- c. A realistic view of how motivated and diligent the student will be in completing academic work next year
- d. The extracunicular activities, jobs, and other time commitments outside of school

#### **IMPORTANT:**

- Choose classes that challenge yourself in areas of interest while also maintaining life balance!
- Athletes must be passing a minimum of 5 classes per quarter in order to be eligible to participate in athletics.
  - PE/Conditioning and/or AP Science Labs cannot count as one of the five classes.

#### **Early Release/Late Arrival**

- Plan for this period on your request sheet
- Pick-up the parent permission paperwork, which can be found with your middle school counselor
- Bring SIGNED parent permission paperwork to your scheduling meeting with your counselor

#### **Honors & AP Courses**

- An Honors/AP course provides the student with additional depth and rigor in the subject.
- Talk with your child's teacher about his/her recommendation
- Students can challenge themselves with an honors course if they have an interest and/or aptitude for the subject


