- II. Gaylon Johnson shared the agenda
- III. Introductions/Program Updates
 - Gaylon Johnson: connecting to students during COVID was difficult. Already served more students this year to date than all of last year. Began Teen Intervene, a 3-session program at all high schools which will also soon include Meraki, El Sereno and La Entrada. Marijuana use is very high, students are vaping including marijuana vaping. Vape use skyrocketed during COVID. Club Live and Friday Night Live are going strong, including Leadership Workshops. Three scheduled prevention nights. Prevention programs covers bullying, tobacco use and – mostly works with middle and high school. LCAP and grant funded.
 - Natalia Aguirre: FACE held Afghan donation drive. Holding 2 workshops tomorrow. November calendar coming out. 1500 families will be helped at Encina with food items and 300 families at San Juan High.
 - Sneh Nair: Nutrition Services fed children throughout the pandemic. All children can be fed one breakfast and one lunch for free currently. California will be going to universal meals next year. Supply chain has been drastically impacted. Non-meat options have been added to the menu. Unable to serve Halal at this time. Applications are not being accepted at this time.
 - Maria Godoy: Prevention Programs has been working with sites regarding bullying prevention, including elementary schools. Programs can be for staff or parents. Working with scheduling high schools as they are the most impacted by student behaviors.
 - Robyn Caruso: District Grant Writer happy to be here
- IV. Wellness Policy – Triennial Assessment is due by June 2022. Gaylon and Teri have been looking at other district policies and recommended model policies. The district is currently out of compliance. Areas of the policy needing adjustment were discussed, including parents bringing homemade snacks for classroom parties. The findings on our current policy are over three years old.

Brainstorming ideas on gathering new committee members. Gaylon will network to try to get new members. He will follow up on trying to find folks to handle other sections of the Wellness Policy (i.e.: Nutrition Services will handle Nutrition Services, Prevention Programs will handle Bullying Prevention, etc.).
