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### A Letter from the College Counseling Office

After an academic year filled with classes, homework, and extracurricular activities, the summer is a wonderful time to relax, recharge, and reflect. Since the break is around three months long, it's also a great opportunity to have some fun while exploring something new or developing a particular interest.

There's no "right" way to spend the summer as long as students engage in an experience that is meaningful to them. In some cases, it might provide some depth or clarity to their future goals, whether they be at BWL, in college, or beyond. In others, it gives students insight about what they don't like, which can be just as valuable.

Our students have been involved in myriad activities over the summer including jobs and internships, camps, travel, pre-college programs\*, and community service. Above all else, it's important that students enjoy themselves so that they get the most out of their commitments. These experiences often help students learn more about themselves and the world around them, and they return—both energized and motivated—to tackle the new school year.

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<sup>\*</sup>Please note that these programs might be a helpful way for students to get a taste of college life, both academically and socially, but they are certainly not required nor do they necessarily increase a student's admission profile for that college.



#### A Note on Recommendation Letters

Some summer opportunities require students to submit a letter of recommendation in order to get a better sense of who they are —their personality, strengths, and interests. While there might be different criteria for the recommender, we encourage students to choose someone who knows them very well and can directly address why they might be a good fit for the experience.

Teachers tend to be the most appropriate recommenders because students have developed close interactions with them in the classroom and perhaps through extracurricular activities as well. When asking a teacher for a recommendation letter, it's always a good idea to do so in person. Students might share some background information about why they're submitting an application and how the teacher's unique insight about them would be helpful in the process. As a follow-up, a thank you note is a nice gesture.



# Stand-Alone and STEM New York City Based Summer Programs

#### • Apollo Theater Academy Technical Stage Production Internship Program

This is a highly competitive paid 6-week summer internship for "emerging young creatives" who want to learn everything it takes to put on a show. The internationally renowned Apollo Theater is the ideal place to learn about all aspects of technical stage production. The application window is tight; applicants are not yet open for 2024 but last year the application time frame was brief, from late April to late May. #### • Bossgirls

Bossgirls is a summer entrepreneurship program from the Zahn Innovation Center at The City College of New York (CCNY) for high school (current 9th-12th graders) girls and nonbinary students. Five-week program to develop leadership skills and the "mindset" of entrepreneurship. Students work in teams to develop innovative projects and there is a "Shark Tank" component at the end of the program. #### • Bella Abzug Leadership Institute (via Hunter)

A six-week summer program with 60 trainees, ages 13 to 21, identifying as female and learning leadership skills. A competitive program, BALI gives priority to youth coming from underserved neighborhoods or schools in New York City, but there are no specific academic requirements. There is an application and a short interview. Last year the applications were due by late June for the July programs; there are several cohorts. #### • Summer Science Research Project at The Rockefeller University

A seven-week highly competitive summer project for juniors and seniors only. SSRP Scholars will participate on a research team designed and guided by Rockefeller trainees. SSRP teams mirror the structure of a Rockefeller laboratory, where one trainee serves as team lead with support from dedicated scientist-mentors. Each team will have their own space in the RockEDU laboratory. Program highlights include mentored biomedical research and visiting scholars. #### • Summer Shakespeare

Summer Shakespeare is a five-week summer intensive that is free for qualifying students. Twenty-two students are selected to train five days a week in voice, movement, ensemble work and scene study. The program culminates in a production of an abbreviated Shakespeare play. Applications will open in Spring 2024. Priority is given to high school students who apply and demonstrate financial need. #### School of The New York Times Summer Academy

For rising 10th through 12th graders, as well as recent high school graduates, this program offers two-week courses in podcasting, photojournalism, even a course called "Reporting in New York" which are taught by journalists and reporters. The cost of two-week session is approximately \$5,325 for students who do not need to live on campus. #### • Woodland Ecology Research Mentorship ("WERM") at Wave Hill

This is a 14-month program that begins with a summer component and then continues through the following school year. Applicants need to be 16 years or older by the second summer (2025), and preference is given to students who live in the Bronx or Upper Manhattan. Students learn from scientists and restoration practitioners working to improve New York City's 20,000 acres of natural areas. WERM interns learn about urban ecology in an authentic context. Applicants who self-identify as Black, Latinx, Indigenous and/or come from under-resourced schools and communities are particularly encouraged to apply. There is a \$3500 stipend and up to 9 college credits. #### • One Lab Summer Studio

Based in the Brooklyn Navy Yard, this summer internship is an exposure to climate education through "green" design and architecture. ONE Lab Summer Studio is a design studio that illustrates the environmental possibilities of the built environment. The two courses offered in 2023 were Architecture and Design, and Design for Future Cities, both two-week sessions offered in July. The cost is \$2100 including application fee and materials, but financial aid is available. The program is for rising 10th grade in Fall 2023 through graduating seniors, with exceptional rising 9th graders eligible for admission. #### • Barnard Pre-College Programs

Barnard's Summer Programs offer rising sophomores, juniors and seniors the chance to explore leadership courses in several cutting edge areas. In addition to a traditional "pre-baccalaureate" program, there are two different summer sessions that focus on specific topics: Young Women's Summer Leadership, which deals with the interaction between gender and leadership; Health & Society, which explores the culture of biomedicine; the Athena Summer Innovative Institute, which is an entrepreneurial boot camp; and Sustainable Food & the City, a hands-on investigation of ecological and food distribution systems. # **Summer Programs Through New York University**

#### • ARISE (Applied Research Innovations in Science and Engineering)

ARISE is an opportunity-based program for rising 10th and 11th graders focused on providing rigorous lab experience under the mentorship of some of NYU's cutting-edge research faculty. The program is a 7-week full-day summer program on-site at the Tandon and Washington Square campuses. It is open to students living in New York City with strong interests in careers in STEM fields. Students are trained in college-level research, expository writing, scientific methods, professional development, and ethics, then conclude the program at a professional poster presentation and colloquium. #### • Democracy Scholars

Democracy Scholars is an intensive three-week summer seminar in political philosophy followed by a nine month civic engagement leadership project that takes place during senior year of high school, meeting every other week. This is a FREE residential opportunity for high school students to learn in a college environment, explore relevant topics in political philosophy and social justice, and develop confidence in their academic and leadership capabilities. #### Summer at the Bronfman Center

Summer Excelerator is a week-long leadership and pre-professional program for current high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors. The experience blends leadership development training and Jewish identity building. #### • Computer Science for Cyber Security ("CS4CS")

CS4CS is a free program that meets for three weeks during July, open to high school students entering grades 9 through 12. CS4CS provides an introduction to the fundamentals of cybersecurity and computer science for high school students. Lessons focus on a spectrum of topics such as "whitehat" hacking, cryptography, steganography, digital forensics, privacy, data usage, and other issues relevant to the fast-growing cyber industry. #### • Innovation, Entrepreneurship and the Science of Smart Cities ("ieSoSc")

For students entering grades 9 through 12, ieSoSC is a free five-week program from early July to early August. The program focuses on advancing technology and engineering skills through design and prototyping, built around real world 'smart city' applications and research. Through lessons on deploying circuitry, electronics, coding, and cloud computing; using microcontrollers, sensors and other hardware for complex tasks, students learn how scientists and engineers apply fundamental knowledge to address challenges in the real world. Students will contribute to team projects they will demonstrate during final presentations. # **Summer Programs Located Outside of NYC**

#### MITES Summer and RSI

MIT offers several free programs for high school students, with an emphasis on giving students who have traditionally been underrepresented in STEM programs an opportunity to immerse themselves in these fields. MITES (MIT Introduction to Technology, Engineering and Math) Summer is a six-week summer program for juniors, which can also continue into the fall semester of a student's senior year, becoming MITES Semester (online; formerly known as MOSTEC). Students take five rigorous, rewarding math, science, and humanities courses—and discover all they can achieve. They also participate in lab tours and social events, and benefit from college admissions counseling. RSI (Research Science Institute) is offered to rising seniors and is extremely selective, requiring standardized test scores as part of the application process. #### Stanford University Mathematics Camp (SUMaC)

Intensive study in Algebra for rising high school juniors on the Stanford campus, covering Abstract Algebra and Number Theory, and Algebraic Topology. #### • Canada/USA Mathcamp

#### Simons Summer Research Program at Stony Brook University (Long Island)

Simons Fellows are matched with Stony Brook faculty mentors, join a research group or team, and assume responsibility for a project. The Simons Fellows conclude their apprenticeship by producing a written research abstract and a research poster. Simons Fellows attend weekly faculty research talks and participate in special workshops, tours and events. At the closing poster symposium, students are presented with a stipend award. Students apply while they are currently in their junior year of high school (11th grade)- and participate in the program in the summer before senior year. #### Princeton Laboratory Learning Program

The Laboratory Learning Program is a free, highly competitive program allowing high school students who are 16 or older by the summer to engage in full-time hands-on laboratory work in engineering and the natural sciences. The program is not residential; students need to live close enough to Princeton in order to participate, or arrange their own housing arrangements nearby. #### • Columbia Climate School Pre-College Summer Programs

Columbia Climate Corps are small group climate and sustainability-focused traveling programs designed for motivated high school students. ## **Humanities and Social Sciences Focused Programs**

#### • Telluride Association Summer Seminar (TASS)

An intense, free 6-week program for high school sophomore and juniors exploring equity and social justice by taking college classes. Telluride has two offices, in Ithaca, New York and Ann Arbor, Michigan—the specific locations of the two summer programs are yet to be announced. One is TASS-CBS (Critical Black Studies), which focuses on cultural contributions made by people of African descent, as well as history, politics, and literature related to these contributions. TASS-AOS (Anti-Oppressive Studies) considers power and oppression, and the development of ways to transform society. You may "nominate" yourself to be considered for one of the TASS programs, or students may be nominated by an adult, which is helpful as part of the application process. #### School of Visual Arts

SVA's Pre-College Program offers courses taught by the same faculty of leading art professionals who teach in the college's undergraduate degree programs. #### • The Reynolds Young Writers Workshop at Denison

An energizing 8-day program for motivated high school students (rising juniors and seniors) who love to write. For nearly 30 years, the Reynolds Workshop has brought together young writers who are passionate about writing and eager to connect to a close-knit community of writing friends. At Fir Acres Writing Workshop, sixty high school students from across the country come together for two weeks to write and join a community of writers on the wooded campus of Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon. Participants hear from distinguished visiting writers, and work on their own poetry, fiction, and creative prose.
