Any change in ability to perform these functions requires a prompt written notification to the program director. The student who cannot perform Essential Functions will not be able to participate in laboratory experiences or clinical rotations. The applicant's physician or healthcare provider **must** verify the following functional abilities. The healthcare provider, parent and student must sign this document.
