<p>Application Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - must be 17 - watch enrollment video - complete online enrollment form - staff will contact you to set up video or phone meeting - school sessions start every 6 weeks, called hexters <p>Description of Program: Students can earn either a traditional diploma or a competency diploma, depending on their situation. Most coursework is done remotely online using an online format, with some supervised tests in-person. School day is around 3 hours long, and students choose to attend either mornings, afternoons, or evenings only.</p>	<p>Application Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - must complete at least one semester at home high school - must complete application, interview and orientation - school starts and enrolls every quarter - website information here <p>Description of Program: Students start their first quarter by taking the Discovery curriculum to enhance social skills for success at school. Once Discovery is complete, students start in content-area classes. Attendance policy is strict, but school can provide more educational and emotional support for each student due to smaller school setting.</p>	<p>Application Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - must be 16 - behind on credit, or not being successful at current high school - reading English at 8th grade level - must register for an online information session here <p>Description of Program: All classes held at Front Range Community College at no cost to student (scholarship). Students go through a college prep semester in a cohort of high school students, then transition to the general college population, earning college credit while finishing their diploma with intense support structure. Students must have a high motivation to succeed in a college setting.</p>	<p>Application Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - must be 16 - qualify as low-income - have challenges in their life that create barriers to achieving diploma - website information here <p>Description of Program: Student will enroll in GED program with Adams County Workforce Center. There is no cost for any GED classes needed to prepare student for taking the GED, or for the test itself. Students can also receive support in career exploration, resume writing, and searching for employment. Vouchers may be available for transportation to office.</p>
