# Important Information about Course Requests

- The master schedule is built on the classes you choose on your course request, so please pick your classes carefully
  - If you change your mind about a class, we may not have room in another class for you and if the change is possible, it will cost \$10
- The course request must be filled out completely and correctly, so we have options in the classes you want to take
- If you think you might be moving or attending another school next year, please turn in a course request anyway (if you move or attend another school your course request will be deleted)
- If you change your mind about a course after turning in your course request, you can come to the counseling center to update the course request



- The descriptions are on the back of the course request and give you details about each class
- Prerequisite classes must be taken before the more advanced courses
  - i.e., Art Found 1 must be taken before advanced art classes
- If you already took a course, you cannot retake the course
- List your elective options in order of preference with the classes you want most listed first so we can try to place you in your top choices
- If you are interested in an audition/application course, do not list it on your course request
  - If you make the audition or application course, we will replace your bottom choice on the course request with it

**\*You will enter your course requests online on Thursday and the system will not allow you to put in courses you already took or advanced classes if you did not take the prerequisite courses**

# 9th Grade Information

- You have 2 options for Science in 9<sup>th</sup> Grade: Earth Science and Honors Biology (most students take Earth Science)
  - Those interested in taking Honors Biology should at least a B in math because it puts you on a more difficult track throughout high school. You will probably take Chemistry in 10<sup>th</sup> grade, which requires more math.
- AP Human Geography is a college-level class and requires commitment, good reading skills, and willingness to work hard
- You begin earning high school graduation credits in 9<sup>th</sup> grade, but you must PASS your classes to earn the credit
- You need 27 credits to graduate and should earn at least 7 credits in 9<sup>th</sup> grade to be on track for graduation

### Fine Arts (Fine Arts Credit)

2204	Band 1 Brass (YR): Class for students wanting to play a trumpet, trombone, baritone, french horn, and tuba. Students provide/rent their own instrument and plan to attend summer band camp. Evening performances required.
2205	Band 1 Woodwinds (YR): Class for students wanting to play a clarinet, flute, oboe, bassoon, or saxophone. Students provide/rent their own instrument and plan to attend summer band camp. Evening performances required.
2210	Band 2 (YR): Students provide/rent their own instrument. Band 2 is the Concert Band for 2nd and 3rd year musicians. Evening performances required.
2213	Band 2 Percussion (YR): Students provide/rent their own instrument. Learn basic fundamentals of rhythm, pitch, and ensemble performance, while playing multiple percussion instruments. Must have at least 1 year of piano or ensemble experience. Students provide/rent their own instrument. Evening performances required.
2405	Orchestra 1 (YR): Continuation of the 6th grade Orchestra class. Beginners are welcome, but will need to catch up to the class. Students provide/rent their own instrument. Evening performances required.
2406	Orchestra 2 (YR): Students provide/rent their own instrument. Evening performances required.
2301	Choir 1 (YR): Choral singing class combined with general music. Students explore musical concepts like note values, pitch, rhythm, music connections, and learning to perform. Evening performances required. Fees required.
2502	Theatre 1 (SEM): Students focus on creating, performing, responding, and connecting by learning basic theatre concepts and techniques. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders.
2503	Theatre 2 (SEM): Prerequisite Theatre 1. Students focus on intermediate theatre concepts and techniques including script creation.
2504	Theatre 3-Full Production (SEM): Non-audition. Students engage in a complete theatrical experience by participating in the creation and production of a play. Rehearsals and evening performances required.
2401	Guitar 1 (SEM): Acoustic guitar. Students provide/rent their own instrument. Students learn basic fundamentals of guitar performance, guitar styles, song writing, and music theory. Evening performances required.
2101	Art Found 1 (SEM): Beginning art class. Focus on Art Elements (fees required).
2105	Art Found 2 (SEM): Prerequisite Art Found 1. Use a variety of digital programs to create artwork. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders (fees required).
2106	Adv Art Found 2 (SEM): Prerequisite Art Found 1. Building upon prior knowledge gained in Art Found 1 with a focus on drawing and painting. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders (fees required).
2107	Painting 1 (SEM): Prerequisite Art Found 1. Working with a variety of painting materials to create artwork (fees required).
2112	Intro to Ceramics (SEM): Prerequisite Art Found 1. Beginning ceramics. Students will create artwork from ceramic clay (fees required).
2118	3D Design 1 (SEM): Prerequisite Art Found 1. Building upon prior knowledge gained in Art Found 1. Students create 3D sculptures and artwork from a variety of materials. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders (fees required).

Choir 1 S/A (YR): Audition required. Treble choir for Soprano and Alto voices and students will hone their music theory and sight-reading abilities. Evening performances and uniform required.	
Choir 3 (YR): Audition SATB Choir for top 8th and 9th grade singers and students will hone their music theory and sight-reading abilities. Evening performances and uniform required.
