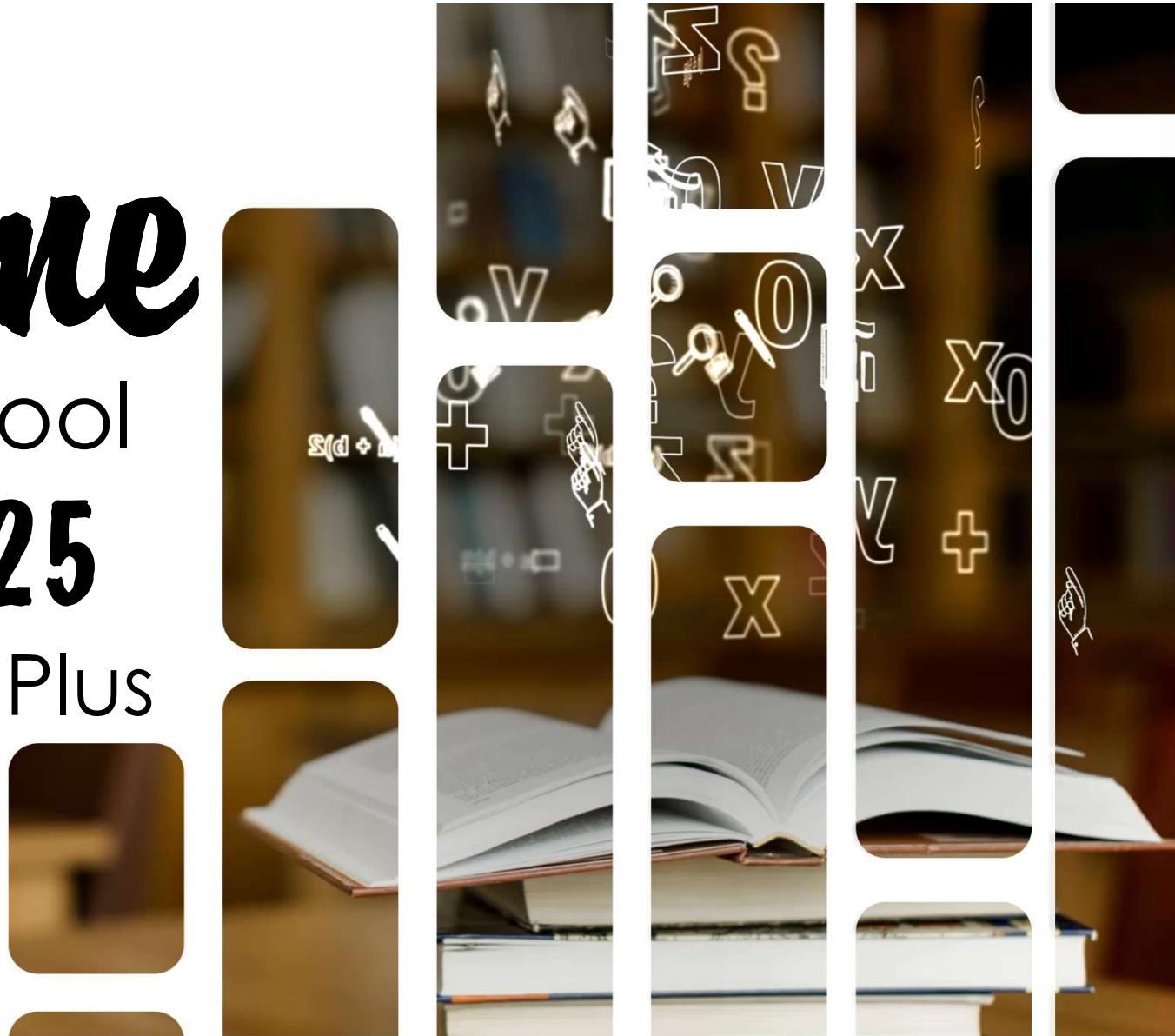

What Is College Credit Plus (CCP)?

It's an opportunity to earn College Credit before college.

- Grades 7-12
- College-ready students
- Many college course options
- Public colleges are free
- Private colleges may include small cost



College Credit Plus (CCP)

- **What's Covered**

- Cost of tuition, Textbooks, Materials and Fees.

- **What's Not Covered**

- Additional Fees (Art, Aviation, *etc.*) may need to be covered by the student.
 - Determined by participating Institute of Higher Education (IHE).



College Credit Plus (CCP)

- **Would a student ever have to pay for a course?**
 - Yes
 1. If a student **fails** a course.
 - Student is liable for the cost of the class and will be billed.
 - *Final high school transcript will be withheld until payment is made to the board office.*
 2. If a student **drops/withdraws** from a course after the “no fault drop date”.
 - Set by the IHE
 3. If a student takes a remedial course or a sectarian course.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

- **Underperforming Students**
 - If a student's CCP GPA drops below a 2.0
 - If a student drops 2 courses in the same semester for academic reasons
 - If deemed underperforming, student can only take 1 course the following semester and it can not be in the academic area of the failed course.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

How to Participate in CCP Program

- Apply and Get Admitted by a College.
 - Student may have to take a placement test and other criteria.
 - Entrance requirements are set by the IHE (Institute of Higher Education) not Troy High School.
 - Edison's Requirements:
 - 3.0 or better **Cumulative** GPA
 - A's and B's in subject area (English)
 - Some additional prerequisites may also exist.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

IHE's within a 30-mile radius of Troy High School

College/University	Distance from THS
Edison State C.C.	10 miles
Sinclair C.C.	22.3 miles
Wright State University	29.9 miles
University of Dayton (<i>private</i>)	23.7 miles



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Deadline for Students

- Notify THS by April 1st of your intent to participate in the CCP program.
- Submit paperwork and application to CCP institution.
- Meet requirements or pass required entrance exams of participating CCP college or university.
- **Be admitted to the institution.**



College Credit Plus (CCP)

How will CCP Classes affect my GPA?

Grade Point Average (GPA) and Class Rank

- CCP classes WILL be figured into a student's high school GPA and their class ranking.
- CCP CORE courses are weighted (A=5, B=4, C=3, D=1, F=0)

Course Value

- Any 3, 4, or 5 credit hour course will be awarded 1-high school credit.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

How many credit hours can I earn?

- Max of 30 hours/year
 - *Combination of High School and CCP*
- Program max of 120 hours
- Can take classes in summer but will not count for eligibility. (None after senior year)
Counts against total hours for year.
- No more than a total of 4 years
 - *4 for 9th; 3 for 10th; 2 for 11th; 1 for 12th.*



College Credit Plus (CCP)

What about support services?

- Responsibility of the IHE.
- IHE must assign an advisor to each CCP student and schedule student meeting prior to academic no-fault drop course date.

...and how about Transportation?

- No Transportation of any kind is provided to or from CCP classes.
- Student will have to pay for parking.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Curriculum

- Designed to provide high school students who are academically and socially capable of doing college work an additional educational option.
 - Program supplements Troy High School's College Preparatory Curriculum and is not meant to replace it.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Things to Consider

Academic

- Can your child handle doing a large portion of their work independently?
- Possible effect on GPA and Rank.

Social

- Your child will, for the most part, be in classes with older students.
- How does your child handle peer pressure?
- Some discussions may be on an adult level that might cause some discomfort.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Mature Content

As of Oct. 1, Ohio colleges, universities and secondary schools must provide information about mature subject matter in college courses to students applying to participate in College Credit Plus and their parents or guardians, as required by Ohio law.

"The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the college credit plus program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon college credit plus enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs."



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Other Considerations

Graduation Requirements

- **None can be waived and all work must be completed (official transcript from the IHE) prior to the THS graduation ceremony in order to participate in said ceremony.**

Final College/University Destination

- How will CCP classes impact my intended major?
- What classes will I be left taking my freshman year at my college/university?

Don't "telegraph" you won't take college work seriously by earning C's. – OSU admissions counselor 2008



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Scheduling Considerations

- Every attempt will be made to accommodate your child's schedule at THS.
- It may not be possible for your child to take certain classes at THS while participating in the CCP program.
- How to determine total possible CCP hours/year available
 1. Determine student's number of high school ONLY units
 2. Multiply that number by 3
 3. Subtract the result from 30
 4. That number is the total number of college credits that CCP student may earn that academic year

College Credit Plus (CCP)

Scheduling Considerations

How many classes do I have to take?

- Students must maintain a minimum of 6 Carnegie Units.
 - *Participating IHE's are not required to contact Troy High School if your child drops a class or is failing.*



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Scheduling Considerations

Athletic Eligibility

- Athletes are encouraged to take **6 Carnegie Unit** classes if at all possible.
- Most athletes are at the state minimum (5 full credit classes) for eligibility when taking CCP courses.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

Quick Review

College Credit Plus (CCP)

Please Note that AP offerings can not be counted in CCP because an exam score of 3,4,or 5 is required to earn college credit. (OH public universities)



Advanced College Project

Advanced College Project (ACP)

An Indiana University collaboration with high school students and their teachers

Advanced College Project

ACP Students:

- Must have a GPA of 2.70 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Ohio: Taking College Prep Curriculum.
- Should be considered likely to succeed in the course, or counseled against enrolling for credit.



Advanced College Project

ACP Credit

- Enrollment in ACP courses establishes a permanent record with IU that is documented on an official student transcript.
- ACP courses are IU credit courses that transfer to many colleges and universities if a grade of "C" or better is achieved.
- Transfer policies vary by institution. It becomes very important to check with other institution's a student might attend if the credit will transfer.



Advanced College Project

Dropping an ACP course

- To withdraw from an ACP course, the student must submit the Withdraw Form to the ACP office, verified by their high school counselor, by date outlined on the Withdraw Form
- If dropped by the outlined date the student will not be responsible for class fees
- After the outlined drop date, the student may still withdraw, however, they are responsible for any tuition and a grade of 'W' will be issued
