Meeting called to order at 4:34pm by Frances-Feliz Kearns. Ms. Kearns informed everyone attending the meeting that the meeting was being recorded and stated this meeting will be conducted in a hybrid format. The following agenda items were addressed:

I. II. General

a. Provide Progress Report on Equity Action Plan

Dr. Fedorowicz led a discussion of the Equity Action Plan for the 2023-2024 school year. She reviewed the current vision and strategic objectives of the Vision 2028 Strategic Plan, which is scheduled to be reviewed and approved by the Joint School Committee later this evening. Mr. Devoll discussed continuing REDI PD through the State along with Mr. West as they did last year. Dr. Fedorowicz continued that the administration continues to work with Teachers 21 in the third year of the program. She explained that MCAS Data Analysis is ongoing with results recently released. Learning Walks also continue with administration looking for evidence of sense of belonging and inclusion. Ms. Millette provided a brief overview of Project 351. Mr. Coellner reviewed OpenSciEd curriculum updates for 2023-2024 including expanding to grade five due to the successful approval of another grant by the elementary district school committees. Dr. Ashley confirmed that all schools are again working with students to identify two trusted staff members for this school year. Ms. Lincoln discussed improving upon Responsive Classroom lessons already implemented in the schools.

School Committee Feedback:

Ms. Kearns commended the administration for their continued work and being off to a great start. She is excited to hear the schools are continuing to work with OpenSciEd and expand to grade five.

b. Overview of Project 351

Guidance Director Lauren Millette introduced Rochester Memorial School sixth graders Delaney Vieira and Adrianne Chua, along with senior Jaymison Gunschel. Ms. Millette and the students discussed Project 351 happenings from the summer and the plans for this school year. Please see Appendix A.

School Committee Feedback:

Mr. Monteiro asked the students if they anticipate having different scenarios for each grade. Ms. Vieira said they do think they will have different videos for each grade and create a playbook for each grade. Ms. Kearns asked Mr. Gunschel what he is most excited about. He said he is excited to train the new trainers as he completes his senior year. He already saw how much impact there has been so far and he wants to continue the work.

Mr. Monteiro asked if ORR students will be training students elsewhere. Dr. Fedorowicz explained that this was discussed with Project 351 representatives earlier this month as ORR is a leader in the program and the representatives commended Ms. Millette, the students and the district for their outstanding efforts thus far.

Mr. Chisholm thanked the students for their involvement and said they should be very proud of themselves.

III. Public Comment


Project 351 and the Future
