 - Performance is shown disaggregated by student groups, including ethnicity and socioeconomic status
 - Provides extensive information on school and district staff, programs, and student demographics

 - Includes a new metric of Accelerated Learning by Grade and Subject.
 - Students who did not pass in 2022 but passed in 2023. This is based only on the grades and contents that we have growth metrics.

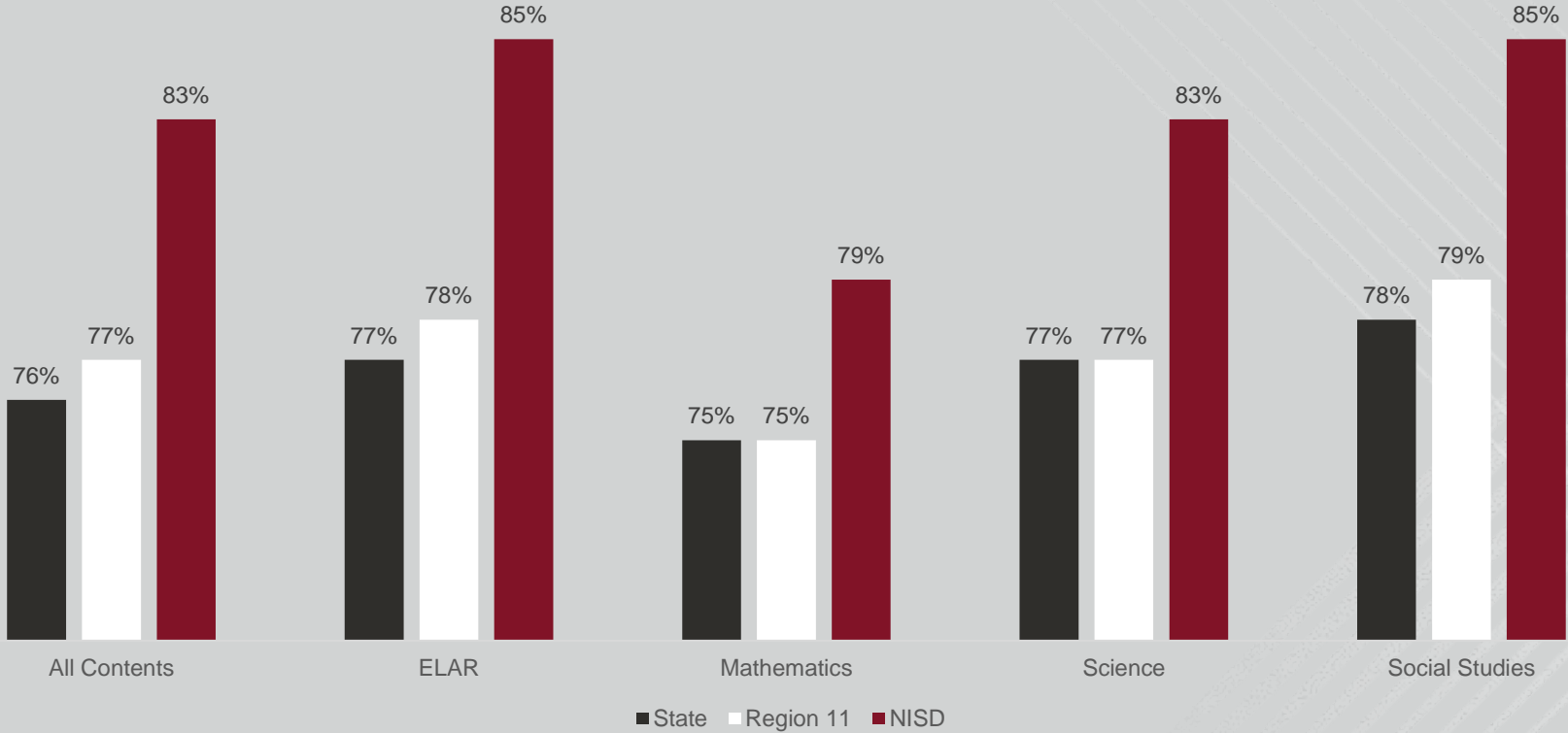

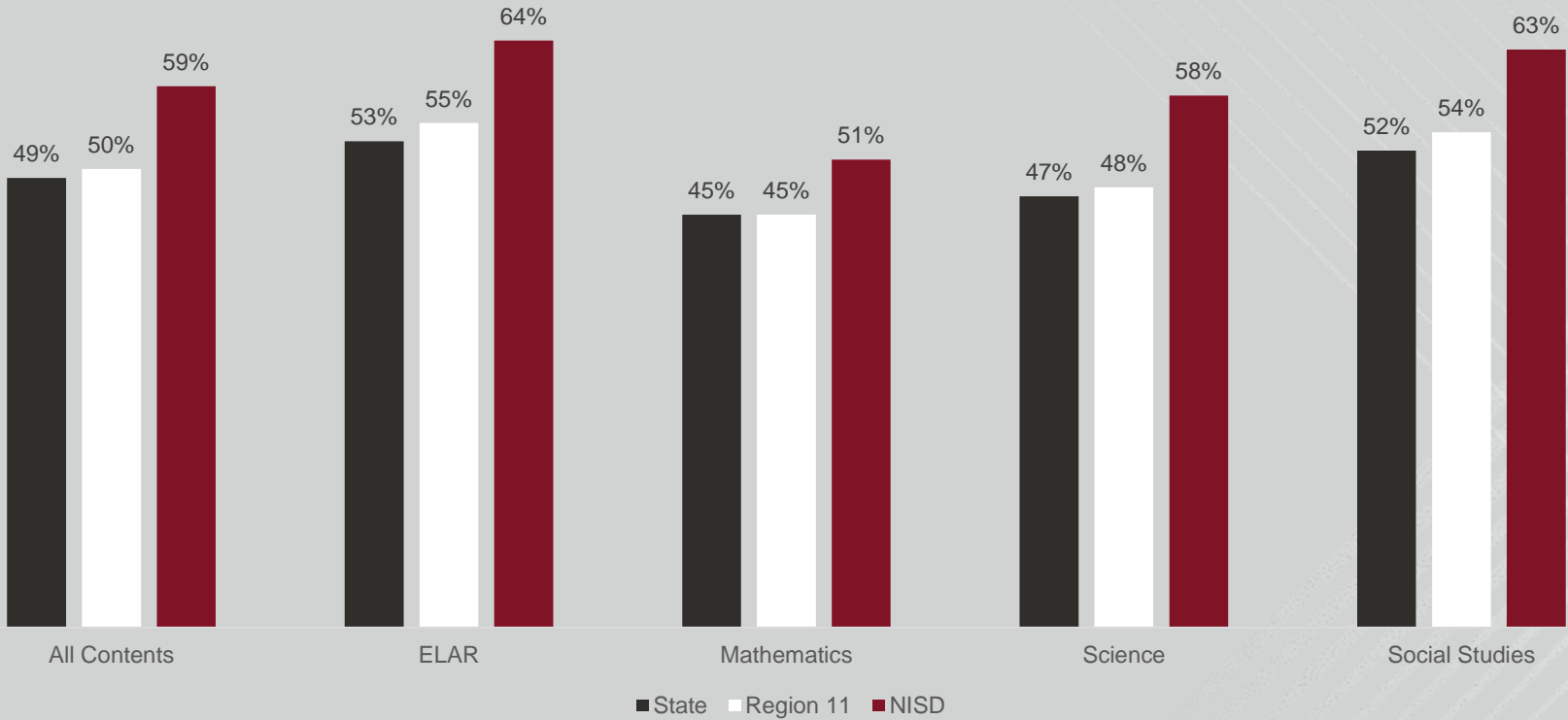
- **Bilingual Education/English as a Second Language**

 - 2023 – participation rate of 100%



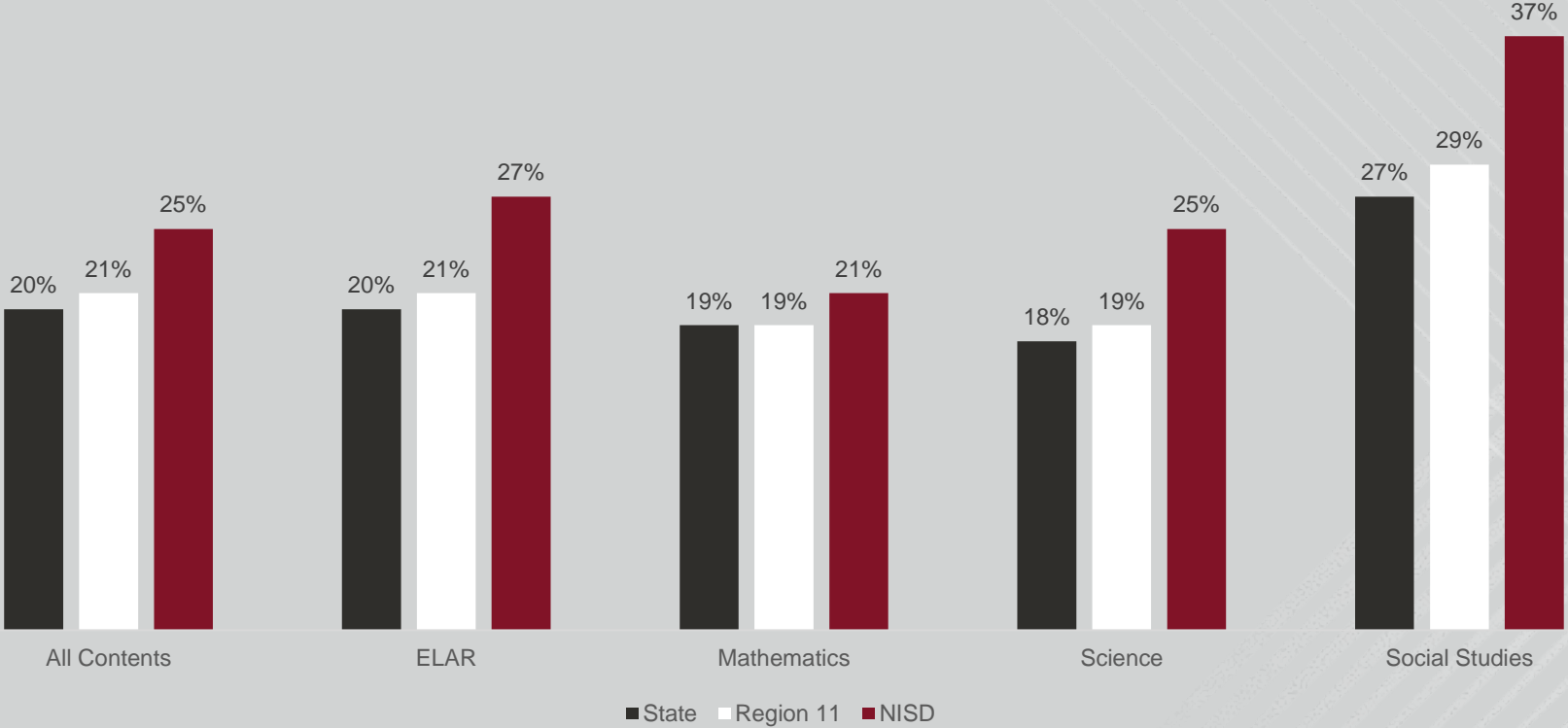
A higher percentage of students scored at the Approaches level or higher than the state and Region 11 on all content areas.



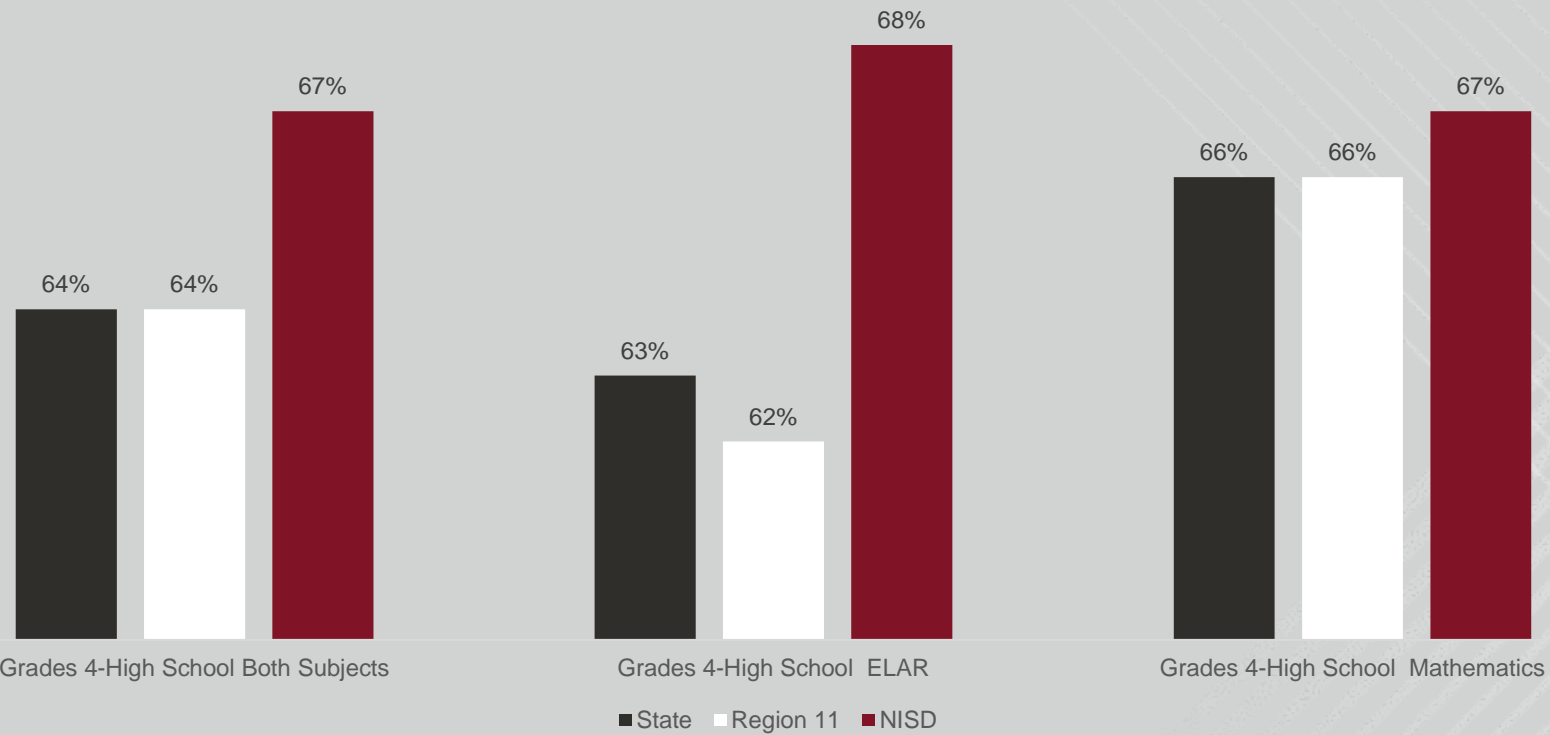
A higher percentage of students scored at the Meets level or higher than the state and Region 11 on all content areas.



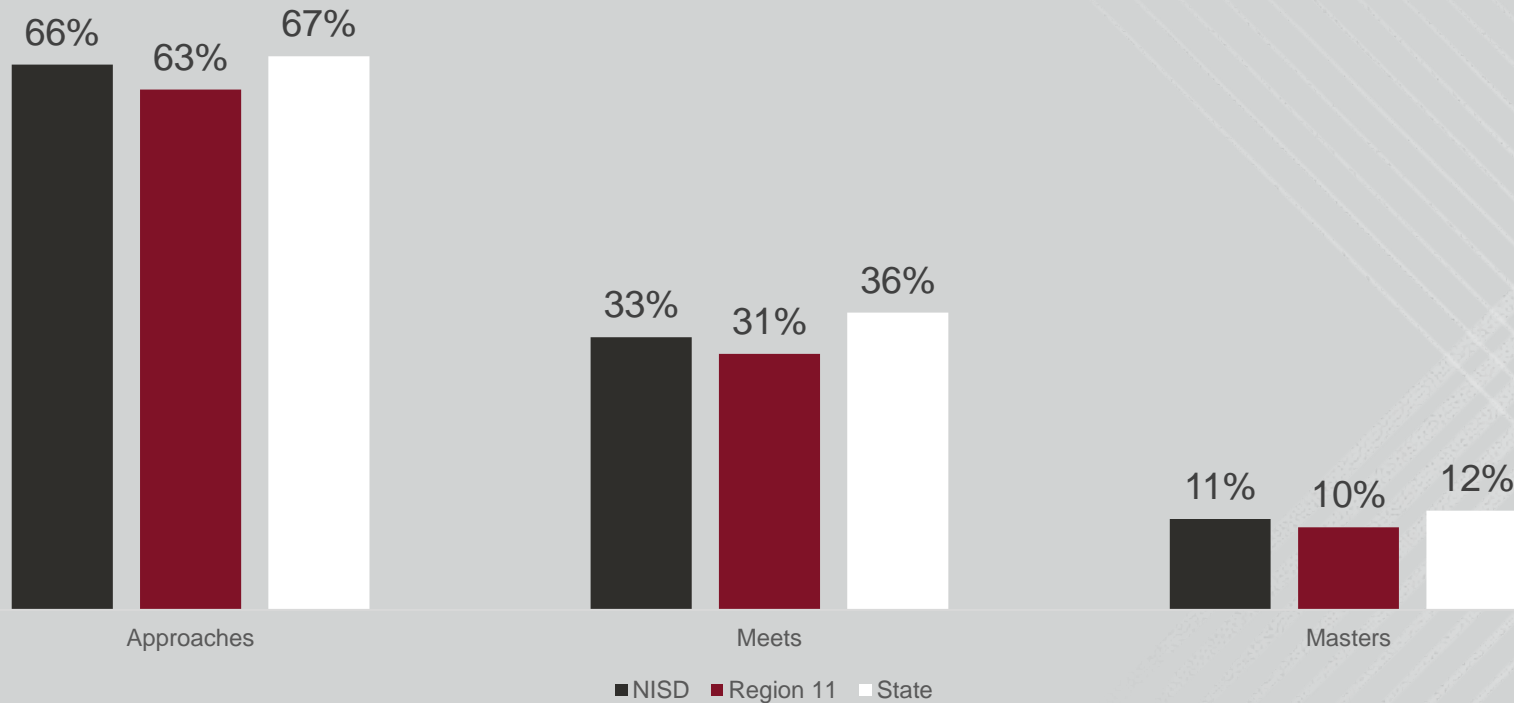
A higher percentage of students scored at the Masters level than the state and Region 11 on all content areas.

NISD Bilingual/EB students are outperforming Region 11.

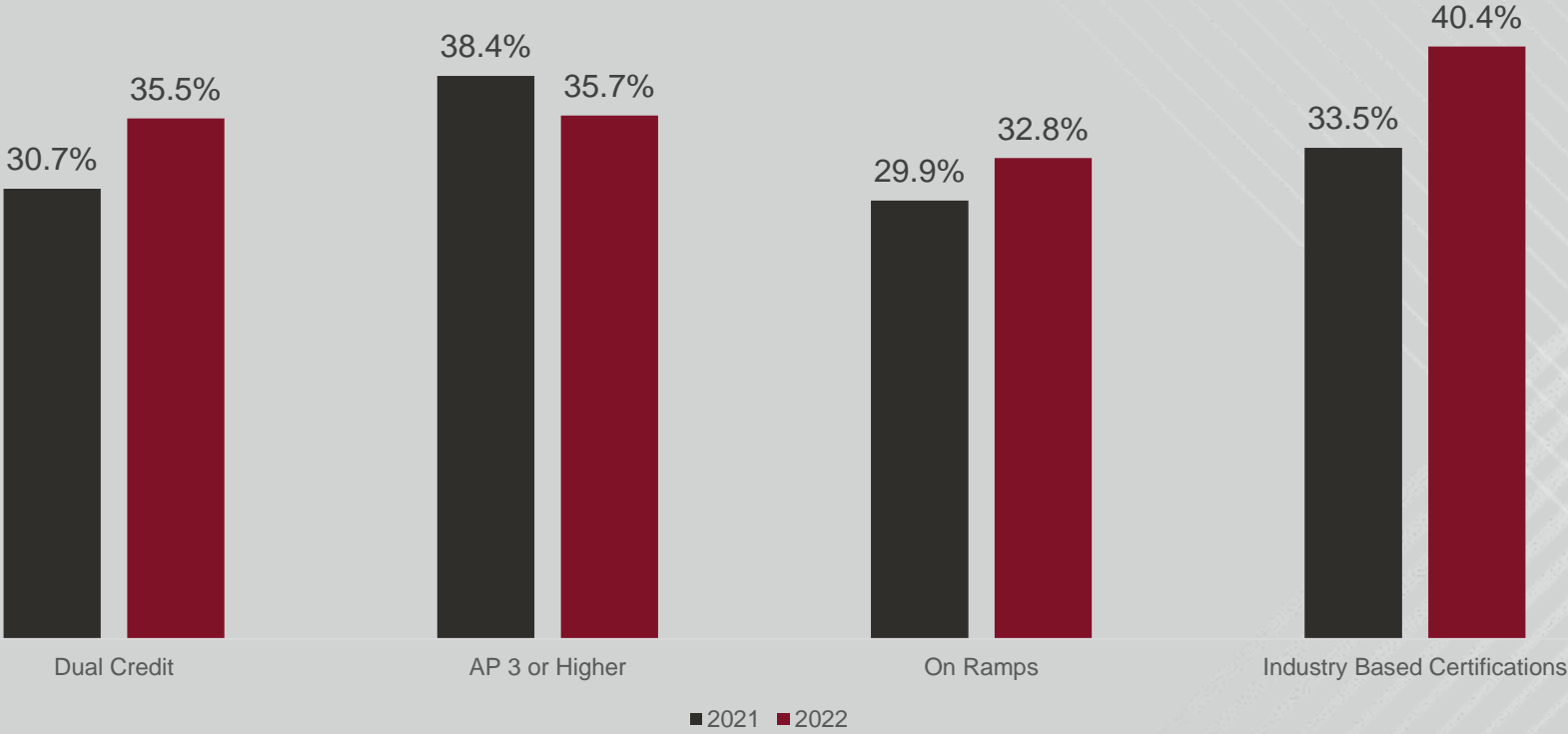

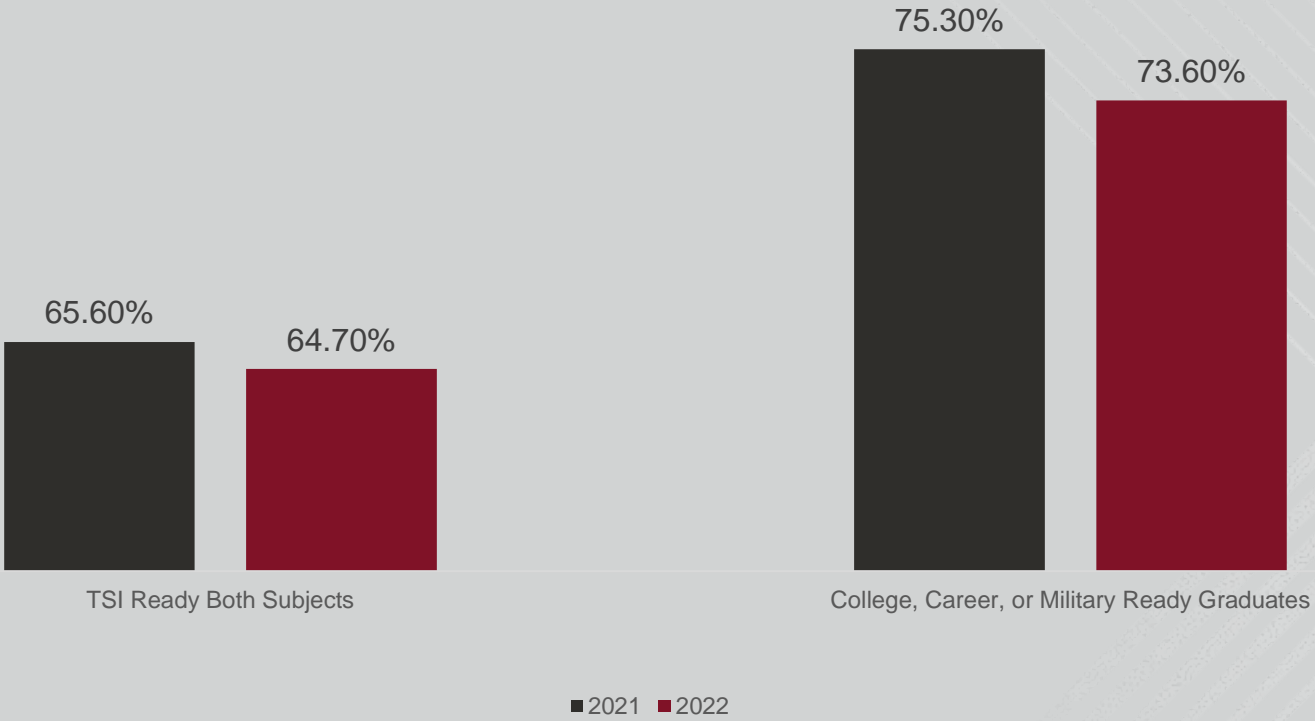

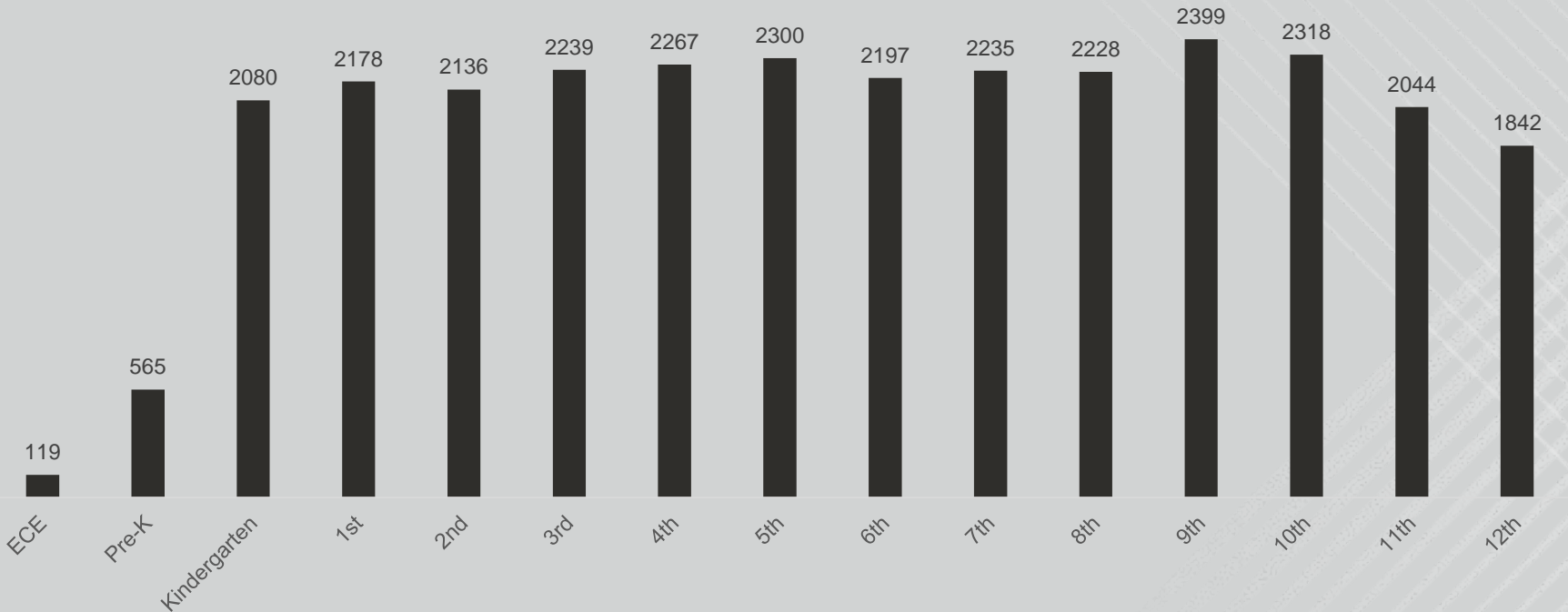

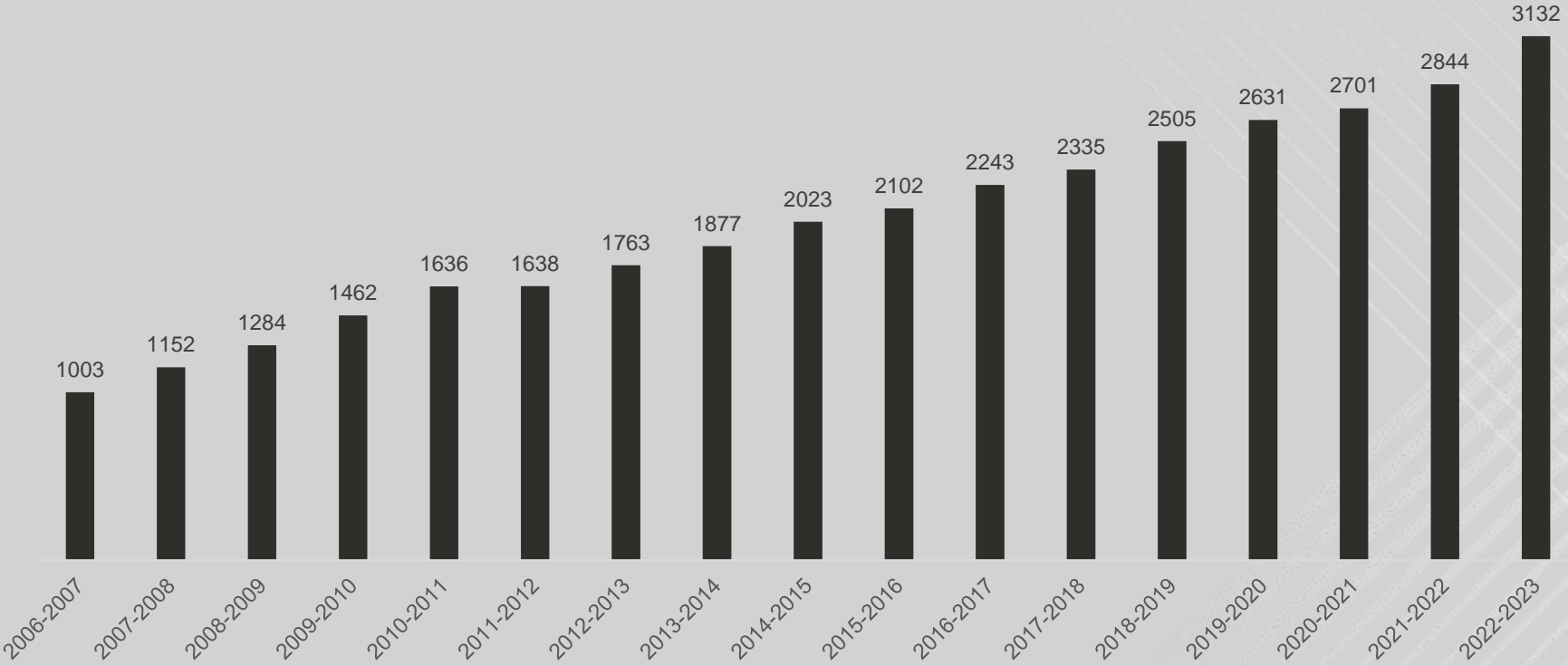

What is the 2022-23 District Accreditation Status?

- Generally, each year TEA assigns one of four accreditation statuses to each district in the state:
 1. *Accredited*
 2. *Accredited-Warning*
 3. *Accredited-Probation*
 4. *Not Accredited-Revoked*
- In assigning an accreditation status to a district, TEA considers
 - Academic accountability ratings
 - Financial accountability ratings
 - Data integrity
 - Program-area deficiencies identified through Results Driven Accountability (RDA)
- The District's 2022-23 Accreditation Status is: **Accredited**

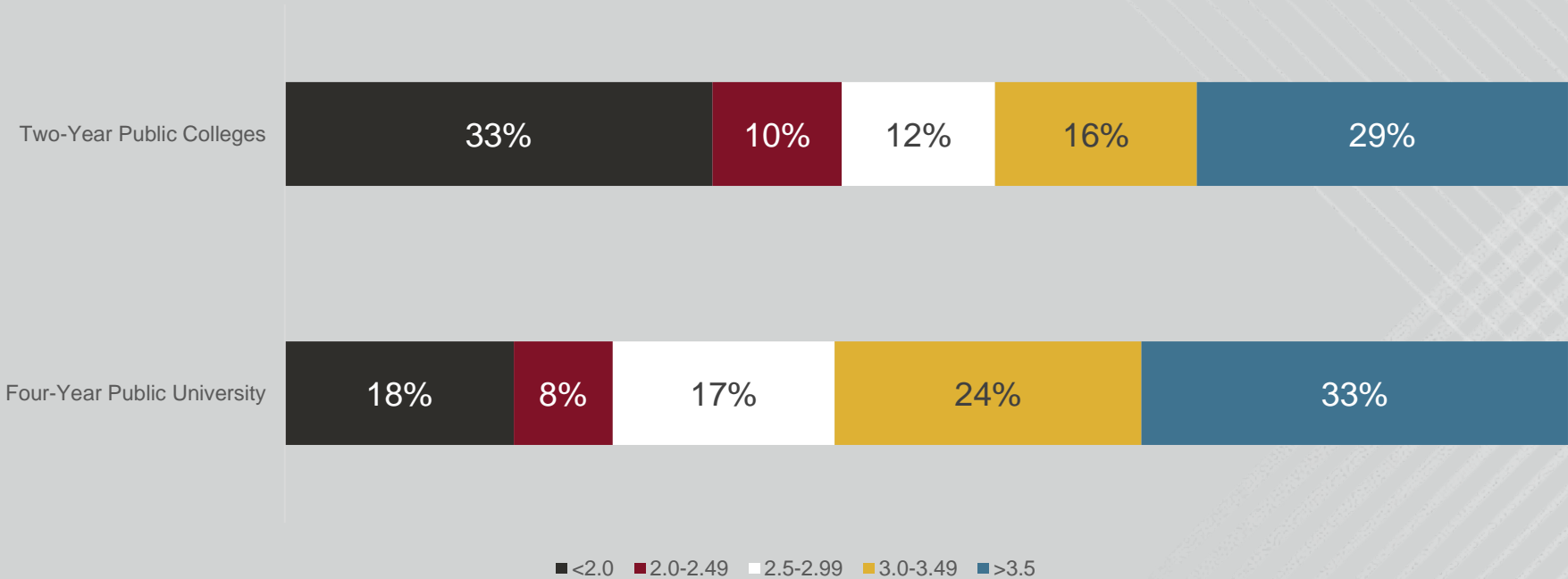
