments.				
Nonexempt employees who are required to work during an emergency closing for a disaster, as declared by a federal, state, or local official or the Board, shall be paid at the rate of one and one-				

half times their regular rate of pay for all hours worked up to 40 hours per week. Overtime for time worked over 40 hours in a week shall be calculated and paid according to law. The Superintendent or designee shall approve payments and ensure that accurate time records are kept of actual hours worked during emergency closings.

WHEREAS, the Pearland Independent School District Board of Trustees specifies that during an emergency closing, most District employees are instructed not to report for work. The Board concludes that a need exists to address wage payments for all employees.

WHEREAS, in anticipation of severe weather conditions, Pearland Independent School District officially closed all its facilities on January 16, 2024, in the best interest of and for the safety of all students and staff, and

WHEREAS, Pearland Independent School District will not need to make up the missed instructional minutes.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Pearland Independent School District seeks to retain its employees and facilitate efficient operation of educational activities; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Pearland Independent School District finds that compensating employees for work days missed as a result of inclement weather conditions serves an important public purpose in that continued retention of such employees shall enable the school district to continue the efficient operation of educational activities; and,

IT IS THEREFORE:

RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Pearland Independent School District in accordance with Board Policy DEA (LOCAL), hereby authorizes the administration to compensate all employees and long-term substitutes for the day when the District was closed due to inclement weather conditions at their regular hourly or daily rate of pay, according to the duty schedule they would have otherwise worked;

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Pearland Independent School District hereby authorizes the administration to compensate those hourly employees who were required to report to duty on January 16, 2024, at the rate of pay specified in local policy DEA (LOCAL) in addition to the pay all employees will receive.

Trustee Advocates Program participants learn how to build an advocacy system in their school district that supports local community connectedness and influences state legislative outcomes. The work is issue-based, non-partisan, and aligned with the Open Meetings Act. Over the course of an 18-month fellowship, Trustee Advocates learn to build a local public education advocacy network that encourages community connectedness and influences state legislative outcomes. Grant awards cover all transportation, food, and accommodation costs for superintendents and participating Trustees for the four (4) large group sessions that will be held in Austin, including accommodation for the night before the training begins.

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Subject: Consider Renewal of Contract for Commercial Property, Automobile, and Various Insurance Coverages

Executive Summary: Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc. is the agent of record for multiple types of insurance coverage maintained by the district. Administration is pleased with the services and coverage being provided and wishes to exercise a contract renewal.

The total insurance premiums recommended for approval is \$2,809,136; an increase of \$419,489 from last year's cost.

Property Insurance Coverage:

- The District's proposal included an increase in replacement values from \$870.7 million to \$920.4 million.
- The loss limit will remain at \$50 million.
- The deductible, terms and conditions remain the same as the previous year.

Administration recommends to award property insurance coverage to Gallagher for a maximum cost of \$2,809,136. Once awarded a contract, Gallagher will seek out released carriers to negotiate a lower premium.

The attached backup provides a comparison of coverage and premiums for the new and expiring policies, property schematic, pricing matrix and historical rates. To review the full insurance proposal <u>click here</u>.

Administration is pleased with the services and casualty insurance coverage TASB RFM has provided and wishes to exercise a contract renewal. The total premium for casualty insurance recommended with TASB is \$338,716; an increase of \$38,404 from last year's cost.

Subject: Approve Purchase utilizing DIR contract DIR-TSO-4159 for Hewlett-Packard Manufacturer Branded Hardware, Software, Cloud and Related Services and Services for student one-to-one devices.

Executive Summary: Policy CH (Local) states that any single, budgeted purchase of goods or services that costs \$100,000 or more, regardless of whether the goods or services are competitively procured, shall require Board approval before a transaction may take place.

The Technology Department evaluated several laptop options and determined Dell, HP and Lenovo brands were the best option for replacement of 13,800 student one-to-one devices for grades 5-12. The District issued requests for quotes for the three models and received a total of 22 quotes. The quotes were reviewed by the Chief Technology Officer, Director of Educational Technology, Infrastructure Manager and Director of Purchasing.

Administration recommends awarding this contract to HP, Inc. in the amount of \$6,231,050 which includes accidental damage coverage and unpacking and waste removal. The detailed cost breakdown is below.

Subject: Consider Approval of RFP 24-1024-01 for Copiers / Multifunctional Device Fleet Equipment and Services.

Executive Summary: The District has 65 copiers at or near expiration. The District issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to acquire proposals from vendors to replace the 65 copiers coming to term within the district.

The District received six proposals from Dahill Office Technology, Flex Technology Group, Function4, ImageNet Consulting, Sharp Business Systems and UBEO MIDCO, LLC. The responses were reviewed for compliance with the RFP, evaluated and scored by the evaluation committee consisting of Thu Pham, Controller, Jon Block, Infrastructure Manager and Moniki Mason, Director of Purchasing. Administration recommends awarding this contract to Sharp Business Systems to replace the 65 copiers with a contract term of five years.

The new contract results in an overall annual savings of \$170,341 or \$851,703 over the five-year term. The following are the major highlights of the new contract:

- The copier fleet cost is reduced from \$414,946 per year to \$244,606 and allows for unlimited black copies and annual color allowance of 937,200 per year.
- Itemized billing and invoicing.
- Auto replenishment of supplies; automatic preventive notification sent to the vendor.

RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENTION TO REIMBURSE CERTAIN EXPENDITURES WITH BORROWING PROCEEDS

WHEREAS, the Pearland Independent School District (the "District") desires to pay expenditures in connection with the design, planning, acquisition, construction, equipping, and/or renovating the project or facilities described in Exhibit A attached hereto (the "Project");

WHEREAS, Chapter 1201, Texas Government Code, as amended ("Chapter 1201"), permits the District to use the proceeds of obligations to reimburse the District for costs attributable to the Project paid or incurred before the date of issuance of such obligations; and

WHEREAS, the District finds, considers, and declares that the reimbursement of the District for the payment of such expenditures will be appropriate and consistent with the objectives of the District's programs and, as such, chooses to declare its intention, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations, to reimburse itself for such payments at such time as it issues obligations to finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PEARLAND INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT:

Section 1. This Resolution declares the intention of the District to reimburse the expenditures for the Project with the proceeds of obligations. The District presently intends to reimburse the expenditure by incurring obligations issued under Texas law the interest on which is excludable from gross income under section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Section 2. The District reasonably expects to incur debt, in one or more series of obligations, in an aggregate maximum principal amount now estimated to be \$6,500,000 for the purpose of paying the costs of the Project, including the reimbursement of prior expenditures incurred hereunder.

Section 3. The District intends to reimburse the expenditures hereunder not later than 18 months after the date the original expenditure is paid or the date the Project is placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than three years after the original expenditure is paid unless the Project is a construction project for which the District and a licensed architect or engineer have certified on Exhibit A that at least five years are necessary to complete the Project in which event the maximum reimbursement period is five years after the date of the original expenditure.

Section 4. The District intends that this Resolution satisfy the official intent requirement set forth in Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations and evidences its intentions under Chapter 1201.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be liberally construed to evidence the intent of the District to comply with Texas law and federal income tax law in the issuance of tax-exempt obligations for the Project.
