


Family Academy

Survey

From our Social Workers corner...

My name is Mallory Sample and I am in my third year with SSD as an Early Intervention Social Worker.

Early Intervening Services (EIS) is a tool that schools use to address disproportionately (the over representation of racially, culturally, and linguistically diverse children in Special Education). Our services help children who need additional academic or behavioral support to be



successful in school. Students that I work with do not have a current IEP, has consistent difficulties with regulating emotions or behavior and may appear anxious, avoidant, over-reactive, short-tempered, overly irritable, etc.

Finally, should a student need IEP services it is important to note that my role does not deny or delay a student's access to Special Education evaluations or services.

Outside of work I am a wife and the proud parent of two wonderful children (ages 12 and 9), a graduate of McCluer North (Go Stars!), and an avid reader. You can usually find me transporting my kids to their various activities (swimming, theater, and basketball) and spending a lot of quality time with my family.

My tip for the month will be: Mindfulness

Have you ever found yourself wondering "what is mindfulness exactly?"

Mindfulness is a practice that helps you to become more aware of what you're experiencing in *this* moment and accepting it as it is. Mindfulness aims to help you to be kinder to yourself and to others.

Many times when we hear the word *mindfulness* we think it means being calm and relaxed...totally zen. Mindfulness can help with this but it's really more about awareness and acceptance.

So, why should you care about mindfulness? For so many reasons!

Mindfulness can help make it easier for you to tune into yourself and your needs. Practicing mindfulness can help you build confidence and feel good about who you are. It can help you gain better control over your reactions and emotions...to stop and take a breath before responding when feeling a strong emotion. Mindfulness can help you start your day with good intentions and finish your day calmly as you drift to sleep.

Mindfulness is a <u>practice</u>. Something to continually be working on and growing. It is something that we can do, not a specific way to feel or to be.

Affordable Internet Service for Families

The Affordable Connectivity Program is a <u>Federal Communications Commission program</u> that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service. This new benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers. Eligible households can enroll through a <u>participating broadband provider</u> or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an <u>online</u> or mail in application.
