



Richland Two Board of Trustees voted on July 24 to put a bond referendum on the Nov. 6 ballot. The referendum asks for permission to borrow \$468,406,000.

BOND REFERENDUM QUESTION 1

CAN THE DISTRICT BORROW \$381,952,000 FOR:

- Safety and security improvements across the district such as more secure entrances, improvements to cameras and intercoms, new roofs and HVAC
- A permanent facility for Center for Knowledge North and an addition at Blythewood High to reduce the use of portables
- New buses and safety/security improvements for all buses
- New facilities for Bethel-Hanberry Elementary and Forest Lake Elementary, which are too old to renovate efficiently and effectively
- New facilities for E.L. Wright Middle and Center for Knowledge to provide more enclosed campus and replace older buildings (keeping three-story building, which will be improved and renovated)
- Technology upgrades across the district
- Improvements to academic spaces across the district to support premier teaching and learning

BOND REFERENDUM QUESTION 2

IF QUESTION 1 IS APPROVED BY VOTERS, CAN THE DISTRICT BORROW AN ADDITIONAL \$86,454,000 TO:

- Build a district fine/performing arts center
- Improve athletic facilities across the district including adding field houses to middle and high schools
- Upgrade Richland Northeast High and Ridge View High athletic facilities including expansions of football stadiums
