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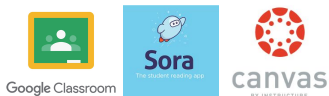

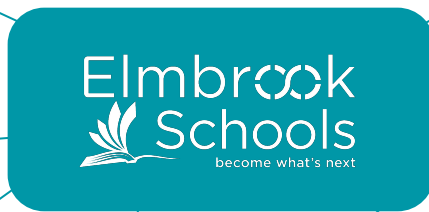



Information & Technology Literacy Standards

Students today are surrounded by technology and use it every day to learn, collaborate, share, and play. Digital Citizenship is about creating thoughtful, empathetic citizens who know what is right and wrong, exhibit intelligent technology behavior, and make good choices when online. This course is intended to empower our learners to recognize the rights, responsibilities and opportunities of living, learning and working in an interconnected digital world so that they can act and model in ways that are safe, legal and ethical.

Use the drop-down menus above to select a grade level. Digital Citizenship (DC) lessons are linked for each grade and are to be taught over the course of the school year.

Digital Safety - Student Physical Safety

- Speak Up Speak Out (SUSO) Anonymous Reporting - 24x7
 - Provided by the Wisconsin Department of Justice
 - Anonymous tips go directly to the building leadership team and/or police authorities for follow up
 - More information or to submit a tip (<https://speakup.widj.gov/>)
- Securly Aware - 24x7 On-Call Monitoring and Escalation
 - Securly Filter Activity, Google Docs and Gmail are monitored for content by Securly
 - Content that is flagged is assigned a score
 - Based on the score the response is escalated

Digital Safety - Federal Guidelines & Local Policies

- *Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)* - [District Policy 6177.1](#) which commits to blocking inappropriate content and monitoring online activity (Securly), as well as educating students about appropriate behavior (Digital Citizenship)
- *Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA)* - Gives parents control over what information is collected about their children by vendors, particularly those under age 13. The school district can consent for the parent, limited to educational context.
- *Family Educational Rights Protection Act (FERPA)* - [District Policy 5125](#) - Protects the privacy of student educational records and gives parents certain rights pertaining to those records.
- *Appropriate Use of Technology* - [District Policy 6177](#)
 - Outlines expectations of use and declares the use of technology as a privilege that can be taken away

- 232,900+ Print books in our libraries
- 41,700+ Digital books in our District collection
- 370,000+ Checkouts every year (print and digital)
- Seven Library renovations completed in the past eight years
- 4160 visits to Brookfield Elementary Library month-to-date (first 11 school days in January)!

- 81% of District Chromebook repairs in December were completed by high school student tech teams
